MATERIALS

Amigo 1 skein of colour 40 - Yarn A 1 skein of colour 28 - Yarn B 1 skein of colour 02 - Yarn C

Straight needles 3.25 mm Sewing needle

Optional: 2 small buttons

YARN QUALITY

Amigo, Hobbii
 100 % Acrylic,
 50 g / 0.1.75 oz = 175 m / 191 yds

GAUGE

26 sts x 30 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

SIZE

One size To fit Ida doll 30cm /12" tall

PATTERN INFORMATION

This outfit is made for the Ida doll. The doll pattern is available separately: <u>https://shop.hobbii.com/ida-doll</u>

This pattern is knitted using straight knitting needles and seamed, using mattress stitch.

The Pumpkin inspired dress is knitted from the top down. The skirt section has a simple rib pattern, a garter stitch neck trim is knitted separately and sewn to the collar.

The cute pumpkin hat matches the dress and has an I-cord pumpkin stalk decoration.

The shoes and socks are knitted in one piece.

Pattern



ABBREVIATIONS

CO = Cast on k = knit p = purl kfb = knit into front and then back of the same stitch St st = k1 row, p1 row. (Makes 2 rows) Pattern indicates whether to start with a k or p row rep = repeat BO = bind off (Cast Off) C&T = Cut and thread yarn through remaining stitches. Slide stitches off needle. sl1 = slip one stitch purl wise. Slip stitch purl wise from left to right needles without making a stitch.

DRESS

Cast on 28 sts using 3.25mm needles and Yarn A

Row 1 (RS) Knit.

Row 2 K2, yo, k2tog (Makes buttonhole) K24. [28 sts]

Row 3 Knit.

Row 4 K4 *kfb, K1, rep from * three times total, kfb, K6, *kfb, K1, rep from * three times

total, kfb, K4. [36]

Row 5 K1. purl to last st, k1.

Row 6 K5, kfb, K1, kfb, K3, kfb, K1, kfb, K8, kfb, K1, kfb, K3, kfb, K1, kfb, K5. [44]

Row 7 K1. purl to last st, k1.

Row 8 K6, kfb, K1, kfb, K5, kfb, K1, kfb, K10, kfb, K1, kfb, K5, kfb, K1, kfb, K6. [52]

Row 9 K1. purl to last st, k1.

Row 10 K7, kfb, K1, kfb, K7, kfb, K1, kfb, K12, kfb, K1, kfb, K7, kfb, K1, kfb, K7. [60]



Row 11 K1. purl to last st, k1. Row 12 K8, kfb, K1, kfb, K9, kfb, K1, kfb, K14, kfb, K1, kfb, K9, kfb, K1, kfb, K8. [68] Row 13 K1. purl to last st, k1. Row 14 K9, kfb, K1, kfb, K11, kfb, K1, kfb, K16, kfb, K1, kfb, K11, kfb, K1, kfb, K9. [76] Row 15 K1. purl to last st, k1. Row 16 K10, kfb, K1, kfb, K13, kfb, K1, kfb, K18, kfb, K1, kfb, K13, kfb, K1, kfb, K10. [84] Row 17 K1. purl to last st, k1. Row 18 Kfb13, BO following 17sts, kfb23, BO following 17sts, kfb12. [98] Row 19 P24, p2tog, p45, p2tog, p25. [96] **Row 20** *K2, kfb, rep from * to end of row. [128] **Row 21** *P5, k2, rep from * to last 2 sts, p2. Row 22 Knit. Row 23-56 Rep rows 21 & 22, seventeen more times. **Row 57** *P5, k2, rep from * to last 2 sts, p2. Row 58 *K2tog, rep from * to end of row. [64] Row 59 Purl. Row 60 BO.

Neck trim

Cast on 1 st using 3.25mm needles and Yarn B.

Row 1 Kfb [2]

Row 2 Knit.

Row 3 K1, kfb [3]

Row 4 Knit.

Row 5 K2, kfb [4]

Row 6 Knit.

Row 7 K2, kfb, k1. [5]

Row 8 BO4 [1]

Slide remaining st from right to left needle without turning the work.

Rows 9- 56 rep rows 1-8 six more times. (Gives 7 leaves)

Row 57 BO last st.

Hat

Cast on 50 st using 3.25mm needles and Yarn A.



Row 1 Knit.
Row 2 Purl.
Row 3 *Kfb, rep from * to end of row [100]
Row 4 *P5, k2, rep from * to last 2 sts, p2.
Row 5 Knit.
Row 6- 25 Rep rows 4 & 5, ten more times.
Row 26 *P5, k2, rep from * to last 2 sts, p2.
Row 27 *K1, k2tog, rep from * to last st, k1. [67]
Row 28 Purl.
Row 29 *K2tog, rep from * to end last st, k1. [34]
Row 30 Purl.
Row 31 *K2tog, rep from * to end of row. [17]
Row 32 BO.

Hat Stalk

Cast on 3 sts using 3.25mm needles and Yarn B. **Row 1** K, slip sts back from right to left needle without turning the work. **Row 2-10** K with yarn across the back of the work. This will create a tube of knitting. Alternatively use double pointed needles and I-cord 10 rows.

Row 11 C&T. Weave yarn end into hat stalk.

SHOES AND SOCKS

Make 2

Cast on 20 sts using 3.25mm needles and Yarn C. **Rows 1&2 (RS)*** K1, P1, rep from* to end of row. **Rows 3 to 6** Beg with a k row work St st for 4 rows. **Row 7** K9, kfb twice, K9. [22 sts] **Row 8** Purl. **Row 9** K9, kfb, K2, kfb, K9. [24 sts] **Row 10** Purl. Change to Yarn B. **Rows 11&12** Knit 2 rows.



Row 13 K8, kfb eight times, K8. [32 sts]
Rows 14 to 21 Beg with a P row, work in St st for 8 rows.
Rows 22 to 24 Knit 3 rows.
Row 25 k2tog, *K1, k2tog rep from* to end of row. [21 sts]
Row 26 Knit.
Row 27 *k2tog, rep from *to last st, K1. [11 sts]
Row 28 Cast Off.

MAKING UP INSTRUCTIONS

All seams are mattress stitch with wrong sides together.

Dress



Pin and sew the leaf trim to the neck.

Sew the back seam from hem to the start of the bodice. Use the buttonhole to guide for sewing on the button.





Before gathering the C&T row, place the hat stalk in the opening. Gather the C&T yarn around the hat stalk and sew into place to secure it. Sew the hat seam.

Socks and shoes



Fold the knitting with wrong sides together and row ends matching. Mattress stitch the BO edge of the shoe and row ends at the back of the shoe and the sock together. Weave in yarn ends.Use the illustration to guide you for sewing on the shoe straps. Sew one end to each side of the shoe, add a small button on the outside edge of each shoe.
