Glamrock

Sweater

MATERIALS

4 (4) 6 (6) skeins of Hobbii Fluffy Day, color (12) Pastel Pink 2 (2) 3 (3) skeins of Hobbii Peacock, color (07) Rose - for the edges

Circular needles 6 mm / US 10 - 40 cm / 16" and 60 cm / 24" 6 stitch markers Darning needle

YARN QUALITY

Fluffy Day, Hobbii 100% Acrylic 100 g (3.8 oz) = 285 m (312 yds)

Peacock, Hobbii 100% Polyester 100 g (3.5 oz) = 65 m (71 yds)

GAUGE

 $10 \times 10 \text{ cm} / 4'' \times 4'' = 14 \text{ sts} \times 20 \text{ rows with}$ two threads of Hobbii Fluffy Day

SIZE

XS/S (M/L) XL/2XL (3XL/4XL)

MEASUREMENTS

Chest width: approx. 95 (105) 115 (125) cm / 36.2 (41.3) 45.3 (49.2) inches
Full length: approx. 59 (61) 63 (67) cm / 23.2 (24) 24.8 (26.4) inches

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Glamrock Sweater was inspired by the 70's so you will be able to shine bright and light up the dark winter nights.

The Glamrock Sweater is worked from the top down with Hobbii Peacock and two threads of Hobbii Fluffy Day for the body and sleeves. The sweater is worked on needles 6.0 mm / US-10 throughout. For the sleeves, you may use Magic Loop.

The sweater has a raised neckline in the back achieved with German short rows.

The pattern is suitable for all knitters, beginners and more experienced.

ABBREVIATIONS

CO = cast on k = knit p = purl st(s) = stitch(es) rnd(s) = round(s) inc = increase(s) M = stitch marker sth = stitch holder tbl = through the back loop GSR = German Short Rows k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

INFO AND TIPS

The sweater is supposed to have a positive ease of 5 cm (approx. 2 inches), which means that you should choose the size that is 5 cm / 2 inches larger than your chest measurement. Measure your chest width and then determine which size fits you best. I recommend that you always do a gauge swatch first to see how your gauge corresponds with the one specified here in the pattern.

I recommend that you read through the entire pattern first before you start working the sweater to get a general overview of the pattern.

German Short Rows

You work up until the place where you have to turn. Turn the work and slip 1 st purlwise with the yarn in front (towards yourself). Bring the yarn over the right needle and down behind your work (away from yourself) and pull the yarn tight to create a "double stitch" - a st consisting of "two legs". Continue working. On the following row the double st is knitted or purled as one st according to the pattern.

Knitting through the back loop means inserting the tip of the right-hand needle from front to back into the back loop instead of the front loop as with a regular knit stitch.



NECKLINE/YOKE/BODY

Faux fur edge along the neckline

With circular needles 6 mm / US 10 - 40 cm / 16", CO (44) 52 (56) 64 sts with one thread of Peacock.

Join to work in the round but be careful not to twist the work. Place a M so you know where the work begins and ends. The M marks the beginning of the work as well as the middle of the back of it.

Now work a 6 cm (2.4 in) faux fur neckline.

When the neckline measures 6 cm (2.4 in) change to 2 threads of Fluffy Day and on the first rnd increase (4) 2 (4) 2 sts. You now have 48 (54) 60 (66) sts for your chosen size.

Now the yoke is worked in stockinette stitch with a line of Peacock faux fur down the middle of the front of the work. When you have worked the 24 (28) 32 (36) sts of the front panel make an extra st by lifting the loop between the sts and knit it tbl. This new st is worked with Peacock throughout the rest of the work. It is easiest to ball up a smaller amount of the yarn than to manage the whole ball. Make sure you work this st tightly and "lock" it in place to avoid any visible holes in the work.

YOKE

If you want a higher neckline in the back of your sweater, now is the time to work it in the following way:

Mark the 4 back sts in the back of the neck (two on each side) with two M and work GSR. Knit to the left M, turn, make a GSR and purl 4 sts back. Turn, make a GSR and knit back. Continue and increase with 3 sts on both sides of M each time you turn, a total of 3 (3) 3 (3) times. End by knitting a full rnd of stockinette stitch and stop at the beginning of the rnd, which is in the middle of the back of the work

Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch.

Now work the 1st increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k4, inc, k2, inc*, repeat from * to * until there are 5 sts left on the rnd, k4, inc, k1

You now have 64 (72) 80 (88) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.

Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch.

Now work the 2nd increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k6, inc, k2, inc *, repeat from * to * until there are 7 sts left on the rnd, k6, inc, k1

You now have 80 (90) 100 (110) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.

Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch.

Now work the 3rd increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k8, inc, k2, inc *, repeat from * to * until there are 9 sts left on the rnd, k8, inc, k1

You now have 96 (108) 120 (132) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.

Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch.

Now work the 4th increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k10, inc, k2, inc *, repeat from * to * until there are 11 sts left on the rnd, k10, inc, k1

You now have 112 (126) 140 (154) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.



Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch.

Now work the 5th increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k12, inc, k2, inc *, repeat from * to * until there are 13 sts left on the rnd, k12, inc, k1

You now have 128 (144) 160 (176) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.

Here it is also a good idea to change to circular needles $60 \text{ cm} / 24^{\prime\prime}$, 6 mm / US 10. Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch.

Now work the 6th increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k14, inc, k2, inc *, repeat from * to * until there are 15 sts left on the rnd, k14, inc, k1

You now have 144 (162) 180 (198) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.

Work 4 (4) 4 (5) rnds of stockinette stitch..

Now work the 7th increase as follows: k1, inc (M1L by lifting the loop between two sts and knitting it tbl), *k16, inc, k2, inc *, repeat from * to * until there are 17 sts left on the rnd, k16, inc, k1

You now have 160 (180) 200 (220) sts on the rnd for your chosen size.

Divide for body and sleeves

Work a rnd of stockinette stitch and divide the work for body and sleeves in the following way:

Work 24 (28) 32 (36) sts for the left part of the back panel, CO 10 new sts, place 32 (34) 36 (38) sts on a sth for the left sleeve, work 48 (56) 64 (72) sts for the front panel, place 32 (34) 36 (38) sts on a sth for the right sleeve, CO 10 new sts, work 24 (28) 32 (36) for the other half of the back panel.

You now have 116 (132) 148 (164) sts for the body and 32 (34) 36 (38) sts for each sleeve.

BODY

Place a M in either side of the work in the 6th new stitch you have just cast on under the sleeves, which are going to be the side seams in either side of the work.

Now you finish working the body in stockinette stitch and still with a line of Peacock faux fur down the front of the work. When the work measures 30 (32) 34 (34) cm / 11.8 (12.6) 13.4 (13.4) inches measured from under the sleeve and down, you start using the Peacock yarn again and you finish off with a 6 cm (2.4 in) faux fur edge.

Cast off the stitches evenly and not too tightly.

SLEEVES

Now place the sts for one sleeve onto circular needles 6 mm / US 10 - 40 cm / 16" or use Magic Loop and knit up 10 (10) 10 (10) sts nicely, so you have a total of 42 (44) 46 (48) sts for the sleeve. Place a M in the 6th (6th) 6th (6th) st of the stitches you have just knit up. This is the beginning and end of the rnd.

Work around in stockinette stitch until the sleeve measures: 30 (32) 34 (36) cm / 11.8 (12.6) 13.4 (14.2) in. Then you decrease 21 (22) 23 (24) sts for your chosen size, i.e. you k2tog until the end of the rnd, so there are 21 (22) 23 (24) sts left for your chosen size to work the Peacock faux fur cuff.

Work a 12 cm (4.7 in) cuff in stockinette stitch for all sizes. The sleeve should measure, from the armhole and down, 42 (44) 46 (48) cm / 16.5 (17.3) 18.1 (18.9) in or the desired length. Measure the sleeve along the way, so you end up with the length that fits you the best. Cast



off the stitches evenly and not too tightly. Work the other sleeve in the same way.

ASSEMBLY AND WASHING

Weave in all ends discreetly.

Wash your sweater in a good quality, wool detergent at max. 30°C (86° F or cold water) on the washing machine's wool cycle and the spin cycle at a maximum of 400 rpm.

Stretch the sweater into shape on a towel and, if necessary, steam it with a damp tea towel when it is dry, so that the sweater turns out smooth and nice.
