MATERIALS

Ribbon

1 skein of color 17 1 skein of color 16 1 skein of color 14 1 skein of color 10

Crochet hook 6 mm / US I/10 Crochet metal hook 3 mm / C/2 Stitch markers 25 cm Jumbo zipper Tapestry needle Measuring tape or ruler Needle and thread similar to Ribbon color 10

YARN QUALITY

5 Ribbon, Hobbii 100 % Cotton 250 g / 8.8 oz = 125 m / 137 yds

GAUGE

11 scts x 17 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chainsc = single crochet scts = single crochet thermal stitch sl st = slip stitch inc = increase mr = magic ring blo = back loop only

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 19 cm / 7.5" Length: 30 cm / 11.5"

Meet Jolly, a vibrant crochet duffel bag that's a burst of color and functionality! With its intermediate-level pattern, this bag is designed for both fun and practicality, perfect for your gym essentials or as a stylish everyday companion.

Jolly has a funky charm that sets it apart. Each stitch brings together a playful combination of colors, making it a standout accessory wherever you go. But what truly sets this bag apart is its oversized jumbo zipper! Not only does it add a trendy edge to the design, but it also ensures easy access and security for your items.

The pattern is made using the single crochet thermal stitch and it provides both a written description as well as a video tutorial of the stitch.

Single Crochet Thermal Stitch

To do a Single Crochet Thermal Stitch (scts), first, make your starting chain. In the first row, do regular single crochets. For the second row, single crochet in the back loop only. On the third row, single crochet in the back loop and also behind the top loops of the stitches from the previous row. Continue repeating the third row for the rest of the project. This gives your fabric a thicker texture.

MAIN PANEL

28cm x 44.5cm or 11" x 17.5"

Use 6mm hook Start with Coral color 16

Ch 31. Crochet in rows. Row 1: turn, sc 30 Row 2: ch1, turn, sc 30 blo Rows 3-40: ch 1, turn, scts 30 Change to yellow color 17 Rows 41-81: ch 1, turn, scts 30 Fasten off and weave in the ends.





CIRCULAR PANELS (make two)

19cm (7.5") diameter

Use Lilac color 14 and 6mm hook MR. Crochet in rounds. Rnd 1: sc 6 Rnd 2: inc 6 Rnd 3: (sc, inc) x 6 Rnd 4: (sc 2, inc) x 6 Rnd 5: (sc 3, inc) x 6 Rnd 6: sc 2, inc, (sc 4, inc) x 5, sc 2 Rnd 7: (inc, sc 5) x 6 Rnd 8: sc 3, inc, (sc 6, inc) x5, sc 3 Rnd 9: (inc, sc 7) x 6 Rnd 10: sc 4, inc, (sc 8, inc) x5, sc 4 sl st, fasten off and weave in the ends



STRAP

Width: 4cm (1.6") Length: 166 cm (65.3")

Use Jeans color 10 and 6 mm hook. Ch 155. Crochet in rounds. Make sure your chain is not twisted and sl st in the first ch.





Round 1: ch 1, turn, sc 155 into the back loop of every chain, sl st Rounds 2-4: ch 1, turn, sc 155, sl st Fasten off and weave in the ends.



ASSEMBLE

Now that we have made our main panel, two circular panels and strap, it is time to assemble our bag. We will need: stitch markers, a tapestry needle and scissors.

Start with one of your circular panels and choose 7 stitches. Place one stitch marker (blue) on the first, skip 5 stitches and place another stitch marker (orange) in the seventh stitch. We are not going to work on the 5 stitches that have been left free in the middle.





Now we'll add the third stitch marker (green) on the opposite side of your circle. Count 27 stitches from both sides and mark the middle stitch. Adjust and make sure your third stitch marker is centred.



Align the first two stitch markers (blue and orange) with the two corners of the main panel. Now do the same with the third stitch marker (green), but align it between row 40-41 of the main panel (where we changed the color from coral to yellow).



Now that our circular panel is in place, it is time to sew the two pieces together. Cut a long piece of lilac yarn. We will use this and a tapestry needle to attach our panels.

Attach the yarn where we placed the first stitch marker (blue) and make a knot to secure it.



With your tapestry needle, insert the thread in the back loop of the first stitch of your circular panel and pull it through.

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




Now insert the needle in two loops of the main panel and pull.



Now repeat these steps all around until you get to the second stitch marker (orange). The green stitch marker will keep both panels in place, but be sure to adjust your stitches so that the seam is even.





Repeat the same process for the other side.



ZIPPER

In the space that has been left free in our bag we will add our jumbo zipper. To do this, we must first evenly mark 10 dots on both sides of our zipper:



You will need a ruler to measure. Starting from the middle of one of the tape ends measure 2.7 cm and mark your first dot. Keep marking dots in the middle of the tape every 2.7 cm until you have 10 dots. Repeat on the other side.

Now let's attach the zipper to the bag. You'll need a metal 3 mm hook. It is important that your hook is made of metal so that it does not break under tension. To better understand the process, I recommend watching this tutorial: <u>https://www.instagram.com/p/CvmvGgLRYGP/</u>

Insert your hook in the first stitch and pull up a loop. Now insert the hook from behind the zipper at the first dot we marked. You can cut a small hole with your scissors if you feel the space is too tight. Find your yarn and pull up a loop, once you have two loops on your hook finish the sc.





We will make two more sc stitches going through the same hole of the zipper: insert the hook in the next stitch of the main panel and repeat the process going through the same dot as before.



Move to the next dot and repeat the process. Make three sc stitches in the next 3 stitches of your main panel going through the second dot of the zipper.





You have 30 stitches on your panel and 10 dots on one side of your zipper, so 3 stitches going through a hole in the zipper will give you the correct result.

When you get to the side change to your lilac color yarn and sc 5 in the circular panel.




Change yo yellow color yarn and repeat the same process on the other side.

ATTACH THE STRAP

Leave about 30 stitches free for each handle and sew with your thread and needle in the points marked with a white cross (see image). To make sure your strap is well centred, leave about 7 stitches free in the centre of the panel.
