MATERIAL

Friends Cotton 8/4: 1 skein of each: Dusty Rose (52) **(A)** 10 g in Mulberry (55) **(B)** A remainder in Pink Berry Smoothie (54) **(C)** 15 g White (01) **(D)** 15 g Beige (05) **(E)**

Rainbow Lace A remainder in Natural White (02) **(F)** A remainder in Black (09) **(G)**

Safety eyes 8 mm Crochet hook 2,5 mm / US C/2 Filling Wool needle

YARN

Friends Cotton 8/4, Hobbii
 100% Cotton
 50 g / 1.75 oz = 160 m / 174 yds

Rainbow Lace, Hobbii
 100 % Cotton
 50 g / 1.75 oz = 280 m / 308 yds

MEASUREMENTS

16 cm / 6 "

PATTERN INFORMATION

The pattern for the Cupid Piglet is one of the easier patterns for crocheting amigurumi and is therefore suitable for intermediate leveled crocheters. If you have mastered the usual techniques such as the magic ring, crocheting single crochet stitches in spiral rounds and crocheting in rows, the pattern should not be a problem for you. Other techniques, such as the deep single crochet stitch, are explained separately in the pattern. You will also find a photo guide with the most important steps for better orientation in the pattern.

ABBREVIATIONS

sc = single crochet st = stitch ch = chain sl st = slip stitch inc = increase dec = decrease Rd = Round R = Row BLO = Back loop only FLO = Front loop only MR = Magic Ring

INFO AND TIPS

In each R and Rd you will find a number of sts in brackets. An "x" is indicated after each bracket. Behind it you will find information about how often the bracket should be repeated on this round.

As an example:

(1 sc, 1 inc) x6 (18)

In this example, 1 sc and 1 inc are crocheted, this is repeated 6 times in total. At the end you should have 18 sc on the round. You will find this notation throughout the pattern.

Details to the face

To attach the details to the face, use the Hobbii Rainbow Lace yarn so that the thin thread makes it particularly easy to attach the details. To do this, use a wool needle with a blunt tip and pick up the thread in the needle. You stitch into the head and come out at the point where you want the detail to be embroidered. Then stitch again where the detail should end. As an example: If you want to embroider the eyelid in black, stitch the thread into the head, come out above the eye and stitch again in the middle, on the outside of the eye, to form the eyelid. In this way you can embroider the whites of the eyes, the cheeks, the eyebrows and the nostrils as well.



HEAD (A)

Stuff the head continuously with filling.

- 1. Rd: crochet 7 sc in a MR (7).
- 2. Rd: (1 inc) x7 (14).
- 3. Rd: (1 sc, 1 inc) x7 (21).
- 4. Rd: (2 sc, 1 inc) x7 (28).
- 5. Rd: (3 sc, 1 inc) x7 (35).
- 6. Rd: (4 sc, 1 inc) x7 (42).
- 7. 16. Rd: 42 sc (10 Rd) (42).
- 17. Rd: (5 sc, 1 dec) x6 (36).

Attach the safety eyes between Rd 14 and 15 with a distance of 7 sts between the eyes.

- 18. Rd: (4 sc, 1 dec) x6 (30).
- 19. Rd: (3 sc, 1 dec) x6 (24).
- 20. Rd: (2 sc, 1 dec) x6 (18).
- 21. Rd: (1 sc, 1 dec) x6 (12).
- 22. Rd: (1 dec) x6 (6).

Cut the thread long, thread it through the FLO of the last round, tighten, cut the thread and weave in the ends (see picture sequence).



NOSE (A)

Ch 4, stitch into the 2nd ch from hook and work around the ch-sts as follows:
1. Rd: 2 sc, 3 sc in one st, further on the other side of the ch-sts, 1 sc, 1 inc (8).
2. Rd: (1 inc, 3 sc) x2 (10).
3. Rd: (1 inc, 4 sc) x2 (12).
4. Rd: 12 sc in BLO (12).
Stuff the nose lightly with filling.
Finish with a sl st, cut the thread long and attach the nose between the eyes.

EARS (A) x 2

Don't stuff the ears. 1. Rd: crochet 6 sc in a MR (6). 2. Rd: (2 sc, 1 inc) x2 (8). 3. Rd: (3 sc, 1 inc) x2 (10).



- 4. Rd: (4 sc, 1 inc) x2 (12).
- 5. Rd: 12 sc.
- 6. Rd: (5 sc, 1 inc) x2 (14).
- 7. Rd: (6 sc, 1 inc) x2 (16).
- 8. Rd: (7 sc, 1 inc) x2 (18).
- 9. Rd: (2 sc, 1 inc) x6 (24).

Cut the thread long and sew the ears onto the head over rounds 4-12.

CURLS (A)

Pick up the thread on round 1 of the head and secure it with a sl st. Ch 5, insert into the 2nd ch from the hook and crochet 4 sc the ch-sts.

Crochet 1 sl st in the head and repeat the whole thing 1 more time.

In the end you should end up with two curls (see picture sequence).

Fasten off and weave in the ends.



FINISH THE FACE

Embroider the whites of the eyes in **(F)** right next/under the eye.

Embroider the eyelids in **(G)** directly over the eyes, and the eyebrows 2 rounds above the eyes, over 1 round high and 2 sc wide. Embroider the cheeks in **(C)** next to the eyes over 1 sc wide, stitching 3 times. Embroider the nostrils in **(G)** over Rd 1 of the nose, 1 st high and with a distance of 2 sts.





LEGS (A) x 2

Stuff the legs continuously with filling.

- 1. Rd: crochet 6 sc in a MR (6).
- 2. Rd: (2 sc, 1 inc) x2 (8).
- 3. Rd: 8 sc (8).
- 4. Rd: (3 sc, 1 inc) x2 (10).
- 5. 6. Rd: 10 sc (2 Rd) (10).
- 7. Rd: (4 sc, 1 inc) x2 (12).
- 8. Rd: 12 sc (12).

Finish the first leg with a sl st, fasten off and weave in the ends.

Crochet a second leg but do not cut the thread. Continue directly with the body.

BODY (A)

Stuff the body continuously with filling.
Ch 2 on the second leg, stitch in the first leg and crochet as follows (see picture sequence):
1. Rd: 12 sc around leg 1, 2 sc in the ch-sts, 12 sc around leg 2, 2 sc in the ch-sts (28) (see picture sequence).
2. Rd: 5 sc, 1 inc, 14 sc, 1 inc, 7 sc (30).
3. Rd: 6 sc, 1 inc, 14 sc, 1 inc, 8 sc (32).
4. Rd: 7 sc, 1 inc, 14 sc, 1 inc, 9 sc (34).
5. - 10. Rd: 34 sc (6 Rd) (34).
11. Rd: (15 sc, 1 dec) x2 (32).
12. Rd: (14 sc, 1 dec) x2 (30).
13. - 14. Rd: 30 sc (2 Rd) (30).

15. Rd: (3 sc, 1 dec) x6 (24).

16. Rd: (2 sc, 1 dec) x6 (18).

17. Rd: (1 sc, 1 dec) x6 (12).



18. Rd: (1 dec) x6 (6).Cut the thread long and attach the head to the body.



ARMS (A) x 2

1. Rd: crochet 6 sc in a MR (6).

2. Rd: (2 sc, 1 inc) x2 (8).

3. - 4. Rd: 8 sc (2 Rd) (8).

5. Rd: (2 sc, 1 dec) x2 (6).

6. - 12. Rd: 6 sc (7 Rd) (6).

Just stuff the fists with filling.

Fold the end and crochet together with 3 sc. Cut the thread long and attach the arms under the head.

PANTS (E)

Ch 42, sl st in the 1st ch and close the ch-sts to form a ring (see first picture). Continue crocheting as follows:

1. - 2. Rd: 42 sc (2 Rd) (42).

3. Rd: (19 sc, 1 dec) x2 (40).

4. Rd: (18 sc, 1 dec) x2 (38).

5. Rd: (17 sc, 1 dec) x2 (36).

6. - 8. Rd: 36 sc (3 Rd) (36) (see second picture).

Now fold the pants in the middle and stitch in the opposite sc

(see third picture). On the next round the first trouser leg is crocheted.

To do this, crochet around the opening for the trouser leg as follows:

9. Rd: 18 sc (18) (see fourth picture below).

10. Rd: 18 deep sc (18).

Explanation: Deep sc is crocheted just like the usual sc. However, to do this, you don't stitch in the next sc from the previous round as usual, but one round below. So on round 10 you work in the sc from round 8. This creates the image of the deep sc (see pictures five and six on the next page).

Fasten off and weave in the ends.

Pick up the thread again at the second opening and repeat round 9-10 again.

Cut the thread long, sew the small opening between the legs closed, fasten off and weave in the ends.





HEARTS (B) x 6

The ch in Rd 2 are not counted.

1. Rd: crochet 5 sc in a MR (5).

2. Rd: (4 sc in one st, 1 ch, 1 sl st in the next st) x2, 2 ch, 1 sl st in the next st (11). Cut the thread long and sew the hearts onto the pants.

WINGS (D) x 2

It is crocheted in R. First crochet 1 row around the ch-sts, turn the work. The chain is not counted.

Ch 8, begin in the 2nd ch from the hook and continue crocheting as follows:

1. R: 6 sc, 5 sc in one st, further on the other side of the ch-sts, 4 sc, the last two sts remain free, 3 ch and turn (15).

2. R: Begin in the 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc along the ch-sts, 1 sc in the wing, (1 inc) x2, 3 sc, 1 ch and turn (10).

3. R: 3 sc, (1 inc) x2, 3 sc, the last two sts remain free, 3 ch and turn (10).

4. R: Begin in the 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc along the ch-sts, 4 sc in the wing, (1 inc) x2, 4 sc, 1 ch and turn (14).

5. R: 12 sc, the last two sts remain free, 3 ch and turn (12).

6. R: Begin in the 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc along the ch-sts, 10 sc, (1 inc) x2 (16).



Now crochet 6 sc along the ends of the R. Cut the thread long, fold the end of the wing and sew the edges together. Crochet a second wing and sew both onto the back. You can find illustrated instructions for crocheting the wings in the sequence of pictures below.
