# pompom x 🗥 hobbii

#### **MATERIALS**

Hobbii x Pom Pom Garland Yarn A: Hilma; 2 balls Yarn B: Sylvie; 2 balls

4.5mm / US 7 knitting needles Always use a needle/hook size that will result in the correct gauge after blocking.

Tapestry needle

## YARN QUALITY

Garland, Hobbii x Pom Pom
Worsted weight
70% Cotton, 30% Alpaca
105m / 114yd per 50 g

## GAUGE

18 sts & 32 rows = 10cm / 4" over garter stitch on 4.5mm needles before blocking. Exact gauge is not critical for this project but will affect drape and yarn usage.

### SIZE

One size

# **MEASUREMENTS** 135cm / 53" long x 23cm / 9" wide

# PATTERN INFORMATION

Undulate is worked end to end, each fan section shaped with short rows. It is completely reversible with no actual right or wrong side. In the pattern instructions, each wedge ends with a RS row, then the first row of the next wedge becomes the new RS.

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

K: knit Rep: repeat RS: right side SI: slip St/s: stitch/es WS: wrong side Wyib: with yarn in back Wyif: with yarn in front

### **STITCH GLOSSARY**

#### **German Short Rows**

**Create Double Stitch (DS):** Bring yarn to front, slip the first stitch as if to purl, bring yarn over the needle to the back of your work and pull tight (it will look like a double stitch = DS) **Resolving Double Stitches:** When you encounter the DS on subsequent rows, work DS in pattern, inserting needle through both legs of the DS and treating it as one stitch.

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#### PATTERN BEGINS

#### First Wedge

Using Yarn A and the long-tail method, cast on 18 sts. **Row 1 (RS):** SI1 wyif, k to last st, sI1 wyib. **\*\*Row 2 (WS):** SI1 wyif, k to end. **Row 3:** SI1 wyif, k to last st, turn. **Row 4:** Create DS, k to end. **Row 5:** SI1 wyif, k to DS, turn. Rep Rows 4-5 a further 14 times, then rep Row 4 **only** once more.\*\*\* **Next row:** SI1 wyif, k to last st resolving all DS, sI1 wyib.\*\*

Work from \*\* to \*\* a further 2 times, then from \*\* to \*\*\*. **Next row:** SI1 wyif, k to end resolving all DS. Cut yarn A.

#### Second Wedge

Note: The first row of each wedge becomes the new RS.Change to Yarn B.Row 1 (RS): K to last st, sl1 wyib. End stitch remains in previous color.

Work from \*\* to \*\* above 3 times, then from \*\* to \*\*\*. **Next row:** SI1 wyif, k to end resolving all DS. Cut Yarn B.

Rep instructions for Second Wedge a further 12 times, alternating between Yarn A and Yarn B.

Cast off all sts.

#### FINISHING


At color changes, feed one tail through slipped edges and cinch in a circle. Secure both tails and weave in along ditches next to short row ridges of same color as tail. Block to measurements.
