MATERIALS

2 (2) 2 skeins of Friends Wool color 119

Circular needle 4.5 mm, 50 cm /US 7, 20" Circular needle 5 mm, 50 cm /US 8, 20" Stitch markers Cable needle Darning needle

YARN QUALITY

Friends Wool, Hobbii

100% Wool 50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE

20 sts x 27.5 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in Stocking Stitch with 5mm (US 8) needles.

SIZE

S (**M**) L

MEASUREMENTS

To Fit Head (circumference): S – 45-50cm (17.5-19.5") **M** – 50–56cm (19.5-22") L – 56-62cm (22-24.5")

Finished Length: S – 21cm (8") **M**/L – 25cm (10")

The yarn used and long tail cast on method provide a stretchy beanie with a large amount of negative ease. This means that the finished beanie will look small but stretch nicely over the head.

PATTERN INFORMATION

Welcome to the Manypeaks Beanie. This staghorn cabled beanie is a six-row pattern repeat that is a beginner friendly cable pattern. Manypeaks is a small town located close to where I live in the Great Southern region of Western Australia. The cables in this design create multiple peaks so I thought it would be fitting to name it the Manypeaks Beanie.

The pattern uses only two different cables that are repeated every subsequent row to give the staghorn effect. When knitting cables, it is important to maintain a relaxed and consistent tension. A tight tension will result in a beanie that is uncomfortable to wear. The height of this beanie can be easily adjusted by increasing or decreasing the number of repeats.

ABBREVIATIONS

CO = Cast On Dec = Decrease K = Knit K2TOG = Knit next 2 stitches together Rem = Remaining St(s) = Stitch(es) C2B = Slip next st onto cable needle and hold at **back** of work, **knit** next st from left-hand needle, then **knit** st from cable needle.

C2F = Slip next st onto cable needle and hold at **front** of work, **knit** next st from left-hand needle, then **knit** st from cable needle.

C4B = Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and hold at **back** of work, **knit** next 2 sts from left-hand needle, then **knit** 2 sts from cable needle.

C4F = Slip next 2 sts onto cable needle and hold at **front** of work, **knit** next 2 sts from left-hand needle, then **knit** 2 sts from cable needle.

INFO AND TIPS

- Before starting your beanie, it is crucial to do a tension square. The gauge should measure 20 sts x 27.5 rows for a 10x10cm (4x4") square. If you have MORE stitches in your 10x10cm gauge, increase the size of your needle to loosen your tension. If you have LESS stitches in your 10x10cm gauge, reduce the size of your needle to tighten your tension.
- To add more length, complete the instructions for and then add further pattern repeats until desired length. Each additional pattern repeat is approximately 2.5cm (1") if tension is correct. The crown of the beanie is roughly 5cm (2"), so this needs to be accounted for in the final length.



BEANIE PATTERN

RIB

Using 4.5mm (US 7) circular needles cast on 80, **96,** 112 sts in the round, using the long tail cast on method.

Join, place marker at beginning of the round, and begin to work circularly.

Round 1: *K1, P1* repeat between * to stitch marker.

Repeat a total of 18 rounds to form the brim of the beanie. The suggested height of the brim is 5cm (2"). Knit more or less rounds if you desire a different height brim.

BODY

Note: *Repeat each round between the* * *to the stitch marker at the beginning of the round.*

Change to 5mm (US 8) circular needles.

Round 1: *K4, C4B, C4F, K4* Round 2: *K all* Round 3: *K2, C4B, K4, C4F, K2* Round 4: *K all* Round 5: *C4B, K8, C4F* Round 6: *K all*

Repeat the above 6 rounds 6, **7**, 7 times in total or until there are 36, **42**, 42 rounds in total from the end of the rib.

The height of your beanie (with unfolded brim) will measure roughly 21cm (8") for S and 25cm (10") for **M**/L. Refer to the "INFO and TIPS" section on how to adapt your beanie to suit your desired finished height.

CROWN

Note: This section requires decreasing, and you may need to change to double pointed needles if your work is too small for circular needles. Repeat each round between the * to the stitch marker at the beginning of the round.

Round 1: *K4, C4B, C4F, K4* Round 2 (dec): *K6, K2TOG, K2TOG, K6* (70, 84, 98 sts remaining) Round 3: *K2, C4B, K2, C4F, K2* Round 4 (dec): *K4, K2TOG, K2, K2TOG, K4* (60, 72, 84 sts rem) Round 5: *C4B, K4, C4F* Round 6 (dec): *K2, K2TOG, K4, K2TOG, K2* (50, 60, 70 sts rem) Round 7: *K3, C2B, C2F, K3* Round 8 (dec): *K2TOG, K6, K2TOG* (40, 48, 56 sts rem) Round 9: *K1, C2B, K2, C2F, K1* Round 10 (dec): *K2, K2TOG, K2TOG, K2 * (30, 36, 42 sts rem) Round 11: *C2B, K2, C2F*



Round 12 (dec): *K1, K2TOG, K2TOG, K1* (20, 24, 28 sts rem) Round 13: *K all* Round 14 (dec): *K2TOG* (10, 12, 14 sts rem)

FINISH

Cut yarn, leaving 10cm / 4" tail. Draw through remaining stitches, fasten, and weave in ends.
