MATERIAL

Friends Cotton 8/4 1 skein / 20 g in Mulberry (55) **(col. A)** 1 skein / 10 g in Eucalyptus (96) **(col. B)**

Crochet hook 2.5 mm / US C/2 Wool needle Metal wire, 2 mm in diameter or a flower stick **Note!** Avoid using metal wire/flower sticks for the stalk if you plan on using the Rose

YARN QUALITY

as a toy for children.

Friends Cotton 8/4, Hobbii
 100% Cotton
 50 g / 1.75 oz = 160 m / 174 yds

ABBREVIATIONS

sc = single crochet st = stitch ch = chain sl st = slip stitch R = Row BLO = Back loop only hdc = half double crochet

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Height: 20 cm / 7.9"

PATTERN INFORMATION

Gift your loved one a beautiful rose that will never wither! The flower is worked in a simple pattern, which even beginners who have mastered the basic types of stitches can easily rework. There is a wire in the stem that is crocheted around. However, if you are crocheting the rose for a child, we recommend not using the wire here. In the pattern you will find step-by-step photos that will guide you through the pattern.

INFO AND TIPS

The rose flower is worked in rows back and forth and later rolled together. When rolling the rose, make sure that you twist it relatively tightly from the inside to the outside. Later the ends are sewn together and the rose is secured with a few stitches through the flower. The leaves are sewn under the rose. Make sure that the front of the leaves is facing upwards.

The wire is first cut to size, then you crochet the stem and insert the wire into it. The ends are sewn together and the stem is then attached to the flower.

ROSE FLOWER (col. A)

Work in rows. The chain stitches at the end of each row are not counted. The first R is turned without a ch. Ch 102, insert into the 3rd ch from the hook and continue working as follows: **1. R:** 100 dc, turn (100).

- **2. R**: (ch 4, skip 3 sts, 2 hdc in one st) x25, 2 ch and turn.
- **3. R**: (3 hdc, 3 dc, 3 hdc around the ch bow) x25, 2 ch and turn.
- **4. R:** (8 hdc in BLO, 1 sl st in BLO) x25.

Cut the thread long. Roll the piece together and sew the ends of the rows together. Secure the rose with a few stitches through the flower so that nothing can slip later. See the photo guide below.





SEPALS (col. B)

Make two.

Ch 10, turn. Begin in the 2nd ch from the hook and crochet around the ch-sts as follows: 1. Rd: 2 sc, 2 hdc, (2 dc in one st) x4, 4 dc in one st, further on the other side of the ch-sts, (2 dc in one st) x4, 2 hdc, 2 sc (28).

2. Rd: 28 sc (28).

Finish with a sl st, cut the thread long and crochet a second sepal. Then sew the leaves under the flower. Make sure that the front of the leaves is facing upwards.



STEM (col. B)

Cut a wire approx. 18 cm / 7" long. The stem is crocheted in rows. The ch at the end of the rows is not counted. Ch 53, insert into the 2nd ch from hook and continue working as follows: 1. - 2. R: 52 sc, 1 ch and turn (2 R) (52).



Cut the thread long and place the wire in the middle of the rows. Then pierce stitch by stitch through the opposite ends of your rows and sew them together.

If the wire slips a little, you can always push it up a little while sewing it together. Then press the stem a little into the underside of the flower and sew it to it. You can now use the thread to sew the sepals a little further onto the stem so that an even picture is created under the flower.
