

CROCHET PATTERN

Chicago Bobble Cardigan

Design: Jonah's Hands | Hobbii Design



MATERIALS

A: 6 (7, 9, 10, 11) skeins of Udon color 2 **B**: 3 (3, 4, 4, 5) skeins of Udon color 13

Crochet hook 12 mm / US P Crochet hook 9 mm / US M Tapestry needle

YARN QUALITY

Udon, Hobbii 80% acrylic, 20% wool 200 g / 7.1 oz = 100 m / 104 yds

GAUGE

6 sts and 3 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4 x 4" in extended hdc with larger hook

ABBREVIATIONS

blo = back loop only
ch = chain
ehdc = extended half-double crochet
RS = right side
sc = single crochet
sk = skip
sl st = slip stitch
st(s) = stitch(es)
yo = yarn over hook
WS = wrong side
Rep = repeat
wh st = whip stitch

SIZE

XS-S (M, L-XL, 2-3XL, 4-5XL)

MEASUREMENTS

Chest (laid flat): 56.5 (63.5, 76.5, 90, 103) cm

/ 22.25 (25, 30, 35.5, 40.5)"

Length from shoulder: 54 (57.5, 61, 61, 64)

cm / 21.25 (22.5, 24, 24, 25)"

Sleeve circumference: 48.5 (48.5, 54.5, 54.5,

61) cm / 19 (19, 21.5, 21.5, 24)"

Armhole depth: 24 (25.5, 28, 30.5, 30.5) cm /

9.5 (10, 11, 12, 12)"

Cuff circumference: 23 (23, 26, 26, 29.5) cm

/ 9 (9, 10.25, 10.25, 11.5)"

Collar: 10 cm / 4"

The trendy Chicago Bobble Cardigan is named after being debuted by Jonah at a textile convention in Chicago. It features eye-catching bobbles, transitional drop sleeves, and balloon cuffs. Choose two of Hobbii's luscious, thick Udon yarn and stitch together this amazing statement piece.

The cardigan has an oversized fit. If you want a less oversized fit, you can size down.

In the photos, Jonah is wearing a size M.

INFO AND TIPS 4-st bobble

Change to colour B for last yo of previous sc (image 1). *Yarn over and, draw up a st (image 2), yo and draw through 2 loops (image 3); repeat from * 3 more times.

There will be 5 loops on the hook (image 4). Yarn over and draw through 5 loops (image 5). To complete the bobble, ch1 (image 6).















Extended Half-Double Crochet (ehdc)

Yo, insert hook and draw up a loop (image 1), yo and draw through 1 loop (image 2), yo and draw through 3 loops (image 3).







Yo SI St

Yo, insert hook and draw up a loop, draw this loop through 2 loops on hook.

Construction Notes

Cardigan is worked flat in two pieces, each beginning at the center back, with additional chain stitches to create the fronts. These two pieces are slightly asymmetrical due to the large gauge. After joining the side seam, the sleeve is worked in rows from the armhole down to the cuff. The contrasting collar begins with a row of single crochet around the front opening and is finished with a perpendicular edging of single crochet through the back loop.

Due to the way the yarn is spun, it has a tendency to twist while you crochet with it. This can potentially affect the tension in the fabric.

LEFT SIDE

Using 12mm hook and yarn A, ch 35 (37, 39, 39, 41) sts.

Row 1 (WS): Work ehdc into 3rd ch from hook (work in the back/middle loop of the chain) place a stitch marker in the first st, work ehdc into each ch to end, ch 34 (36, 38, 38, 40) sts. 65 (69, 73, 73, 77) sts

Row 2 (RS): Work ehdc into 3rd ch from hook, work ehdc into each st to end.

Row 3: Ch2 (does not count as a st), work ehdc into same st, work ehdc into each st to end. Rep Row 3 a further 5 (6, 8, 10, 12) times. Fasten off. 8 (9, 11, 13, 15) rows worked.

Fold piece in half with the shortest row at the back. Join side seam with wh st for 19 (21, 21, 21, 21, 21) sts, leaving remaining sts open for sleeve.

RIGHT SIDE

Using 12mm hook and yarn A.

Row 1 (RS): Attach the yarn to the first st in the beginning chain (where you placed the stitch marker), ch2, work ehdc into each st to end.

Row 2 (WS): Ch2, work ehdc into same st, work ehdc into each st to end.

Row 3 (RS): Ch2, work ehdc into same st, work ehdc into each st to end but don't pull the yarn through the three loops in the last st (use a stitch marker to keep the yarn in place). Take a new skein, ch 34 (36, 38, 38, 40), attach the chain by inserting the hook at the bottom of the last st and pulling the last loop from the chain through from the WS to the RS, pick up



the three loops from the last ehdc, yo and pull through all 4 loops (cut the yarn on the skein you dropped and fasten off), continue with ehdc in the new chain until the end. You should now have 65 (69, 73, 73, 77) sts.

Row 4: Ch2 (does not count as a st), work ehdc into same st, work ehdc into each st to end.

Rep Row 4 a further 5 (6, 8, 10, 12) times. Fasten off. 9 (10, 12, 14, 16) rows worked. Join side seam with wh st for 19 (21, 21, 21, 21) sts, leaving remaining sts open for sleeve.

Left Sleeve

Join yarn A at underarm with WS (RS, RS, RS, RS) facing, work ehdc into 27 (27, 31, 31, 35) sts around armhole, work another ehdc into last st, join with sl st in first st, turn. 28 (28, 32, 32, 36) sts

Work 2 (2, 0, 0, 0) more rows ehdc, joining round with sl st and turning at the end of each row. 3 (3, 1, 1, 1) rows worked.

Alternating Bobbles

Note: Crochet over the yarn strand not in use as you work the bobble rows. Draw up yarn B loosely between bobble rows.

Bobble Row 1 (RS): Ch1, sc in next st changing to yarn B, (work 4-st bobble with yarn B, change to yarn A, sc in each of next 3 sts changing to colour B on last st) 6 (6, 7, 7, 7) times, work 4-st bobble, sc in each of next 2 sts, join with sl st in beg ch, turn.

Row 2 (WS): Ch1, work ehdc into same st, work ehdc into each st to end, join with sl st in beg ch, turn.


Bobble Row 3: Ch1, sc into same st and next 2 sts changing to yarn B on last st, (work 4-st bobble with yarn B, change to yarn A, sc in each of next 3 sts changing to colour B on last st) 6 (6, 7, 7, 7) times, work 4-st bobble, join with sl st in beg ch, turn.

Row 4: Rep Row 2.

Repeat Rows 1-4 a further 3 times. 8 bobble rows worked. Fasten off yarn A.







Cuff

Change to yarn B

Row 1 Using 12 mm hook, work 2 slip sts together to the end. Change to 9 mm hook, with WS facing ch 9

Row 2 (WS): Sc into 2nd ch from hook, sc to last st, sc into the next 2 sleeve sts (these 2 sc to the sleeve are skipped on Row 3), turn

Row 3 (RS): Ch1, yo sl st blo to end



Row 4 (WS): Ch1, sc blo to end, sc into next 2 sleeve sts (*these 2 sc to the sleeve are skipped on the next row*)

Rep Rows 3-4 until all sts have been worked. Fasten off. Seam cuff. Rep Sleeve as for Left Side.







Collar

Join Left and Right Sides at center back with whip stitch.

Using 12mm hook and yarn B, with RS facing, begin at right front hem and work sc into each st up right front, across back neck, and down left front. Turn and ch7.

Row 1 (WS): Sc blo in 2nd st from hook and next 5 ch, sl st in each of next 2 sc, turn.

Row 2 (RS): Ch1, sk 2 sl st, sc blo in each of next 6 sts, turn.

Row 3 (WS): Ch1, sc blo into same st and next 5 sts, sl st in each of next 2 sc, turn.

Rep Rows 2-3 until all body sc have been worked. Fasten off.

POCKETS (MAKE 2)

With colour A and 9mm hook, ch12.

Row 1: Work ehdc into 3rd ch from hook, work ehdc into each ch to end.

Row 2: Ch1, work ehdc into same st, work ehdc into each st to end.

Rep Row 2 a further 3 times.

Work 1 row of sc across row ends. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Place pockets and sew along sides and bottom edges.

Weave in any remaining ends, wash and block.
