# **Meadow Sunset**

#### MATERIALS

10 (10) 12 (12) 14 (14) skeins of **Soft Alpaca**, color Light Brown Natural (42) 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 (2) skeins of **Soft Alpaca**, color Champagne (45)

The cardigan is worked with 2 strands of the same color held together.

Circular needle 4 mm (US 6) and 4.5 mm (US 7) – 40 cm (16") and 80-100 cm (32-39"). 5 (5) 5 (5) 6 (6) buttons, oblong wooden buttons 30 mm (1.2") Stitch markers

#### YARN QUALITY

Soft Alpaca, Hobbii
 100 % Alpaca
 50 g (1.75 oz) = 165 m (180 yds)

#### GAUGE

18 sts x 28 rows = 10 x 10 cm (4 x 4") in stockinette stitch

#### MEASUREMENTS

Length: 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 (64) cm / 21.3 (22.0) 22.8 (23.6) 24.4 (25.2)" Width: 53 (55.5) 57.5 (60) 64 (68.5) cm / 20.9 (21.9) 22.6 (23.6) 25.2 (27.0)"

#### **ABOUT THE PATTERN**

The Meadow Sunset Cardigan is worked top down in stockinette stitch with a textured pattern in the middle. The top part of the back piece is worked in the flat until the bottom of the armholes. From there, stitches are picked up along the shoulders, and stitches are increased for the neckline. The front pieces are worked separately until the bottom of the armholes. Front pieces and back piece are joined, and the body is worked. Stitches are picked up in the armholes, and the sleeves are worked in the round on a circular needle. Finally, the neckline ribbing and front ribbings are worked.

#### **SIZE GUIDE**

The measurements stated in the pattern only apply if you get the right gauge. The Meadow Sunset Cardigan has a positive ease of 13-20 cm / 5.1-7.9". The sizes S (M) L (XL) 2XL (3XL) correspond to a chest measurement of approx 85-90 (90-95) 95-100 (100-110) 110-120 (120-130) cm / 33.5-35.4 (35.4-37.4) 37.4-39.4 (39.4-43.3) 43.3-47.2 (47.2-51.2)".

#### TIPS FOR INCREASING ON THE RIGHT SIDE

#### A left-leaning increased stitch after the marker (M1L):

Using the left needle, pick up the bar between the 2 stitches from the front and knit it through the back loop.

#### A right-leaning increased stitch before the marker (M1R):

Using the left needle, pick up the bar between the 2 stitches from behind and knit it.

#### TIPS FOR INCREASING ON THE WRONG SIDE

#### A left-leaning increased stitch after the marker (M1L):

Using the left needle, pick up the bar between the 2 stitches from the back and purl it.

#### A right-leaning increased stitch before the marker (M1R):

Using the left needle, pick up the bar between the 2 stitches from the front and purl it through the back loop.

#### **TIPS FOR DECREASING (sleeves)**

1 stitch is increased on each side of the marker as follows: Knit until 3 stitches before marker, slip 1 stitch knitwise, knit 1 stitch, pass the slipped stitch over the knit stitch, knit 2 stitches (the marker is placed between these 2 stitches), knit 2 stitches together.

#### **BACK PIECE**

Using needle 4.5 mm (US 7), co 31 (33) 33 (35) 37 (37) sts. Work with 2 strands of the main color. P 1 row (WS). Place 1 marker after the 3 outermost sts on each side. M1L after the marker in the beginning of the row (as seen from the RS) and M1R before the marker at the end of the row. Increase like this on the WS, as well. See the tips for increasing above. Work stockinette stitch in



the flat. Keep increasing a total of 29 (30) 32 (33) 35 (38) times = 89 (93) 97 (101) 107 (113) sts. Then work even in stockinette stitch until the work measures 10 (11) 11 (12) 13 (14) cm / 3.9 (4.3) 4.3 (4.7) 5.1 (5.5)" (measured along the outer edge). From the RS, work chart A as follows: edge st, k1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (1), repeat chart A to end. The chart is worked 1 time vertically. Change to the contrasting color and work chart B as follows: edge st, k1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (1), repeat chart B to end. Repeat the chart (the pattern repeat) a total of 6 times vertically. The work now measures approx 17 (18) 18 (19) 20 (21) cm / 6.7 (7.1) 7.1 (7.5) 7.9 (8.3)" along the outer edge. Put the sts on hold. Cut off the yarn.

#### LEFT SHOULDER

Left shoulder: From the RS, pick up 29 (30) 32 (33) 35 (38) sts along the edge with increases on the left-hand side (i.e. pick up 1 st per row along the edge at the top of the back piece). When the shoulder measures 6 (6) 6.5 (7) 7.5 (8) cm / 2.4 (2.4) 2.6 (2.8) 3.0 (3.1)", begin increasing for the neckline. On the next 6 (6) 6 (7) 7 (7) RS rows, M1L after the 3rd st in the beginning of each row. On the next WS row, co 7 (7) 8 (8) 9 (9) sts for the neckline. = 42 (44) 46 (48) 51 (54) sts. Continue in stockinette stitch until the front piece measures 17 (18) 20 (21) 22 (23) cm / 6.7 (7.1) 7.9 (8.3) 8.7 (9.1)" along the outer edge. From the RS, work chart A as follows: edge st, k2 (0) 2 (0) 3 (2), repeat chart A to end. The chart is worked 1 time vertically. Change to the contrasting color and work chart B as follows: edge st, k2 (0) 2 (0) 3 (2), repeat chart B to end. Repeat the chart (the pattern repeat) a total of 6 times vertically. The front piece now measures approx 24 (25) 27 (28) 29 (30) cm / 9.4 (9.8) 10.6 (11.0) 11.4 (11.8)" along the outer edge. Put the sts on hold and cut off the yarn.

#### **RIGHT SHOULDER**

Right shoulder: From the RS, pick up 29 (30) 32 (33) 35 (38) sts along the edge with increases on the right-hand side. When the shoulder measures 6 (6) 6.5 (7) 7.5 (8) cm / 2.4 (2.4) 2.6 (2.8) 3.0 (3.1)", begin increasing for the neck opening. From the RS, M1R before the third from last st on each row a total of 6 (6) 6 (7) 7 (7) times. On the next RS row, co 7 (7) 8 (8) 9 (9) sts for the neck opening. There are now 42 (44) 46 (48) 51 (54) sts on the needle. Continue until the front piece measures 17 (18) 20 (21) 22 (23) cm / 6.7 (7.1) 7.9 (8.3) 8.7 (9.1)" along the outer edge. From the RS, work chart A as follows: edge st, k1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (1), repeat chart A to end. The chart is worked 1 time vertically. Change to the contrasting color and work chart B as follows: edge st, k1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (1), repeat chart B to end. Repeat the pattern repeat a total of 6 times vertically. The front piece now measures approx 24 (25) 27 (28) 29 (30) cm / 9.4 (9.8) 10.6 (11.0) 11.4 (11.8)" along the outer edge.

#### **BACK PIECE AND FRONT PIECES**

Now join the pieces as follows (work in the flat on the circular needle beginning from the WS): Continue using the contrasting color and working chart B. Work across the 42 (44) 46 (48) 51 (54) sts for the right front piece, co 7 (7) 7 (7) 9 (11) sts below the arm, work across the 89 (93) 97 (101) 107 (113) sts for the back piece, co 7 (7) 7 (7) 9 (11) sts below the arm, work across the 42 (44) 46 (48) 51 (54) sts of the left front piece = 187 (195) 203 (211) 223 (235) sts. The new sts



below the arm are integrated in the pattern according to the chart. Continue until the stripe is 10 (10) 10 (11) 11 (11) cm / 3.9 (3.9) 3.9 (4.3) 4.3 (4.3)" wide. End with an even row in the chart. Work chart C with the main color. Then work stockinette stitch until the work measures 50 (52) 54 (56) 58 (60) cm / 19.7 (20.5) 21.3 (22.0) 22.8 (23.6)" measured on the front piece from the top of the shoulder. Increase 10 (12) 12 (14) 16 (16) sts evenly across. Work rib stitch with needle 4 mm (US 6) as follows:

Row 1 (WS): edge st, \*p1tbl, k1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, p1tbl, sl1p wyif. Row 2 (RS): edge st, \*k1tbl, p1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, k1tbl, sl1p wyif. Repeat rows 1-2 until the ribbing measures 4 cm / 1.6″. Bo.

#### **SLEEVE**

Pick up 86 (90) 94 (98) 100 (104) sts along the armhole, beginning at the bottom. Place a marker to mark BOR. Work stockinette stitch in the round. When the sleeve measures 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (4) cm / 1.2 (1.2) 1.2 (1.6) 1.6 (1.6)", decrease on each side of the marker. See tips for decreasing further above. Decrease every 2.5 (2) 2 (2) 1.5 (1.5) cm / 1.0 (0.8) 0.8 (0.8) 0.6 (0.6)" a total of 18 (20) 21 (23) 23 (24) times = 50 (50) 52 (52) 54 (56) sts. Continue in stockinette stitch until the sleeve measures 43 (43) 43 (42) 41 (40) cm / 16.9 (16.9) 16.9 (16.5) 16.1 (15.7)". Increase 6 (6) 6 (8) 8 (8) sts evenly across. Work rib stitch with needle 4 mm (US 6) as follows: \*K1tbl, p1; repeat from \* to end. Continue until the ribbing measures 4 cm / 1.6". The sleeve measures approx 48 (48) 48 (47) 46 (45) cm / 18.9 (18.9) 18.9 (18.5) 18.1 (17.7)". Bo. Work the second sleeve following the same procedure.

#### **NECKLINE RIBBING**

Using needle 4 mm (US 6), pick up 95 (97) 101 (105) 109 (111) sts from the RS. Row 1 (WS): K1, \*p1tbl, k1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, p1tbl, sl1p wyif. Row 2 (WS): K1, \*k1tbl, p1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, k1tbl, sl1p wyif. Continue like this until the ribbing measures 3 cm / 1.2″. Bo.

#### **FRONT RIBBING**

Left front ribbing: Using needle 4 mm (US 6), pick up 107 (107) 113 (121) 127 (133) sts from the RS. Begin at the top of the neck opening and end at the bottom of the body ribbing. Row 1 (WS): edge st, \*p1tbl, k1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, p1tbl, sl1p wyif. Row 2 (RS): edge st, \*k1tbl, p1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, k1tbl, sl1p wyif. Work 9 rows of ribbing by repeating rows 1-2. Bo.

Right front ribbing: Pick up 107 (107) 113 (121) 127 (133) sts from the RS. Begin at the bottom of the body ribbing and end at the top of the neck opening. Row 1 (WS): edge st, \*p1tbl, k1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, p1tbl, sl1p wyif. Row 2 (RS): edge st, \*k1tbl, p1; repeat from \* until 2 sts remain, k1tbl, sl1p wyif. Row 3: Repeat row 1. Row 4: Repeat row 2. Row 5 (button hole): edge st, work 6 (6) 5 (5) 5 (5) sts in rib stitch as established, \*k2tog, yo, 21




(21) 23 (25) 21 (22) sts in rib stitch; repeat from \* until 8 (8) 7 (7) 6 (7) sts remain, make another button hole like the other ones, work as established to end. Rows 6-9: Repeat rows 1-4. Bo.

#### FINISHING

Weave in all ends and sew buttons on the left front ribbing.
