Crossbody Bag

MATERIALS

2 skeins of Friends Ribbon color 123

Crochet Hook 7 mm

Nylon Zipper 35 cm (13.5 in) in Dark Grey

Adjustable Shoulder Strap for Bags in

Cotton - 80-125 cm x 38 mm (31.5-49.2 in x

1.5 in) in Beige/Dark Grey

Sewing needle

Grey thread

YARN QUALITY

Friends Ribbon, Hobbii 100% cotton 250 g (8.8 oz) = 125m (137 yds)

GAUGE

8 sts x 5 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4 in x 4 in Half Double Crochet

ABBREVIATIONS

CH = Chain

HDC = Half Double Crochet

HDCBLO = Half Double Crochet Back Loop
Only

INC = Increase (2 stitches in same space)

REP = Repeat

SC = Single Crochet

SL ST = Slip Stitch

SP = Space

ST = Stitch

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 14 cm / 5.5 in Length: 23 cm / 9 in

INFO AND TIPS

This pattern is written in US Terminology.

This pattern is written in crochet shorthand. Examples: "HDC 1" means to half double crochet in the next stitch and "HDC 30" means to half double crochet into the next 30 stitches. "INC 4" means to increase in the next 4 stitches.


CH 1 does not count as a ST.

The entire pattern is worked using two strands of yarn held together.

If you prefer a no-sew method to attach the zipper, then check out this **tutorial**.

BASE OF BAG

Round 1: SC 2 around 1st D ring (See photo 1) CH 1 turn (2 SC)





Rounds 2-19:

HDC 2

CH 1

turn

(2 HDC)

Round 20:

SC 2 around 2nd D ring Tie off & weave in ends

SIDE PANEL (make 2)

Round 1:

CH 10

HDC in 2nd CH from hook

HDC 7


HDC 4 in last CH

HDC 7 working on opposite side of CH

HDC 3 in same CH as 1st HDC (See photo 2)

SL ST to 1st HDC to join

(22 HDC)



Round 2:

CH 1

INC

HDC 7

INC 4

HDC 7

INC 3

SL ST to 1st HDC to join

(30 HDC)

Round 3:

CH 1

HDC 1

*INC 2, HDC 9, INC 2**



HDC 2
REP from * to ** 1 time
HDC 1
SL ST to 1st HDC to join
(38 HDC)

Round 4:

CH 1

HDC 2

*INC 2, HDC 11, INC 2** 1 time

HDC 4

REP from * to **

HDC 2

SL ST to 1st HDC to join

(46 HDC)

Round 5:

CH 1

HDCBLO 23 (See photos 3 & 4)

Tie off & weave in ends

(23 HDCBLO)






ASSEMBLY

Line up base of bag with one panel, making sure edges of base line up with front loops of panel. Using a 45 cm (18 in) piece of ribbon yarn, sew base of bag to front loops only of panel using a whip stitch. (See photos 5 & 6). REP for 2nd panel.

Tie off & weave in ends



Unzip zipper and pin in place (See photo 7) Sew zipper to bag or use no-sew method (linked in notes) Attach shoulder strap to D rings
