# Wisteria

**Shirt**

#### **MATERIALS**

#### **Friends Cotton Silk**

A: 5 (5) 6 (7) 8 (9) skeins of col. Oatmilk (03) B: 1 (1) 1 (2) 2 (2) skein(s) of col. Antique Rose (53)

Circular needle 4mm (US 6) 10 stitch markers Scissors Darning needle Stitch wire 7 (7) 7 (8) 9 (9) buttons, 12 mm

#### YARN QUALITY

**Friends Cotton Silk**, Hobbii 78% Cotton, 22% Silk 50 g / 1.75 oz = 120 m / 131 yds

#### **GAUGE**

22 sts x 28 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4'' x 4'' in 4mm (US 6) needles in Stockinette Stitch

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

K = knit

P = Purl

Yo = Yarn over

K2tog = Knit 2 sts together

Ssk = Slip, slip, knit

Skpo = Slip, knit, pass over knitted stitch

PM = Place marker

SM = Slip marker

P2tog tbl = Purl 2 sts together through the

back loop

BORm = Beginning of row marker

**GSR** = German Short Rows

Rnd= round

#### **SIZE**

#### PATTERN INFORMATION

The Wisteria Shirt is worked from the bottom up. It is knitted flat with a simple lace pattern that repeats 4 times throughout the shirt. There are picot edges at the hem, sleeves, button band and button hole band. The sleeves are worked with the German Short Row method for a better fit, and a single column of lace is worked on both of them.

For the collar, stitches are picked up around the neck, and it is also finished with a picot edge.

There are 5-10 cm / 2-4" of positive ease.

#### **INFO AND TIPS**

It is recommended that you have the stitch markers placed at all times, as the beginning and end of the charts can be confusing if this is your first-time working lace.

There's a tutorial on my Instagram on how to work this chart in particular if you need further help.

#### BODY - 4mm (US 6) needles

#### Picot edge

With col. B, cast on 184 (206) 220 (240) 258 (280) sts on circular needles with the long tail cast on method.

Row 1 (WS): Purl all

Row 2 (RS): Knit all

Row 3: Purl all

Row 4: \*yo, k2tog\*. Rep from \* to \* until end of row.

Row 5: Purl all

Row 6: Knit all

Row 7: Purl all

Row 8: Fold the fabric by the 4<sup>th</sup> row (the one with the "holes"), and as you knit all, insert the needle through the live stitch and following the column to the CO edge, insert it through the corresponding stitch. You'll work a k2tog with the live stitch and the CO stitch on the same column until end of row. Pay attention...if the stitches are not from the same column, you'll end up with a crooked edge.

Now that the edge is done, change to col. A. You have to start with the body and the lace pattern. This lace pattern is worked over 2 sts and 4 rows. (There's a chart on the last page). For the very first RS row, you'll place markers, for the following repeats, you slip them. Do as follows:

Row 1 (WS)- and all WS rows: Purl all

Row 2 (RS): K 15 (15) 16 (18) 18 (21), PM, yo, k2tog, PM, k 10 (16) 18 (18) 22 (22), PM, yo, k2tog, PM, k 15 (15) 16 (18) 18 (21), PM for end of right front, k 96 (106) 112 (124) 134 (144)



for back, PM for beginning of left front, k 15 (15) 16 (18) 18 (21), PM, yo, k2tog, PM, k 10 (16) 18 (18) 22 (22), PM, yo, k2tog, PM, k 15 (15) 16 (18) 18 (21).

Row 3: Purl all slipping all markers as you come to them.

Row 4 (RS): K to 1<sup>st</sup> marker, SM, ssk, yo, SM, k to next marker, SM, ssk, yo, SM, knit to side marker, SM, knit the back to side marker, SM, k 15 (15) 16 (18) 18 (21), SM, ssk, yo, SM, k 10 (16) 18 (18) 22 (22), SM, ssk, yo, SM, k 15 (15) 16 (18) 18 (21).

Rep Rows 1 to 4 until you reach row 77 (83) 83 (89) 101 (101) (or until piece measures 28 (30) 30 (32) 37 (37) cm/ 11" (11.8") 11.8" (12.6") 14.4" (14.4") approx. and ending on a WS row. If you want a longer shirt, repeat the 4 rows until desired length.

You'll split for armholes, fronts and back now.

Row 78 (84) 84 (90) 102 (102): Work right front panel as you were doing, but stop 4 (5) 5 (6) 6 (7) sts before side marker. Cast off 8 (10) 10 (12) 12 (14), removing marker as you come to it. Knit back sts until 4 (5) 5 (6) 6 (7) before side marker, cast off 8 (10) 10 (12) 12 (14), removing marker as you come to it. Work left front panel as you were doing it.

Stitch count: 40 (45) 49 (52) 56 (61) sts on right front, 88 (96) 102 (112) 122 (130) sts on back, 40 (45) 49 (52) 56 (61) sts on left front. 168 (186) 200 (216) 234 (252) sts in total.

Leave the right front and back stitches on hold on a stitch cord or rest of yarn. You'll work the left front first.

#### Left front

You will now start the decreases to give shape to the armhole and neck. Continue working the lace pattern as you come to it.

Row 79 (85) 85 (91) 103 (103) (WS): Purl all

Row 80 (86) 86 (92) 104 (104) (RS): K2, skpo, work left front stitches as you were doing it. Rows 81 (87) 87 (93) 105 (105) to 88 (94) 96 (102) 114 (118): Rep last two rows. You've decreased 5 (5) 6 (6) 6 (8) sts and should have 35 (40) 43 (46) 50 (53) now.

Rows 89 (95) 97 (103) 115 (119) to 116 (120) 126 (142) 164 (170): Work in Stockinette Stitch -knit all knit sts, purl all purl sts- while you continue to follow the lace pattern sequence.

The neckline shaping begins here.

Row 117 (121) 127 (143) 165 (171): Cast off 3 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) sts, P to the end of the row.

Row 118 (122) 128 (144) 166 (172): Knit to 4 sts from end of row, k2tog, k2.

Row 119 (123) 129 (145) 167 (173): P all.

Rep rows 118 (122) 128 (144) 166 (172) and 119 (123) 129 (145) 167 (173) – 7 (8) 9 (8) 8 (7) times (until 24 (26) 28 (32) 38 (40) sts remain on your needles).

Row 133 (139) 147 (161) 181 (185): Purl all

Row 134 (140) 148 (162) 182 (186): Work sts as presented while you continue to follow the lace pattern sequence.

Row 135 (141) 149 (163) 183 (187): Purl all



Row 136 (142) 150 (164) 184 (188): Cast off.

Slip the right front stitches from the stitch cord back to the needles.

#### **Right front**

With WS facing you, attach yarn to the first stitch and work as follows:

Row 79 (85) 85 (91) 103 (103) (WS): Purl all

Row 80 (86) 86 (92) 104 (104): Knit (following lace pattern sequence) until 4 sts remain, skpo, k2

Rows 81 (87) 87 (93) 105 (105) to 88 (94) 96 (102) 115 (118): Rep last two rows. You've decreased 5 (5) 6 (6) 6 (8) sts and should have 35 (40) 43 (46) 50 (53) now.

Rows 89 (95) 97 (103) 116 (119) to 115 (119) 125 (141) 163 (169): Work stitches as they're presented, following the lace pattern sequence.

The neckline shaping begins here.

Row 116 (120) 126 (142) 164 (170): Cast off 3 (5) 5 (5) 5 (6) sts, work stitches as presented.

Row 117 (121) 127 (143) 165 (171): Purl until 4 sts remain, p2tog tbl, p2.

Row 118 (122) 128 (144) 166 (172): K all

Rep rows 117 (121) 127 (143) 165 (171) and 118 (122) 128 (144) 166 (172) - 7 (8) 9 (8) 8 (7)

times (until 24 (26) 28 (32) 38 (40) sts remain on your needles).

Row 133 (139) 147 (161) 181 (185): Purl all

Row 134 (140) 148 (162) 182 (186): Work sts as presented following the lace pattern sequence.

Row 135 (141) 149 (163) 183 (187): Purl all

Row 136 (142) 150 (164) 184 (188): Cast off.

#### **BACK PIECE**

Slip the 88 (95) 102 (114) 122 (130) sts for the back from the stitch cord to the needles, and with WS row facing you, attach yarn on the first stitch.

Row 79 (85) 85 (91) 103 (103): Purl all

Row 80 (86) 86 (92) 104 (104): K2, skpo, k until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2.

Rep last two rows 4 (4) 5 (6) 5 (6) more times. You've decreased 10 (10) 12 (14) 12 (14) sts in total and should now have 78 (85) 90 (100) 110 (114).

Continue knitting in stockinette stitch to row 129 (135) 143 (157) 177 (181).

You have to cast off for the neckline and work the shoulders separately now. Row 130 (136) 144 (158) 178 (182): Knit 26 (28) 30 (34) 40 (42), cast off 26 (29) 30 (32) 30 (30), knit 26 (28) 30 (34) 40 (42).

Slip the right shoulder sts onto a stitch cord or rest of yarn.

You'll work the left shoulder first, as you have the stitches for it on your needles.



Row 131 (137) 145 (159) 179 (183): Purl all Row 132 (138) 146 (160) 180 (184): K2, skpo, k all. —25 (27) 29 (33) 39 (41) sts Rep last two rows once more. You should have 24 (26) 28 (32) 38 (40) sts

Next row (WS): Pall

Next row (RS): Cast off knit wise.

Pass the stitches for the right shoulder from the stitch cord onto the needles.

Starting with the WS facing you, attach yarn to the first stitch and work as follows:

Row 131 (137) 145 (159) 179 (183): Purl all

Row 132 (138) 146 (160) 180 (184): K until 4 sts remain, k2tog, k2. —25 (27) 29 (33) 39 (41) sts Rep last two rows once more. You should have 24 (26) 28 (32) 38 (40) sts

Next row (WS): Pall

Next row (RS): Cast off knit wise.

Now that you've finished the body, join the shoulders together with the horizontal invisible seam.

#### **SLEEVES (repeat instructions for both)**

#### 4mm (US 6) needles

For the sleeves, you'll have to place 7 stitch markers. One is the beginning of row marker (BORm), 4 are for the GSR (M1, M2, M3 and M4), and 2 are for the lace pattern (LM1 and LM2).

Locate the center of the underarm and col. A start picking up stitches from there. For a neater look, pick up with a smaller needle, and then go back to the 4mm (US 6) ones. Pick up 84 (88) 92 (108) 120 (128) sts evenly around the armhole. *Tip: Pick up 1 st per cast off st, and 2 out of 3 around the armhole (pick up 2, skip 1).* 

As you pick up, you'll place the markers like this:

Row 0: Pick up 5 (6) 6 (7) 7 (8), **place M1**, pick up 24 (25) 26 (30) 34 (36), **place M2**, pick up 12 (12) 13 (16) 18 (19), **place LM1**, pick up 2, **place LM2**, pick up 12 (12) 13 (16) 18 (19), **place M3**, pick up 24 (25) 26 (30) 34 (36), **place M4**, pick up 5 (6) 6 (7) 7 (8), **place BORm**.

Now that all the markers are placed, you'll join the round and start knitting the sleeve with GSR while at the same time, working the lace pattern on the 2 center sts between the **LM1** and 2.

RS: Knit to **LM1**, k2tog, yo, knit to **M3**, turn using the GSR method (or your preferred method for short rows).

WS: Purl all to M2, turn using the GSR method.



RS: Knit to **LM1**, yo, ssk, knit to turning st. You can remove **M3** now, as you'll work from turning st to turning st. (turning sts have a V shape and are worked as a k2tog or p2tog depending on the side you're working on)

WS: Purl all to turning st. You can remove M2 now as you'll work to turning st.

Rep these 4 rows until you reach M4, where you'll remove it, and continue knitting to BORm.

Now you've finished with the GSR, and start working in the round. When you come to **M1**, remove it and work the turning st as a k2tog.

Knit all for 10 rnds or until your desired sleeve length, but keep this in mind:

The lace pattern is worked over 4 rows, 2 on the RS and 2 WS where you purl. As you won't have WS row, you have to work in this manner:

First row after joining the rnd: Knit all

Next row: work lace pattern.

Next row: Knit all

This means that as you'll be working only on the RS, the purl rows are now knit rows every other rnd.

Once you get to desired length, break yarn and attach col. B. You'll work the picot edge before cast off. The lace pattern ends here.

Rnds 1 to 3: K all

Rnd 4: \*k2tog, yo\*. Rep \* to \* until BORm

Rnds 5 and 6: K all.

Rnd 7: Cast off loosely leaving a tail twice as long as the sleeve circumference.

Thread a darning needle with the tail you left, and folding by the row with holes to the inside of the sleeve, sew together the cast-off edge with the first rnd in Antique Rose. As you did with the body, make sure the sts you join belong to the same column.

You can also join them together as you cast off, but this way is neater. Hide the tail inside the folding.

#### SHIRT COLLAR

#### 4mm (US 6) needles

With col. A and starting with the WS facing you, pick up 64 (78) 78 (78) 78 (82) sts starting at the left front corner.

The reason why you start picking sts on with the WS facing you, is so when the collar folds, the knit fabric is on the outside of the garment, not the purl side.

Row 1 (WS of collar-RS of the garment): Purl all



Row 2 (RS of the collar-WS of the garment): Knit all

Rep these 2 rows 9 more times or until desired length.

You should end up on a purl row, so your next one is on the RS of the collar.

Break yarn and attach col. B, as you have to work the picot edge.

Rows 1 to 4 in new yarn: Work in St st.

Next row (RS): \*yo, k2tog\*. Rep from \* to \* until end of row.

Rows 6 to 8: Work in St st.

Row 9: Cast off loosely leaving a tail as long as the collar x2.

Thread a darning needle with this tail, and folding by the row with holes to the WS of the collar, sew together the cast-off edge with the first rnd in col. B. As you did with the body and sleeves, make sure the sts you join belong to the same column.

#### **BUTTON AND BUTTONHOLE BANDS**

#### 4mm (US 6) needles

With col. B, and starting on the right front at the bottom, pick up 78 (82) 88 (96) 110 (116) sts evenly along the edge. The ratio is 2 sts every 3 rows.

Rows 1 (WS) to 5 (WS): Work in St st

Row 6: \*yo, k2tog\*. Rep from \* to \* until end of row

Rows 7 to 11: Work in St st

Row 12 (RS): Cast off loosely, leaving a tail to sew together the cast-off edge and picked up sts at the edge of the front.

Repeat the same steps for the left front, picking up from top to bottom.

On the left side, place 7 (7) 7 (8) 9 (9) buttons evenly distributed along the band and sew them with a sewing needle and thread. They should have a distance between each other of 5 (5) 5.5 (5.5) 5.5 (5.8) cm / 1.9 (1.9) 2 (2) 2 (2.3)" approximately.

On the right side, mark where the buttonholes should be to align with the buttons. Poke in the spot with scissors (don't cut, just insert the closed scissors into the stitch) and open them to spread the stitch. This is a double fabric so be careful not to poke in an angle. Once you've spread the buttonhole a bit, pass the button.

You can work the blanket stitch around the buttonhole for a neater finish.

Block to measurements, and...it's ready to wear!!!



#### **CHART**

#### Written instructions- knit flat

Row 1: k1, yo, ssk, k1

Row 2: P all

Row 3: k1, k2tog, yo, k1

Row 4: P all


#### **Knit in the round (for sleeves)**

Row 1: k1, yo, ssk, k1

Row 2: K all

Row 3: k1, k2tog, yo, k1

Row 4: K all

0	Yarn over
