## MATERIALS

### Soft Alpaca

6 (11) 19 skeins of color 06 (Colour 1)  
1 (1) 1 skein of color 40 (Colour 2)  
1 (1) 1 skein of color 43 (Colour 3)  
1 (1) 1 skein of color 45 (Colour 4)

Crochet hook 4 mm / US G/6  
Crochet hook 5 mm / US H/8  
Tape Measure  
Stitch Markers  
Scissors

## YARN QUALITY

 **Soft Alpaca**, Hobbii

100% Alpaca  
50 g (1.75 oz) = 165 m (180 yds)

## GAUGE

27 sts x 30 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

## ABBREVIATIONS

Ch(s): Chain(s)  
St(s): Stitch(s)  
Sc: Single Crochet  
Dc: Double Crochet  
Ch sp: Chain Space

## SIZE

1 (2) 3

## MEASUREMENTS

Top Width: 130 (200) 277 cm / 51" (79") 109"  
Bottom Width: 38 (38) 51 cm / 15" (15") 20"  
Length: 53 (79) 124 cm / 21" (31") 49"  
Side Length: 69 (109) 161 cm / 27" (43") 63.5"

## PATTERN INFORMATION

The wingman is a wrap, it's a blanket, a jacket replacement, an extra layer and whatever else you need it to be. Large enough to feel safe in, small enough to fit in a tote and you'll only have to share this friend if you want to.

The wingman wrap is a crochet project worked with a 5mm crochet hook, in one piece from the bottom upwards to form a trapeze shape. It is crocheted in moss stitches, which is easy, meditative and produces a knit-like texture. The wrap is designed supersized, but there are 2 smaller sizes to choose from.

# Pattern



## INFO AND TIPS

*Read this before you begin*

- This pattern uses US crochet terminology.
- It is highly recommended that you read the whole pattern before starting to get familiar with the various elements.
- Be sure to make (and block) a gauge swatch before starting, even when you are using the exact yarn that this pattern calls for.
- The Pattern is written with some of the words in Abbreviation. Use the abbreviation section for clarity.
- The yarn for this project can easily be substituted with any of your favourite Hobbii yarns, as the length in which the project needs to reach using each colour is given throughout the pattern.

## BODY

Row 1: (starting with 4mm hook and color 1) Ch 92 (92) 116, sc into the 2nd ch from the hook, sc into the remaining 90 (90), 114 chs.

Row 2: Ch1, 2 sc into the first sc, {ch1, skip the next sc, sc into the next sc}\*45 (45) 57, ch1, skip the next sc, 2sc into the last sc. Turn.

*Switch to 5mm hook.*

Row 3: Ch1 (does not count as a stitch), 2sc into the first sc, {ch1, skip the next sc, sc into the next ch1 sp}\*45 (45) 57, ch1, skip the next sc, 2sc into the last sc. Turn.

Row 4: Ch1, 2sc into the first sc, {ch1, skip the next sc, sc into the next ch1 sp}\*46 (46) 58, ch1, skip the next sc, 2sc into the last sc. Turn.

Row 5: Ch1, 2sc into the first sc, {ch1, skip the next sc, sc into the next ch1 sp}\*47 (47) 59, ch1, skip the next sc, 2sc into the last sc. Turn.

Row 6: Ch1, 2sc into the first sc, {ch1, skip the next sc, sc into the next ch1 sp}\*48 (48) 60, ch1, skip the next sc, 2sc into the last sc. Turn.

*Continue in the established pattern for 9 (9) 12 more rows or until the project measures 6 (6) 7 cm or 2.4" (2.4"), 2.7"*

*Colour changes will begin here...*

Row 16 (16) 19 - 17 (17) 20: use colour 2

Row 18 (18) 21 - 19 (19) 22: use colour 1

Row 20 (20) 23 - 21 (21) 24: use colour 3

Row 22 (22) 25 - 23 (23) 26: use colour 1

Row 24 (24) 27 - 25 (25) 28: use colour 4

*Switch back to colour 1 and continue in the established fashion until row 94 (165) 250 or until the project reaches 48 (67) 99 cm or 19" (26.5") 39"*

Row 95 (166) 251: with colour 2, continue the established pattern for 5 (6) 8 rows

Row 100 (172) 259: with colour 1, continue the established pattern for 3 (3) 4 rows

Row 103 (175) 263: with colour 3, continue the established pattern for 5 (6) 8 rows

Row 108 (181) 271: with colour 1, continue the established pattern for 3 (3) 4 rows

Row 111 (184) 275: with colour 4, continue the established pattern for 5 (6) 8 rows

Row 116 (190) 283: with colour 1, continue the established pattern for 6 (8) 9 rows

## **FINISHING**

*Switch to 4mm hook, Use a loose tension for this section*

Row 1: Reattach yarn into one of the top corner of the shawl, sc along the sides towards the bottom, at the corner, work 3 sc into the stitch and insert a stitch marker in the middle one, continue to sc along the bottom, at the other corner, work 3 sc into the stitch and insert a stitch marker in the middle one, sc along the sides towards the top edge, sl st into the first sc to join. Turn.

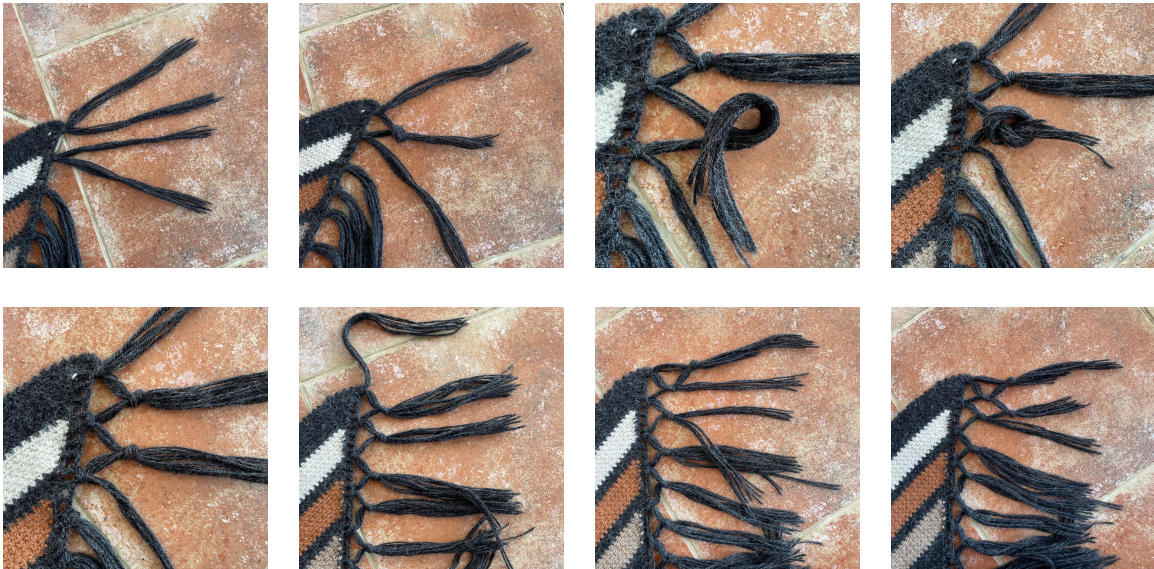
Row 2: Ch4 (counts as dc+1 ch), skip the next sc, dc into the next sc, {ch1, skip the next sc, dc into the next sc}\*repeat until stitch marker, work {(dc, ch1)\*2, dc} into the stitch with the marker, {ch1, skip the next sc, dc into the next sc}\*repeat until stitch marker, work {(dc, ch1)\*2, dc} into the stitch with the marker, {ch1, skip the next sc, dc into the next sc}\*repeat as needed, dc into the last stitch.

Row 3: (Without fastening off, make a row of picot sc along the top of the project) Ch1, 2sc around the last 2 dc of the previous row, ch3, sl st to the top of the last created sc, 2sc into the next 2 sc, ch3, sl st to the top of the last crested sc, {sc into the next ch sp, sc into the next sc, ch3, sl st into the top of the sc

*Fasten Off.*

## ADDING TASSELS

- Cut out strings of 46 cm or 18" long
- Starting at one corner, Take 8 strings at a time and pass them through the spaces made along the outer edges, and tie a knot (ensure that the ends are even before tying the knot). Skip 2 or 3 spaces before adding the next tassel. Repeat this step all around the project.
- Starting at the top corner, divide two tassels into two equal halves, take one half from each tassel and tie a knot to join. Take the remaining half of one tassel and join it with a knot to a half from another tassel. Repeat this all around the project.
- Repeat the previous row for one more round.
- Trim the tassels to even them out.
- Steam block the entire project.
