The Bungee Backpack

MATERIALS

2 skeins of Bungee Mini color 01

Crochet Hook 4 mm / US G/6
Crochet Hook 10 mm / US N/P-15
Bag Flap w/Magnetic Button (Black)
Bag Base (Black 21x8 cm)
Backpack Shoulder Strap (Black)
Black Drawstring
Pins
Black Thread
Sewing Needle

YARN QUALITY

 **Bungee Mini**, Hobbii
42% cotton, 58% polyester
200 g (7.1 oz) = 60m (66 yds)

GAUGE

6 sts x 6 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4 in x 4 in

ABBREVIATIONS

CH = Chain
INC = Increase
REP = Repeat
SC = Single Crochet
SCBLO = Single Crochet Back Loop Only
SCFLO = Single Crochet Front Loop Only
SL ST = Slip stitch
SP = Space
ST = Stitch

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Height: 26 cm / 10 in
Width: 9 cm / 3.5 in
Length: 26 cm / 10 in

INFO AND TIPS

This pattern is written in US Terminology.

This pattern is written in crochet shorthand. Example: "SC 1" means to single crochet in the next stitch and "SC 30" means to single crochet into the next 30 stitches.

A smaller hook is needed for round 1. Crochet loosely to account for the smaller hook. Your work should be loose enough to lie flat.

At the end of round 1, an alternative join method is used to make the connection to the base seamless before starting the rest of the bag. Either a tapestry needle or crochet hook can be used.

To avoid a seam down the side, use the invisible join method. Watch the video tutorial [here](#).

If not using the invisible join method, a CH 1 at the beginning of the round is necessary. This will create a seam in your work.

POCKETS (make 2)

Row 1:

Using 10mm hook, CH 7

SC in 2nd CH from hook

SC 5

turn

(6 SC)

Row 2:

CH 1

SC 6

turn

(6 SC)

Row 3:
CH 1
SCBLO 6
turn
(6 SCBLO)

Rows 4-5:
REP row 2 twice

Row 6:
CH 1
SCFLO 6
turn
(6 SCFLO)



Tie off, leaving a 30 cm (12 in) tail for sewing

BODY

Round 1: (See notes)

Using 4mm hook, pull up a loop in lower right corner of bag base (See photo 1)

SL ST 37 on surface of base

Fasten off, leaving a 15 cm (6 in) tail, pull the tail through the ST

Insert hook into 1st ST of round and pull tail through (See photo 2)

Insert your hook into the back loop of last ST of round, pull tail through (See photo 3)

Pull beginning tail (on bottom of base) through to top of base & weave in both ends
(38 SL ST) (See photo 4)

Round 2:

Using 10mm hook, pull up a loop in 1st ST of round

SC 2 around 1st D ring (See photos 5 & 6)

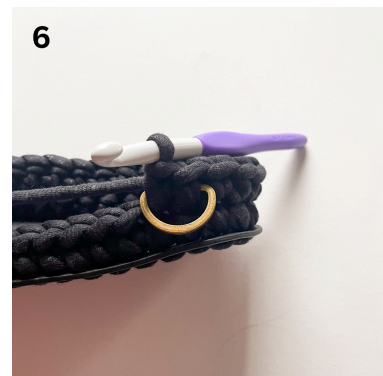
SC 9

SC 2 around 2nd D ring

SC 25

Invisible join (See notes)

(38 SC)



Round 3:
SC 38
Invisible join
(38 SC)

Round 4:
SCBLO 38
Invisible join
(38 SCBLO)

Rounds 5-6:
REP round 3
(38 SC)

Round 7:
REP round 4
(38 SCBLO)

Rounds 8-16:
REP rounds 5-7 three more times
Do not tie off

ASSEMBLY

Attach ring of straps to top of bag at ST 7 (ring should be centered between D rings). Draw strap through ring & clip onto D rings (See photo 7)



Place drawstring on top of bag (Round 16) with pull strings centered in front

SC 27 over drawstrings (See photo 8)

SC 1 in between pull strings (See photo 9)

SC 10 over drawstrings

Fasten off, leaving a 15 cm (6 in) tail, pull the tail through the ST

Insert hook into first ST of round and pull tail through (See photo 2)

Insert your hook into the back loop of last ST of round, pull tail through (See photo 3)

Center flap above strap ring and pin in place

Using black thread, sew flap to bag using a basic stitch (See photo 10)

Pin magnetic snap to bag, sew to bag using a basic stitch, making sure it lines up with magnet on flap (See photo 11)



Pin pocket to side of bag, placing one edge directly beside D ring and opposite edge in line with "stripes" on bag, sew in place using a whip stitch (See photo 12)

Tie off & weave in ends

Repeat for 2nd pocket
