MATERIALS

Friends Ribbon

1 skein of color 01 2 skeins of color 45 2 skeins of color 67 3 skeins of color 40 3 skeins of color 44 5 skeins of color 05

Crochet hook 12 mm / US P-15 Scissors Darning needle

YARN QUALITY

Friends Ribbon, Hobbii
100 % cotton
250 g / 8.8 oz = 125 m / 136 yds

GAUGE

2 rows granny square = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" See "info and tips" section

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain mc = magic circle sc = single crochet dc = double crochet slst = slip stitch gr = a group of 3 dc SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 120 cm / 47.25" Length: 150 cm / 59.0"

PATTERN INFORMATION

The use of Granny Squares gives it a retro and very unique look. It is easy to customise, you can add squares or make fewer however you'd like.

The pattern is beginner-friendly. You should know how to make a Granny Square. The pattern comes with a good amount of pictures to make it more visual.

INFO AND TIPS



Gauge: 2 rows granny square = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

Everybody has their own preference on how to make a Granny Square. You can ch 1-3 in the corners and/or ch1 in between every non-corner gr. I think it is important to learn and use your favourite way to make the squares so you feel most comfortable and like the result. Alternatively to the magic circle when you start the square you can ch 4 and slst into the first ch to form a circle.

If you want to make your squares different check out the Granny Square patterns on Hobbii. You can for example also use the Daisy or Sunflower Squares if you like the look more than the classic squares.

Feel free to make the squares how you like and are most happy with.

I like to weave in my ends after every row, otherwise you will be overwhelmed at the end. Leave the end tails long enough so you can weave them in properly.



Squares (make 20)















Row 1: mc, ch3, 2 dc, *ch2, 3 dc* Repeat *-* until you have 4 gr, ch2, slst in first dc of the row


Row 2-6: attach yarn in one corner, ch3, dc, ch2, 3 dc in first corner, work in every corner 2 gr and in every non-corner 1 gr, slst in first dc of the row

Join the squares

Lay the squares down 4x5 facing work side up so you see the "v's" on the last row.







Start on all shown arrows above like this:



Sc in back loops (the one of the bottom and the one on top which are closest to each other) like shown above. Alternatively you can sew the squares together but your rug will turn out smaller.





Framing

Work on the wrong side. Insert hook in one corner, pull through your sixth color yarn Work the Granny Stitch like working a huge Granny rectangle. The former corners work as shown below:



Row 2: switch to your second color, continue with the Granny Stitch for the whole row, slst into first dc of the row

Row 3: switch to your forth color, sc in every stitch and make 3 sc in every corner, at the end slst into first sc of the row, pull the yarn through and cut





Weave in all your ends and you're done :)
