1 skein of Friends Kid Silk col. 89

1 skein of Friends Kid Silk col. 13

1 skein of Friends Kid Silk col. 12

2 skeins of Friends Kid Silk col. 02

1 (1) 2 (2) skeins of Friends Kid Silk col.122

1 (1) 2 (2) skeins of Friends Kid Silk col.10

1 (1) 2 (2) skeins of Friends Kid Silk col.7

3 (3) 3 (4) cakes of Friends Wheel col. 02

Crochet hook 4 mm (US G/6)

Stitch markers Yarn needle Scissors

# **YARN QUALITY**

**Kid Silk**, Hobbii 72% Mohair, 25% Silk, 3% Wool 25 g = 200 m

Friends Wheel, Hobbii 55 % Cotton, 45% Acrylic 100 g = 400 m

# **GAUGE**

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 17 sts x 14 rows

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

ch = chain ch sp = chain space sc = single crochet esc = extended single crochet esc blo = extended single crochet in the back loop only slst = slip stitch dec = decrease

The Finisterre Winter sweater is crocheted in top-down technique starting from the neck ribbing. Then, some ribbing is added in the sleeves and waist.

# **INFO AND TIPS**

The Finisterre Winter sweater is worked top-down from the neck ribbing. First, the neck ribbing is crocheted and the yoke is worked in the round from it. Once the yoke is finished, the sleeves are separated and the body is worked in rounds until the desired length is reached. The sleeves are crocheted afterwards starting where the yoke finished. Finally, some ribbing is added in the waist and sleeves. Since the construction of the sweater is top-down, it is made in one piece and it is a seamless garment. You will only use your yarn needle to join the last row in each ribbing to the first one.

The whole sweater is worked with two strands of yarn held together: one strand of Friends Wheel and one strand of Friends Kid Silk. Seven color combinations are used in the sweater. Each color combination is achieved by working with one strand of Friends Wheel and one strand of Friends Kid Silk held together. These are the combinations:

Color A: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 02 Color B: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 07 Color C: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 122 Color D: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 89 Color E: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 10 Color F: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 13 Color G: Friends Wheel 02, Friends Kid Silk 12

Finisterre Winter is mostly crocheted using extended single crochet in the back loop only. The ribbing in the neck, waist and sleeves is worked using mainly half double crochet slip stitch in the back loop.

Instructions to make the stitches:

• Extended single crochet (esc): insert the hook in the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through one loop on the hook. Yarn over and pull through the last two loops on the hook.



- o If the pattern says **esc blo**, it means that this stitch has to be done inserting the hook only in the **back** loop.
- o If the pattern says **dec esc blo**, it means that you have to make 1 decrease. That is to work 1 esc in 2 sts. Insert the hook in the back loop of the first st and then, insert it in the back loop of the next st. Then, work the esc as usual.
- Half double crochet slip stitch (hdc slst): yarn over, insert the hook in the stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop and directly pull through two loops on the hook.
  - o If the pattern says hdc **slst blo**, it means that this stitch has to be done inserting the hook only in the **back** loop.

# Gauge

The gauge is 10 cm x 10 cm  $(4'' \times 4'') = 17$  sts x 14 rows.



To test your gauge, crochet a swatch of 22 stitches x 18 rows.

Ch 23

Row 1: 1 esc in the second ch from the hook, 21 esc. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 2: 21 esc, 1 esc blo. Ch 1 and turn.


Repeat row 2 until row 18.

Measure a 10 cm / 4" square in the centre of the swatch. You should have 17 sts x 14 rows.

Note: the texture of your swatch is not the same as the texture you will get in your sweater. The texture created by "esc blo" is different when working back and forth (as in the swatch) from when working in the round (as you will do in the sweater). Despite the difference in its look, the measurements are the same, so it allows us to check the gauge.

# **NECK RIBBING**



Crochet back and forth. Start crocheting with color A.

Ch 17

Row 1: 1 hdc slst in the second ch from the hook, 15 hdc slst. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 2: 15 hdc slst blo, 1 hdc slst. Ch 1 and turn

Repeat row 2 until row 84 (84) 92 (92).

Fold the ribbing in half, leaving the open side upwards. Now you will join these two sides of the ribbing by crocheting one row of sc along its length.

Insert your hook in the first row in the ribbing side that is closer to you. Then, insert the hook in the first row of the side behind. Do 1 sc. Continue sc along the length of the ribbing, inserting the hook in both sides to close them. Do 1 sc per row. At the end, you should have 84 (84) 92 (92) sc. Slst to the first sc to join the ribbing and get a circle. Fasten off.

Before you move on to the yoke, use a yarn needle to the end of the ribbing to the start and close the neck.

# YOKE

Crochet in the round. When starting a round, you will ch 2. These ch 2 counts as the first esc.

From this point, you will change colors every four rows, following the next sequence of colors. When you get to the end, you start with the first color again. This sequence is valid for the whole sweater. This means when you reach the end of the yoke, you will continue in the body and sleeves with the next color in the chart.

Change to color B.



Round 1: ch 2 (counts as an esc). 25 (25) 27 (27) esc blo, (1 esc, ch 2, 1 esc) in next st, 15 (15) 17 (17) esc blo, (1 esc, ch 2, 1 esc) in next st, 25 (25) 27 (27) esc blo, (1 esc, ch 2, 1 esc) in next st, 15 (15) 17 (17) esc blo, (1 esc, ch 1) in the last st in the round. Slst to join the round.

*Place 4 st markers: 1 in each ch sp.* These corners separate the front and back to the sleeves. From now on, you will be increasing two stitches in each corner as follows:

Round 2: ch 2 (counts as an esc). Esc blo until first corner, (1 esc, ch 2, 1 esc) in the ch sp. Esc blo until second corner, (1 esc, ch 2, 1 esc) in the ch sp. Esc blo until third corner, (1 esc, ch 2, 1 esc) in the ch sp. Esc blo until fourth corner, (1 esc, ch 1) in the corner. Sl st to join the round. Note that in the fourth corner you only ch 1, while in the rest of them you ch 2.

Work until round 24 (28) 32 (36). Keep in mind that you have to increase a total of 8 stitches in each round (2 per corner). Do not forget to change color every 4 rounds.

At the end of the yoke you should have a total of 272 (304) 344 (376) esc (ch in the corners are not included in this number) divided as follows: 73 (81) 91 (99) esc for the back and front and 63 (71) 81 (89) esc in each sleeve.

# **BODY**

Crochet in the round. When starting a round, you will ch 1. This ch 1 does not count as a stitch. In the first round in this section, you will leave the stitches in the sleeves on hold and you will start working the body in the round.

Change to color F (A) C (E).

Round 1: Ch 1 (does not count as an esc). 73 (81) 91 (99) esc blo, 1 esc in the ch sp (first corner), ch 3. *Place a marker in the second ch*. Skip all sts in the sleeve: 63 (71) 81 (89) sts. 1 esc in the ch sp (second corner). 73 (81) 91 (99) esc blo, 1 esc in the ch sp (third corner), ch 3. *Place a marker in the second ch*. Skip all sts in the sleeve: 63 (71) 81 (89) sts. 1 esc in the ch sp (fourth corner). Slst to join with the first st in the round.

The markers placed will show you where to join the yarn to crochet the sleeves. Do not remove them until you finish the first round in the sleeves.

Round 2: Ch 1. Esc blo until the ch sp. 3 esc in the ch sp. Esc blo until next ch sp. 3 esc in the ch sp. 1 esc blo. Slst to join the round. You will have a total of 156 (172) 192 (208) esc.

Round 3: Ch 1. Esc blo until end of the round. Slst to join the round.

Repeat round 3 until round 32 (32) 32 (36) or until it reaches your desired length. Keep in mind that we will add a ribbing that will increase the length in 3 cm. Fasten off.



# **SLEEVES**

You will first work one sleeve. Once it is finished, repeat the process for the other one. Crochet in the round. When starting a round, you will ch 1. This ch 1 does not count as a stitch.

Change to color F (A) C (E).

Insert your hook in the marker placed in a chain in round 1 in the body section.

# Size S:

Round 1: ch 1. Esc blo until you complete the round. Slst to join the round. You will have a total of 66 sts.

Round 2: ch 1. Esc blo until there are 2 sts left in the round. 1 dec esc blo. Slst to join the round.

Round 3: ch 1. Esc blo until you complete the round. Slst to join the round.

Round 4: ch 1. 1 esc blo. 1 dec esc blo. Esc blo until you complete the round. Slst to join the round.

At the end of these 4 rounds, you will have decreased 2 sts. You will have a total of 64 sts.

Repeat rounds 1-4 until round 40. At the end of round 40, you will have a total of 46 sts. Fasten off.

# Sizes (M) L (XL):

Round 1: ch 1. Esc blo until there are 2 sts left in the round. 1 dec esc blo. Slst to join the round. You will have a total of (73) 83 (91) sts.

Round 2: ch 1. 1 esc blo. 1 dec esc blo. Esc blo until you complete the round. Slst to join the round.

At the end of these 2 rounds, you will have decreased 2 sts. Repeat rounds 1 and 2 until round (28) 32 (32). At that point you will have a total of (46) 52 (60) sts.

Size (XL): Fasten off.

# Sizes (M) L:

Round (29) 33: ch 1. Esc blo until the end of the round. Slst to join the round.

Repeat this round until round 36. Fasten off.

If you wish the sleeves to be longer in any size, repeat rounds without decreasing until they reach the desired length. Keep in mind that we will add a ribbing that will increase the length in 3 cm.

### RIBBING

# Waist ribbing

Change to **color D (A) E (B).** Note: if you worked more rounds in the body than indicated in the pattern, make sure to use the color that continues your sequence.

Join the yarn where you finished the body. Crochet back and forth.



Ch 8

Row 1: 1 hdc slst in the second ch. 6 hdc sl st. Join with 2 slst in the next 2 sts of the hem.

Row 2: 6 hdc slst blo, 1 hdc slst. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 3: 7 hdc slst blo. Join with 2 slst in the next 2 sts of the hem.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until you complete all sts around the bottom. Fasten off, leaving a long strand to sew.

Using a yarn needle, join the end of the ribbing to the start and fasten off.

# Sleeve ribbing

You will first work one sleeve ribbing. Once it is finished, repeat the process for the other one.

Change to **color D (E) B (B).** Note: if you worked more rounds in the sleeves than indicated in the pattern, make sure to use the color that continues your sequence.

Join the yarn where you finished the sleeve. Crochet back and forth.

Ch 8.

Row 1: 1 hdc slst in the second ch. 6 hdc sl st. Join with 2 slst in the next 2 sts of the hem.

Row 2: 6 hdc slst blo, 1 hdc slst. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 3: 7 hdc slst blo. Join with 2 slst in the next 2 sts of the hem.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until you complete all sts around the bottom. Fasten off, leaving a long strand to sew.

Using a yarn needle, join the end of the ribbing to the start and fasten off.
