## MATERIALS

2 (2) 2 skeins of Friends Wool color 10

Circular needle 4.5 mm, 50 cm /US 7, 20" Stitch markers Cable needle Darning needle

# YARN QUALITY

Friends Wool, Hobbii
 100% Wool
 50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

## GAUGE

21 sts x 29 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in Stocking Stitch with 4.5mm (US 7) needles.

### SIZE

S (**M**) L

## **MEASUREMENTS**

To Fit Head (circumference): S – 47-52cm (18.5-20.5") **M** – 52–57cm (20.5-22.5") L – 57-62cm (22.5-24.5")

Finished Length (unfolded brim): S – 19cm (7.5") **M**/L – 23cm (9")

The yarn used and long tail cast on method provide a stretchy beanie with a large amount of negative ease. This means that the finished beanie will look small but stretch nicely over the head.

## **PATTERN INFORMATION**

Welcome to the Torbay Beanie. This beanie is a cable beanie suited to beginner cablers. The pattern is a 12 row repeat and only requires cable stitches to be made on one of these rows. The rest of the pattern consists of knits and purls. My friend helped me name this beanie as she thought it reminded her of the asparagus that grow in the small town of Torbay, located in the Great Southern region of Western Australia.

This beanie is knit in the round and utilises 2 cable stitches to achieve the unique pattern. The length of this beanie can be adjusted based on the number of pattern repeats knitted.

### **ABBREVIATIONS**

CO = Cast On Dec = Decrease K = Knit K2TOG = Knit next 2 stitches together P = Purl P2TOG = Purl next 2 stitches together Rem = Remaining St(s) = Stitch(es) T4B = Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and hold at **back** of work, **knit** next 2 sts from left-hand needle, then **purl** sts from cable needle. T4F = Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and hold at **front** of work, **purl** next 2 sts from left-hand needle, then **knit** sts from cable needle.

### **INFO AND TIPS**

- Before starting your beanie, it is crucial to do a tension square. The gauge should measure 21 sts x 29 rows for a 10x10cm (4x4") square. If you have MORE stitches in your 10x10cm gauge, increase the size of your needle to loosen your tension. If you have LESS stitches in your 10x10cm gauge, reduce the size of your needle to tighten your tension.
- To add more length, complete the instructions for and then add further pattern repeats until desired length. Each additional pattern repeat is approximately 4cm (1.5") if tension is correct. The crown of the beanie is roughly 5cm (2"), so this needs to be accounted for in the final length.



## **BEANIE PATTERN**

#### RIB

Using 4.5mm (US 7) circular needles cast on 90, **100**, 110 sts in the round, using the long tail cast on method.

Join, place marker at beginning of the round, and begin to work circularly.

**Round 1:** \*K1, P1\* repeat between \* to stitch marker.

Repeat a total of 18 rounds to form the brim of the beanie. The suggested height of the brim is 5cm (2"). Knit more or less rounds if you desire a different height brim.

### BODY

**Note:** *Repeat each round between the* \* *to the stitch marker at the beginning of the round.* 

Round 1-7: \*K2, P2, K4, P2\* Round 8: \*K2, T4B, T4F\* Round 9: \*K all\* Round 10-12: \*K2, P1, K6, P1\*

Repeat the above 12 rounds until there are: 24, **36**, 36 rounds in total from the end of the rib.

The height of your beanie (with unfolded brim) will measure roughly 19cm (7.5") for the Small and 23cm (9") for the Medium and Large. Refer to the "INFO and TIPS" section on how to adapt your beanie to suit your desired finished height.

### CROWN

**Note:** This section requires decreasing, and you may need to change to double pointed needles if your work is too small for circular needles. Repeat each round between the \* to the stitch marker at the beginning of the round.

Round 1 (dec): \*K2, P2TOG, K5, P1\* (81, 90, 99 sts remaining) Round 2: \*K2, P1, K5, P1\* Round 3 (dec): \*K2, P1, K4, P2TOG\* (72, 80, 88 sts rem) Round 4: \*K2, P1, K4, P1\* Round 5 (dec): \*K2TOG, P1, K4, P1\* (63, 70, 77 sts rem) Round 6: \*K1, P1, K4, P1\* Round 7 (dec): \*K1, P1, K2, K2TOG, P1\* (54, 60, 66 sts rem) Round 8: \*K1, P1, K3, P1\* Round 9 (dec): \*K1, P1, K2TOG, K1, P1\* (45, 50, 55 sts rem) Round 10: \*K1, P1, K2, P1\* Round 11 (dec): \*K1, P1, K2TOG, P1\* (36, 40, 44 sts rem) Round 12: \*K1, P1\* Round 13 (dec): \*K1, K2TOG, P1\* (20, 30, 33 sts rem) Round 14: \*K2, P1\* Round 15 (dec): \*K2TOG, P1\* (18, 20, 22 sts rem)



## FINISH

Cut yarn, leaving 10cm / 4" tail. Draw through remaining stitches, fasten, and weave in ends.
