



CROCHET PATTERN

Cuddly Wrap

Dog's Bandana

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MATERIALS

1 skein of Friends Wool color Lilac 63

Crochet hook 4 mm / US G/6 Darning needle

YARN QUALITY

Friends Wool, Hobbii 100 % Wool 50 g / 1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE

Single Crochet: 13 sts x 17 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

Double Crochet: 16 sts x 7 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
st = stitch
sts = stitches

SIZE

Custom

MEASUREMENTS

This measurement is specific to this particular pattern's sample, but it varies based on the size of your pet:
Width: 26 cm / 10.2" (without laces)

Length: 16 cm / 6.3"

PATTERN INFORMATION

Show love to your furry friend in warmth, comfort, and style. Crocheted from the softest woolen material, this bandana ensures that your pet stays snug and cozy, making it ideal for chilly walks and winter days. This is an intermediate level custom pattern, so it's perfect for dogs of all breeds and shapes.

The shell stitch adds a touch of uniqueness to the design and the adjustable tie closure allows a secure fit while still being comfortable for your dog to wear.

Pattern







BODY

Ch 2. Crochet in rows. Increase with sc in the next 5 rows.

Row 1: Sc in the second ch from hook

Row 2: ch 1, turn, inc

Row 3: ch 1, turn, inc in the next 2 st

Row 4: ch 1, turn, inc, 2 sc, inc

Row 5: ch 1, turn, inc, sc 5

Start making shell stitches in the next rows:

Every time we make a (dc, ch1, dc) in one st, we're making a V Stitch.

Row 6: ch 1, turn, sc, ch 2, skip 2 sts, (dc, ch1, dc) in the next st, ch 2, skip 2 st, sc



Row 7: ch 1, turn, sc, dc 7 in the ch space of the V stitch, sc in the last stitch





Row 8: ch 3, turn, dc in the same stitch, ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the last st. You should have one V stitch in the beginning and one in the end of this row.



Row 9: ch 3, turn, dc 7 in the ch space of the first V stitch, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 8 in the ch space of the second V stitch.



Row 10: ch 3, turn, dc in the same stitch, ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the last st. You should have a total of 3 V stitches in this row.



Row 11: ch 3, turn, dc 7 in the ch space of the first V stitch, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 7 in the ch space of the second V stitch, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 8 in the ch space of the third V stitch

Row 12: Repeat Row 10. Add one more V stitch by adding: ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the last st. You should have a total of 4 V stitches in this row.

Row 13: ch 3, turn, dc 7 in the ch space of the first V stitch, (skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 7 in the ch space of the next V stitch) x 2, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 8 in the fourth V stitch,

Row 14: Repeat Row 10. Add two more V stitches by adding: (ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next st) x 2 times. You should have a total of 5 V stitches in this row.

Row 15: ch 3, turn, dc 7 in the ch space of the first V stitch, (skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 7 in the ch space of the next V stitch) x 3, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 8 in the fifth V stitch

Row 16: Repeat Row 10. Add three more V stitches by adding: (ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next st) x 3 times. You should have a total of 6 V stitches in this row.

Row 17: ch 3, turn, dc 7 in the ch space of the first V stitch, (skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 7 in the ch space of the next V stitch) x 4, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 8 in the sixth V stitch

SIZING

For smaller sizes:

You can skip the last rows of this pattern, stopping when the size is right for your pet! Remember your last row should always end with a Shell Stitch row, not a V stitch row. Then start making your border:)

For bigger sizes:

Keep adding V stitches on every even row and Shell stitches on every odd row. These should be your next rows:

Row 18: Repeat Row 10. Add four more V stitches by adding: (ch 3, skip 3 sts, sc in the next st, ch 3, skip 3 sts, (dc, ch 1, dc) in the next st) x 4 times. You should have a total of 7 V stitches in this row.

Row 19: ch 3, turn, dc 7 in the ch space of the first V stitch, (skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 7 in the ch space of the next V stitch)x 5, skip 3 ch, sc, skip 3 ch, dc 8 in the seventh V stitch

Remember your last row should always end with a Shell Stitch row, not a V stitch row. You may need to adjust the number of chains in each lace of the border to ensure the bandana closure fits properly.



BORDER

Ch 1, turn, sc on top of every shell stitch.



For the first lace:

Once you get to the corner ch 36, sc along the chain starting from the second ch from the hook.



Continue by single crocheting an edge evenly along the left side, ch 3 on the bottom corner, single crochet evenly along the right side





For the second lace:

Ch 36 in the corner, sc along the chain starting from the second ch from the hook

Fasten off and weave in the yarn ends.
