MATERIALS

Friends Cotton 8/4 - 1 skein of:

col. 50 (Col A)

col. 63 (Col B)

col. 62 (Col C)

Blue/green version is made in Col. 01, 76 & 100

Crochet hook 3.5 mm (E/4) Stitch Markers Tape Measure Embroidery needle Scissors

YARN QUALITY

Friends Cotton 8/4, Hobbii 100% Cotton 50 g / 1.75 oz. = 160 m / 175 yds.

GAUGE

Square measuring 7.5 cm / 3" diagonally

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain

st(s) = stitch(es)

slst = slip stitch

sc = single crochet

hdc = half double crochet

dc = double crochet

tr = treble crochet

fp = front post

blo = back loop only

... = repeat between

{...} = end stitch count

RS/WS = right/wrong side

sk = skip

SIZE

One size

Width: 23 cm / 9"

Pattern







SQUARE - MAKE 3:

Round 1 (col. A): Magic ring, 8 sc into the ring, tighten ring, slst to first sc, do not fasten off, {8 sc}







Round 2 (col. A):

Note: Feel free to ch 2 inbetween sc sts instead of 1 if you tend to crochet chs tight Ch 1 (does not count), sc back into same st, ch 1, *sc 1 in next st, ch 1* repeat between ** 7 times, slst to first sc. Fasten off. {8 sc, 8 ch 1}



Round 3 (col. B): Start with a standing fpsc around any sc, *in the ch 1 sp (dc 1, tr 1, dc 1), fpsc around the next sc* repeat between ** 8 times, omit the last fpsc, slst to first sc. Fasten off with a needle join. {8 fpsc, 16 dc, 8 tr}









Round 4 (col. C): Looking at the wrong side, start with a standing sc in any sc made in rnd 2 in which the fpsc was made around in rnd 3, *ch 2, sc in next sc made in round 2 in which the fpsc was made around in rnd 3* repeat between ** 8 times, omit last sc, slst to first sc, do not fasten off, {8 sc, 8 ch2}







Round 5 (col. C):

Note - Place st marker through two loops of each corner ch Ch 1 (does not count), hdc back into the same st, *sc 3 in ch 2 sp, hdc in next st, in next ch 2 sp (dc 2, ch 1, dc 2), hdc in next st* repeat between ** 4 times, omit last hdc, slst to first hdc. Fasten off with a needle join. {12 sc, 16 dc, 8 hdc, 4 ch1}







TRIANGLE: MAKE 3

Set-up Row (col. A): With a 10 inch tail, ch cord 13. Fasten off. {13 chs}



Row 1 (col. A) [RS]: Attach yarn in 5th ch from the right of the chord, sk a ch (6th ch), sc 5 in the next ch (7th ch), sk a ch (8th ch), slst into the next 2 chs (9th & 10th ch), turn, {5 sc}









Row 2 (col. A) [WS]:

Note: Feel free to ch 2 inbetween sc sts instead of 1 if you tend to crochet chs tight Sk the 2 slst's, sc in next st, *ch 1, sc in next st* repeat between ** 4 times , slst to next ch (4th ch). Fasten off. {5 sc, 4 ch}





Row 3 (col. B) [RS]: Attach yarn in 3rd ch of the chord, *fpsc around next st, in the ch 1 sp (dc 1, tr 1, dc 1)* repeat between ** 4 times, fpsc around last st, slst into next ch (11th ch) of the chord, ch 1, turn, {5 fpsc, 8 dc, 4 tr}







Row 4 (col. B) [WS]: sc in top of sc made in row 2 in which the fpsc was made around in row 3, *ch 2, sc in next sc made in row 2 in which the fpsc was made around in row 3* repeat between ** 4 times. Fasten off. {5 sc, 4 ch2}



Row 5 (col. C) [RS]:

Note - Place st marker through two loops of corner ch

Attach yarn in 1st ch of the chord, dc 2 in the first sc, in the ch 2 sp (hdc 1, sc 2), sc in the next st, in the ch 2 sp (hdc 1, dc 1), in the next st (dc 1, ch 1, dc 1), in the ch 2 sp (dc 1, hdc 1),



sc in the next st, in the ch 2 sp (sc 2, hdc 1), dc 2 in the last st, slst to top of last ch (13th ch) from the chord. Fasten off. {8 dc, 6 sc, 4 hdc, 1 ch}







JOINING THE SQUARES AND TRIANGLES

First join the first square to the first triangle



Step 1: Working with the right sides facing and using **col. A**, insert hook from front to back through the blo of the marked corner st on the 1st piece, making sure your working yarn is at the back of the work, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st on the 2nd piece, yarn over, slst,







Step 2: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, working back on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, yarn over, pull through all loops on the hook,





Repeat step 2 until you have worked your last sts on both the pieces, you should be connecting 10 sts from each side,





Step 3: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st, working on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the end of the ch chord, yarn over, slst. Fasten off.





Now join the next two squares and triangle



Step 1: Working with the right sides facing and using **col. A**, insert hook from front to back through the blo of the marked corner st on the 1st piece, making sure your working yarn is at the back of the work, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st on the 2nd piece, yarn over, slst,

Step 2: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, working back on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, yarn over, pull through all loops on the hook,

Repeat step 2 until you have worked your last sts on both the pieces, you should be connecting 11 sts from each side including the last marked sts,





Now grab the next square and triangle,

Step 1: Insert hook from front to back through the blo of the marked corner st on the 1st piece, making sure your working yarn is at the back of the work, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st on the 2nd piece, yarn over, slst,

Step 2: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, working back on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, yarn over, pull through all loops on the hook,

Repeat step 2 until you have worked your last sts on both the pieces, you should be connecting 10 sts from each side,

Step 3: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st, working on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the end of the ch chord, yarn over, slst. Fasten off.



Now join the remaining triangle



Step 1: Working with the right sides facing and using **col. A**, insert hook from front to back through the blo of the marked corner st on the 1st piece, making sure your working yarn is at the back of the work, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st on the 2nd piece, yarn over, slst,

Step 2: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, working back on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, yarn over, pull through all loops on the hook,

Repeat step 2 until you have worked your last sts on both the pieces, you should be connecting 10 sts from each side,



Step 3: Now working on the triangles only, insert your hook from front to back through the end st of the ch chord, working on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the end of the ch chord, yarn over, slst. Fasten off.





Join the remaining two squares



Step 1: Working with the right sides facing and using **col. A**, insert hook from front to back through the blo of the marked corner st on the 1st piece, making sure your working yarn is at the back of the work, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the marked st on the 2nd piece, yarn over, slst,

Step 2: Working back on the 1st piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, working back on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the blo of the next st, yarn over, pull through all loops on the hook,

Repeat step 2 until you have worked your last sts on both the pieces, you should be connecting 10 sts from each side including the last marked sts, **ch 1**



Step 3: Now working over the top of the join and onto the next triangle and square, Repeat step 2 until you have worked your last sts on both the pieces, you should be connecting 9 sts from each side,


Step 4: Now working on the triangles only, insert your hook from front to back through the end st of the ch chord, working on the 2nd piece, insert your hook from front to back through the end of the ch chord, yarn over, slst. Fasten off.






BORDER

Attach col. A with a standing sc to the ch that is furthest to the right of the triangle, sc in the next 38 chs, sc 2 back into the same st, *slst blo into the next 9 sts, slst into the side join,* repeat between ** 2 times, slst blo into the next 19 sts, *slst into the side join, slst blo into the next 9 sts* repeat between ** 2 times, 2 sc back into the same st the standing sc was worked into, join with a slst, do not fasten off, proceed to collar.



COLLAR

Row 1: Ch 2 (counts as dc), dc in the next 38 sts, turn Repeat row 1 until you reach a length that comfortably fits around the dog's collar, do not fasten off,



CLOSING THE COLLAR

Fold the collar down on the wrong side of the work. You will now be working into the sc sts from the border in which the dc's were worked into, (see black dots for reference,



Step 1: Pull the loop left from the collar through the first st,





Step 2: Insert your hook front to back through the next sc st and into the 2nd st of the last row worked of the collar, yarn over, slst,





Step 3: Insert your hook front to back through the next sc st and into the next st of the last row worked of the collar, yarn over, slst,





Repeat step 3 until you have worked all the way across, fasten off and weave in ends.
