Bow

MATERIALS

1 skein of Friends Extra Fine Merino col. Cream (04)

Circular needles 2.5 mm and 3 mm, 40 cm/15.7 in. and 80 cm/31.5 in.

Stitch markers

Darning needle

YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Extra Fine Merino**, Hobbii

100% Wool

50 g (1.75 oz) = 165 m (180 yds)

GAUGE

10 x 10 cm / 4" x 4" = 26 rows x 34 sts

ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) – stitch(es)

M – stitch marker(s)

rnd(s) – round(s)

k – knit

tog – together

p – purl

k2tog – knit 2 sts together (right-leaning decrease)

SSK (improved) – slip 1 st purlwise, slip 1 st knitwise, return both sts to left needle, knit the 2 sts together through the back

loops (left-leaning decrease)

SIZE

Premature (0-3m) 3-6m (6-9m) 9-12m (1-2y)
2-4y

MEASUREMENTS

Head circumference: 28/32 (34/38) 40/42 (42/44) 44/46 (48/50) 50/52 cm / approx.

11/12.6 (13.4/15) 15.7/16.5 (16.5/17.3)

17.3/18.1 (18.9/19.7) 19.7/20.5 in.

PATTERN INFORMATION

The beanie is worked from the bottom up with a folded edge, which is knitted down.

The bow is worked separately in a mini or midi size and is an optional decoration for the beanie. If you leave out the bow, you have a perfect, gender-neutral beanie.

Pattern



FOLDED EDGE

Cast on 72 (80) 88 (92) 96 (104) 112 sts with circular needles 2.5 mm.

For the smallest sizes you should use the Magic Loop technique or double pointed needles, for the largest sizes you can use circular needles 40 cm/ 15.7 in. until the decreases start.

Place a M between the first and last st on the needles = beginning of rnd.

Work stockinette stitch in the round until the work measures approx. 3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) 4 cm / 1.2 (1.2) 1.2 (1.2) 1.6 (1.6) 1.6 in.

P 1 rnd.

Work stockinette stitch in the round again for another 3 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) 4 cm / 1.2 (1.2) 1.2 (1.2) 1.6 (1.6) 1.6 in.

On the next rnd, the edge is knitted down by folding it toward the wrong side and knitting 1 st from the needles tog with 1 st from the cast-on edge. Repeat until the end of the rnd.

If you prefer to sew down the folded edge at the end, you can easily do this as well.

BEANIE

Change to circular needles 3 mm.

Continue working in stockinette stitch in the round until the work measures 10 (11) 12 (12) 13 (13) 14 cm / 3.9 (4.3) 4.7 (4.7) 5.1 (5.1) 5.5 in., measured from the bottom of the beanie (the p rnd you worked for the folded edge).

On the next rnd, place 3 new M in the following way: *k 18 (20) 22 (23) 24 (26) 28 sts, place M* repeat *-* until the end of the rnd. You should now have placed 4 M with the same number of sts between them.

From here, decrease 8 sts on every other rnd in the following way:

Rnd 1: *k1, SSK, k until 2 sts before next M, k2tog, move the M to right needle* repeat *-* until the end of the rnd

Rnd 2: stockinette stitch without decreases

Repeat rnds 1 and 2 as described above until you have 16 sts left on your needles.

1 rnd of k2tog.

Pull the thread through the remaining sts, tighten and weave in the end on the inside of the beanie.

BOW (OPTIONAL DECORATION)

Mini: Cast on 20 sts on circular needles 3 mm. Work in the round until the work measures approx. 6 cm / 2.4 in.. Sew the sts in each end tog using kitchener stitch so you end up with a "flat sock".

Midi: Cast on 30 sts on circular needles 3 mm. Work in the round until the work measures approx. 8 cm / 3.1 in.. Sew the sts in each end tog using kitchener stitch so you end up with a "flat sock".

RIBBON FOR THE BOW

Cast on 6 sts on circular needles 3 mm. Work in the round with 3 sts on each side until the work has a fitting length, remember that it should be able to reach all the way around the bow and it should be sufficiently tight for a neater result. Sew the sts in each end tog using kitchener stitch so it becomes a ring and the bow can be pulled through.

Weave in all loose ends, wash and lightly steam your work

The best way to attach the bow to the beanie is to sew the ribbon onto the folded edge first. Then pull the bow through the ribbon and sew the bow onto the beanie with "invisible" kitchener stitches.
