



# **CROCHET PATTERN**

#### MATERIALS

#### Friends Cotton 8/4

C1: 1 skein in Beige (05) C2: 1 skein in Lilac (63) C3: 1 skein in Misty Violet (67)

Crochet hook 3mm (US~D-3) 2 removable markers in different colors Scissors

#### **YARN QUALITY**

Friends Cotton 8/4, Hobbii 100% Cotton 50 g / 1.75 oz = 160 m / 175 yds

#### GAUGE

26 sts x 26 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in single crochet.

## **ABBREVIATIONS**

Ch = chain Sc = Single crochet Rnd = round C1 = Color 1 C2 = Color 2 C3 = Color 3

#### SIZE

One size to fit head circumference of 52 cm/ 20.5"

## MEASUREMENTS

Crown diameter: 16 cm / 6" Head circumference: 52 cm / 20.5" Length of sides (no brim): 10 cm / 4"

#### **PATTERN INFORMATION**

The Hydrangea hat is worked top down. At first, the top is made with a magic circle and increases, strategically placed so that it's a perfect circle.

Once the right circumference is achieved, the sides are worked with the mosaic technique to add the flowers in different colors. The brim has stripes and is a bit frilly for a more feminine look.

A color chart and explanations on how to read it are included for the flowers.

#### **INFO AND TIPS**

When you have to change colors, don't cut the previous color. Use the mosaic technique: carry and wrap the yarn(s) you're not using until you have to use it/them again.

When instructions are between asterisks \*, repeat them until you get to the end of the round or to where it's indicated.

#### **PATTERN BEGINS**

#### Тор

With C1, make a magic ring. Rnd 1: Place 6 sc into magic ring. Place a removable marker to indicate the beginning of each round. When you come to it, remove it, work the first crochet stitch according to the instructions on the round, and replace the marker. Rnd 2: \*2 sc into next sc\*. Rep \* to \* until you come to the marker. (12) Rnd 3: \*1 sc into next sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (18) Rnd 4: \*1 sc into each of next 2 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (24) Rnd 5: 1 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 3 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 2 remain. 1 sc into each of next 2 sc. (30) Rnd 6: \*1 sc into each of next 4 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* (36) Rnd 7: 1 sc into each of next 2 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 5 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 3 remain. 1 sc into each of next 3 sc. (42) Rnd 8: \*1 sc into each of next 6 sc. 2 sc into next sc\*. (48) Rnd 9: 1 sc into each of next 3 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 7 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 4 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 4 sc. (54) Rnd 10: \*1 sc into each of next 8 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (60) Rnd 11: 1 sc into each of next 4 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 9 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 5 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 5 sc. (66) Rnd 12: \*1 sc into each of next 10 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (72) Rnd 13: 1 sc into each of next 3 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 11 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 8 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 8 sc. (78) Rnd 14: \*1 sc into each of next 12 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (84)



Rnd 15: 1 sc into each of next 2 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 13 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 11 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 11 sc. (90) Rnd 16: \*1 sc into each of next 14 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (96) Rnd 17: 1 sc into next sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 15 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 14 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 14 sc. (102) Rnd 18: \*1 sc into each of next 16 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (108) Rnd 19: 1 sc into each of next 2 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 17 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 15 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 15 sc. (114) Rnd 20: \*1 sc into each of next 3 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. (120) Rnd 21: 1 sc into each of next 3 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 19 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 16 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 16 sc. (126) Rnd 22: 1 sc into each of next 12 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 20 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 8 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 8 sc. (132) Rnd 23: 1 sc into each of next 14 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 20 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 8 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 8 sc. (132) Rnd 23: 1 sc into each of next 14 sc, 2 sc into next sc, \*1 sc into each of next 21 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* until 7 sc remain. 1 sc into each of next 7 sc. (138)

## Sides

With the same color as you worked the top, and continuing to use the removable marker as you did so far, work as follows:

Rnd 0 of sides: \*1 sc into next sc through the back loop only\*. Rep to marker.

Rnds 1 to 26: Working with sc only at all times, follow the color chart.

The color chart is always read from right to left and bottom up, and with the correct stitch count, you'll repeat each row twice on a round. I suggest you place a different removable stitch marker where one repeat of a row of the chart ends, so you know where the 2<sup>nd</sup> one begins.

Remember to use the mosaic technique to change colors (carry the yarn you're not using and wrap it when you work with the active one). You can cut C3 after row 18, as you won't use it until you reach the brim.

Once you have worked the whole chart, the sides are finished, and only the brim is left to do!

You can cut all yarns and reattach C3.

## Brim

With C3, work in this manner: Rnd 1 of brim: \*1 sc into each of next 5 sc, 2 sc into next sc\*. Next rnd: \*1 sc into each of next 6 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* 5 sc. Next rnd: \*1 sc into each of next 7 sc, 2 sc into next sc\* 5 sc.

Cut C3 and join C1. Next 3 rnds: \*1 sc into each sc\*

Cut C1 and join C2.




Next 3 rnds: \*1 sc into each sc\*. For the last stitch, work a slip stitch instead and fasten off.

#### Color chart

Read it from right to left and bottom up.

As the hat is worked top down, the chart looks upside down. Work it exactly as it is!
