# Dreamcatcher

### **Neck warmer**

Design: Faunaknit | Hobbii Design



#### MATERIALS

**Friends Wool** 1 skein of Boysenberry (57) 2 skeins of Shamrock (104) 2 skeins of Chocolate (12) 5 skeins of Rose (44)

Circular needles 4 mm, 60 cm Circular needles 4 mm, 40 cm Stitch markers Cable needle Stitch holder

#### YARN QUALITY

Friends Wool, Hobbii
 100% Wool
 50 g = 100 m

#### GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" = 22 sts x 22 r

#### ABBREVIATIONS

st = stitch p = purl k = knit rnd = round incl. = included

#### SIZE

One size

#### MEASUREMENTS

Width: 36 cm / 14 inches Length: approx. 39.5 cm / 15.5 inches

#### **PATTERN INFORMATION**

A great neck warmer with pattern knitted with Friends Wool for the colder days. The front is double layered, knitted on circular needles. The back is single layered, knitted back and forth. For the experienced knitter.

## Pattern



#### **FRONT PIECE**

Cast on 144 sts in colour 44 on circular needles 4 mm, 60 cm. Place a marker on each side at the start/end of the rnd and at the 72nd st.

Knit approx. 9 cm / 3.5 inches in stockinette stitch. Work 1 rnd alternating between the colours 57 and 44, 1 st of each colour until the end of the rnd.

Work the repeat from column.

After the repeat, finish with 1 rnd alternating between the colours 44 and 12, 1 st of each colour until the end of the rnd. Then work 3 cm / 1.2 inches in stockinette stitch with colour 44.

Place a marker in the middle st/the 36th st on the right side. This will be the front of the neck.

Turn the work inside out and fasten the threads.

Then knit the double front piece together so that there are 72 sts left on the needle: do this by folding the work in half and knit 1 st from each side together to 1 st using a cable needle. Now the patterned front is double, while the shoulders are knitted with single sts.

The shoulders are knitted back and forth in stockinette stitch, while 15 sts are cast off or moved to a stitch holder, for the neck opening on each side of the middle stitch/the 36th st. Each shoulder consists of 21 sts.

Work each shoulder for approx. 6 cm / 2.4 inches or your desired length.

#### **BACK PIECE**

With colour 44: Knit the shoulders together by casting on 30 sts between the shoulder sts. This will be the backside of the neck and is worked in stockinette stitch for approx. 36,5 cm / 14.4 inches corresponding to the length of the front piece.

Work edge k1/p1 for 3-4 cm / approx. 1.2-1.6 inches



Bind off using the Italian bind-off-method or your preferred method.

#### EDGING

With colour 44: Lay the front flat and pick up/knit together the inner loops on the st that now lie opposite each other, closing the bottom of the front:

Pick up 72 sts on the short side of the front and work moss stitch (k1/p1) and opposite on the next rnd.

Continue this until the edging measures approx. 3-4 cm.

Bind off using the Italian bind-off-method/ your preferred bind-off-method and fasten the threads.

Then pick up sts along the entire long side (incl. the outer edge on the edge of the short side) and knit until the edge measures approx. 3-4 cm.

Bind off using the Italian bind-off-method/ your preferred bind-off-method. Repeat on the opposite side.

#### NECK

With colour 44: Pick up 88 sts on needles 4 - 40 cm around the edge on the inside of the neckline. For a long neck, work k2/p2 for approx. 18 cm / approx. 7.1 inches or desired length. Bind off using the Italian bind-off-method or your preferred bind-off-method.

For a short neck, work k2/p2 for approx. 10 cm / approx. 3.9 inches or desired length, bind off, fold down and sew/knit to the wrong side.
