MATERIALS

Mohair Delight 2 (3) 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 skeins of color 15 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 skein of color 12

Circular needles 5 mm (US 8) Circular needles 6 mm (US 10) Crochet hook 3 mm (US D) Darning needle

Optional: pom-pom maker 3 cm / 1.2"

YARN QUALITY

Mohair Delight, Hobbii
 50% Mohair, 50% Acrylic
 50 g (1.75 oz) = 150 m (164 yds)

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 18 sts x 24 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit p = Purl CO = cast on BO = bind off inc = increase by knitting into the front and back of the stitch **SIZE** 3 yrs (4 yrs) 5 yrs (6 yrs) 8 yrs (10 yrs) 12 yrs

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 33 (36) 38 (40) 42 (45) 48 cm / 12.9 (14.1) 14.9 (15.7) 16.5 (17.7) 18.8" Length: 34 (36) 38 (40) 43 (45) 47 cm / 13.3 (14.1) 14.9 (15.7) 16.9 (17.7) 18.5"

PATTERN INFORMATION

Amelie is a simple, soft sweater with a decorative Pierrot-style collar and pom-poms. Perfect for a special day as well as for everyday craziness. The sweater is worked straight, consists of separate parts sewn together at the end, and of a large collar worked directly on the sewn panels.

INFO AND TIPS

The sweater consists of front, back and sleeves sewn together at the end.

BODY

FRONT PIECE

With 5 mm needles and col. 12 CO 60 (64) 68 (72) 76 (80) 86 sts.

Work 8 (8) 10 (10) 10 (12) 12 rows in rib stitch (k 2, p 2).

Change to 6 mm needles and to col. 15, and start to work in stockinette stitch.

Work 64 (66) 68 (74) 80 (84) 88 rows.

In the next row BO 10 (12) 14 (14) 16 (16) 16 middle sts for the neckline. Then, from the neckline side, in every second row BO on both sides 3 sts, 2 sts, 1 st (all sizes).

Work the sts on each shoulder to the 82nd (86th) 90th (96th) 103rd (108th) 113th row.

BACK PIECE

Work it just like the front piece, but BO sts for the neckline in the 67^{th} (69^{th}) 71^{st} (77^{th}) 83^{rd} (87^{th}) 91^{st} row.

SLEEVES

With 5 mm needles and col. 12, CO 38 (38) 40 (40) 44 (44) 46 sts. Work 8 (8) 10 (10) 10 12 (12) rows in rib stitch (k 2, p 2).

Change to 6 mm needles and to col. 15, and start to work in stockinette stitch.
In the 5th row of stockinette stitch, inc 1 st on both sides of the sleeve.
Continue to increase 1 st on both sides of the sleeve in every 6th row.
BO the sts when the sleeve will have 58 (60) 60 (72) 72 (84) 84 rows with the rib.



COLLAR

Sew the sweater together at the shoulders.

With circular needles 5 mm and col. 15, pick up 52 (64) 68 (68) 68 (72) 72 sts around the head opening.

Note: Start and finish to pick up sts at the center of the head opening, on the front of the sweater **on its wrong side**.

Work 4 rounds in stockinette stitch.

In the next row start to work back and forth to create a slit in the middle of the collar. Always work the first 2 and the last 2 sts as k sts. Work 3 rows.

To make the collar wider, you have to increase (by knitting into the front and back of the stitch) on every right side row. **Always increase in the same sts**.

Size 3 yrs inc in: 11th, 17th, 23rd, 29th, 35th, 41st st from the beginning of the row; Size 4 yrs inc in: 9th, 18th, 27th, 37th, 46th, 55th st from the beginning of the row; Size 5, 6, 8 yrs inc in: 11th, 20th, 29th, 39th, 48th, 57th st from the beginning of the row; Size 10, 12 yrs inc in: 11th, 21th, 31st, 41st, 51st, 61st st from the beginning of the row.

Work 6 (6) 8 (8) 10 (10) 12 rows. Change to col. 12 and work another 2 (2) 4 (4) 4 (6) 6 rows. BO all sts.

FINISHING

Make 2 pom-poms (approx. 3 cm / 1.2"), one in col. 12 and one in col. 15. With a crochet hook and col. 15, make 2 chains for about 25 (25) 30 (30) 30 (34) 34 cm / 9.8 (9.8) 9.8 (11.8) 11.8 (11.8) 13.3 (13.3) ".

Join the chains with the pom-poms and in the collar slit. Sew the remaining parts of the sweater.
