## Shawl

## MATERIALS

4 skeins of Soft Alpaca Lace, col. 36
7 skeins of Friends Kid Silk, col. 63

Please note: You will be working with two strands of yarn held together, i.e. with both yarns at the same time.

Circular needles 4.0 mm / US 6 (length approx. 100-120 cm / 40-47 in.)
Cable needle 4.0 mm / US 6
7 stitch markers (for marking the pattern repeat)
Darning needle for weaving in ends

## YARN QUALITY

(a0) Soft Alpaca Lace, Hobbii
100\% Alpaca
$50 \mathrm{~g}(1.75 \mathrm{oz})=400 \mathrm{~m}(437 \mathrm{yds})$
(a0) Friends Kid Silk, Hobbii
72\% Mohair, 25\% Silk, 3\% Wool
$25 \mathrm{~g}(0.9 \mathrm{oz})=200 \mathrm{~m}(218 \mathrm{yds})$

Please note: You will be working with two strands of yarn held together, i.e. with both yarns at the same time.

## GAUGE

20.5 sts and 29 rows $=10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm} / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$ in the given pattern (see the chart), worked with both yarns held together on needles 4.0 mm / US 6 (measured after the work has been washed and blocked).

## SIZE

One size

## MEASUREMENTS

Width: approx. $70 \mathrm{~cm} / 27.5 \mathrm{in}$.
Length: approx. 200 cm / 78.75 in.

## PATTERN INFORMATION

The beautiful Vronerl shawl is inspired by the Bavarian national costume. It is not only a suitable match for the dirndl during Oktoberfest, but it also complements your everyday outfit in a very special way.

This versatile shawl not only acts as a visual eye-catcher, but also as a warming companion on chilly evenings. Whether draped elegantly over your shoulders or wrapped around your neck, it can be worn in a variety of ways.

## ABBREVIATIONS

Elastic bind-off = k1 [k1, slip both sts back onto left needle purlwise and knit them together through the back loops], repeat the instructions between [...], until 1 st remains on the needle. Cut the yarn and pull it through the last st.
cn = cable needle
$\mathrm{k}=$ knit
$k$-wise $=$ knitwise
p = purl
p-wise $=$ purlwise
psso = pass the slipped st(s) over
sl1 = slip 1 st
sl2 = slip 2 sts
sm = stitch marker(s)
st(s) = stitch(es)
tog = together
wyif = with yarn in front
yo = yarn over

## INFO AND TIPS

- The stitch markers are used to mark and provide better orientation in the pattern repeat and are slipped each time from the left needle to the right one.
- $\quad$ The yarns are worked held together, i.e. with two threads at the same time.
- All instructions in brackets [...] are always repeated.
- If the shawl is worked longer or possibly wider than indicated in the pattern, more yarn will also be needed. Take this into account when buying the yarn.

Loosely cast on 144 sts.

## Set-up rows:

Row 1: Sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, $k$ all sts until 5 sts remain, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 2: $\quad$ SI1 $p$-wise (wyif), $k 4, p$ all sts until 5 sts remain, $k 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), $k 1$.

Work the pattern according to the chart, working the pattern repeat in red a total of 6 times and ending with the row indicated in the chart. For a better overview and orientation, a sm can be placed between the repeats (before or after the red marking) as the start/end of the repeat.

Work rows 1-32 a total of $1 x$.
Then work rows 3-32 a total of 18x.

Finishing rows:

Row 1: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, $k$ all sts until 5 sts remain, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 2: $\quad$ Sl1 $p$-wise (wyif), $k 4, p$ all sts until 5 sts remain, $k 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.

Loosely bind off all sts.
Alternatively, you may also choose to use an elastic bind-off.

## FINISHING DETAILS

Weave in all ends.
Wash the finished shawl and stretch it out. You do this by laying it on blocking mats, alternatively on towels, pulling it into shape and fixing it with pins. This way, the openwork pattern shows itself at its most beautiful.

Cons

Purl st
Slip 1 st purlwise, k1, pass the slipped st over
Knit 2 sts together
Slip 2 sts knitwise, k 1 , pass the slipped sts over
Yarn over
Place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $k 4$, then $k$ the sts from the cn

Slip 1 st purlwise with the yarn in front
Work the pattern repeat marked in red a total of 6 times

## Pattern (row by row)

Row 1: Sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, s11 p-wise, k1, psso,yo, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 2 and all
even rows:
Sl1 p-wise (wyif), k4, [p8, k1, p11, k1] 6x, p8, k3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 3: Sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k2, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 5: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 7: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, k4, then $k$ the sts from the cn, [p1, k2tog, yo, k7, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, p1, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $k 4$, then $k$ the sts from the cn$] 6 \mathrm{x}, \mathrm{p} 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 9: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k1, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k5, k2tog, yo, k1, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 11: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k2, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k3, k2tog, yo, k2, p1, 8 r$] 6 \mathrm{x}, \mathrm{p} 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 13: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, k4, then $k$ the sts from the cn, [p1, k3, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, k2tog, yo, k3, p1, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $4 r$, then $k$ the sts from the $c n] 6 x, p 3, s l 1$ p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 15: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1,1 r, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, yo, sl2 k-wise, k1, psso, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 17: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k2, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k3, k2tog, yo, k2, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 19: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $k 4$, then $k$ the sts from the cn, [p1, k3, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, k2tog, yo, k3, p1, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $4 r$, then $k$ the sts from the $c n] 6 x, p 3, s l 1$ p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 21: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k3, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k3, p1, 8 r$] 6 \mathrm{x}, \mathrm{p} 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 23: Sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k3, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k3, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 25: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $4 r$, then $k$ the sts from the cn, [p1, k2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k2, p1, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $k 4$, then $k$ the sts from the $c n] 6 x, p 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 27: Sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k1, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 29: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, k8, [p1, k2tog, yo, k1, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k1, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, p1, 8 r] 6x, p3, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
Row 31: SI1 p-wise (wyif), k1, p3, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $4 r$, then $k$ the sts from the cn, [p1, k2, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, sl1 p-wise, k1, psso, k2, p1, place 4 sts on a cn in front of the work, $k 4$, then $k$ the sts from the $c n] 6 x, p 3$, sl1 p-wise (wyif), k1.
