MATERIALS

MC/C1:

1 skein of **Highland Wool** color 09
1 skein of **Friends Kid Silk** color 124

C2:

1 skein of **Highland Wool** color 02
1 skein of **Friends Kid Silk** color 02

C3:

1 skein of **Highland Wool** color 29
1 skein of **Friends Kid Silk** color 52

C4:

1 skein of **Highland Wool** color 34
1 skein of **Friends Kid Silk** color 49

Circular needles 3.5 mm, 40 cm / US 4, 16"

Circular needles 4.5 mm, 40 cm / US 7, 16"

YARN QUALITY

 **Highland Wool**, Hobbii
100 % Peruvian Highland Wool
50 g / 1.8 oz = 175 m / 191 yds

 **Friends Kid Silk**, Hobbii
72 % Mohair, 25 % Silk, 3 % Wool
25 g / 0.9 oz = 200 m / 246 yds

GAUGE

18 sts x 24 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

SIZE

(2XS, XS, S) (M, L, XL)

MEASUREMENTS

Hat circumference: 45, 47, 50, 54, 56, 60 cm
17.7, 18.5, 19.7, 21.3, 22, 23.6 in

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Woodland hat is a seamless hat worked from the bottom up, starting with a moss stitch ribbing. The ribbing is accented by a Latvian braid in contrasting colors. Once the ribbing is complete, the hat body is worked in stockinette stitch according to a colorwork chart that features another Latvian braid. The crown shaping follows the chart with gradual decreases. A Braid is attached at the end.

Techniques: Includes moss stitch rib, stockinette stitch, simple cable/lace work, Latvian Braid, and simple embroidery.

ABBREVIATIONS

K = Knit

P = Purl

CO = Cast on

MC = main color

C = color

SPECIAL STITCHES

How to knit a Latvian Braid

Round 1: Using both C2 and C4: Alternate between knitting 1 stitch with C4 and 1 stitch with C2, repeating this pattern until the end of the round.

Round 2: With both C2 and C4 held in front: Purl 1 stitch with C2, then cross C4 over C2 and purl 1 stitch with C4. Continue crossing C2 over C4 and purl 1 stitch with C2. Repeat this cross-and-purl pattern until the end of the round.

Round 3: With both C2 and C4 still in front: Purl 1 stitch with C2, then cross C4 under C2 and purl 1 stitch with C4. Continue crossing C2 under C4 and purl 1 stitch with C2. Repeat until the end of the round.

How to knit a bobble or popcorn

Knit into the front of the first stitch on your needle, into the back, and front again. (3 stitches on the needle).

Turn your work and purl the 3 stitches back, then turn back and knit the 3 stitches again.

Pass the first two stitches over the last stitch and move to the right-side needle to complete the bobble/popcorn.

How to increase

Left-Leaning Increase (M1L):

Pick up the bar between stitches from front to back and knit through the back loop.

Right-Leaning Increase (M1R):

Pick up the bar between stitches from back to front and knit through the front loop.

How to decrease

Left-Leaning Decrease (SSK):

Slip 1 stitch knit wise, slip the next stitch knit wise, then knit these 2 stitches together through the back loops.

Right-Leaning Decrease (K2tog):

Knit 2 stitches together.

Latvian braid

RIB

CO (80, 84, 90) (96, 100, 108) stitches with C1 using a 3.5 mm (US 4) circular or double-pointed needle, according to your preference. Join in the round.

Knit a Latvian braid using C3 and C4 (3 rounds). If you have never knitted a Latvian Braid before, have a look at the description under “special stitches”.

Knit ribbing in moss stitch for (3, 4, 5) (4, 5, 6) cm / (1.2, 1.6, 2) (1.6, 2, 2.4) in.

HAT

Change to needle size 4.5 mm (US 7). Knit according to Chart - The marking in green is a Latvian braid—use C3 and C4.

CROWN

Decrease according to Chart.

Once the Chart is completed, knit 1 round as follows: *Knit 1, knit 2 together* until the end. Break yarn. Draw the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight.

BRAID

Now we will create a braid using colors C2, C3, and C4:

Cut three strands of yarn, each about 45 cm (18 in) long, one in each color (C2, C3, and C4). Thread these strands through the top center of the hat, securing them firmly so they won't come loose.

Split the strands into three sections and braid tightly until you reach the desired length.
Tie a knot at the end of the braid to secure it.
Trim any excess yarn from the braid to your preference.
Weave in ends.

EMBROIDERED LEAVES

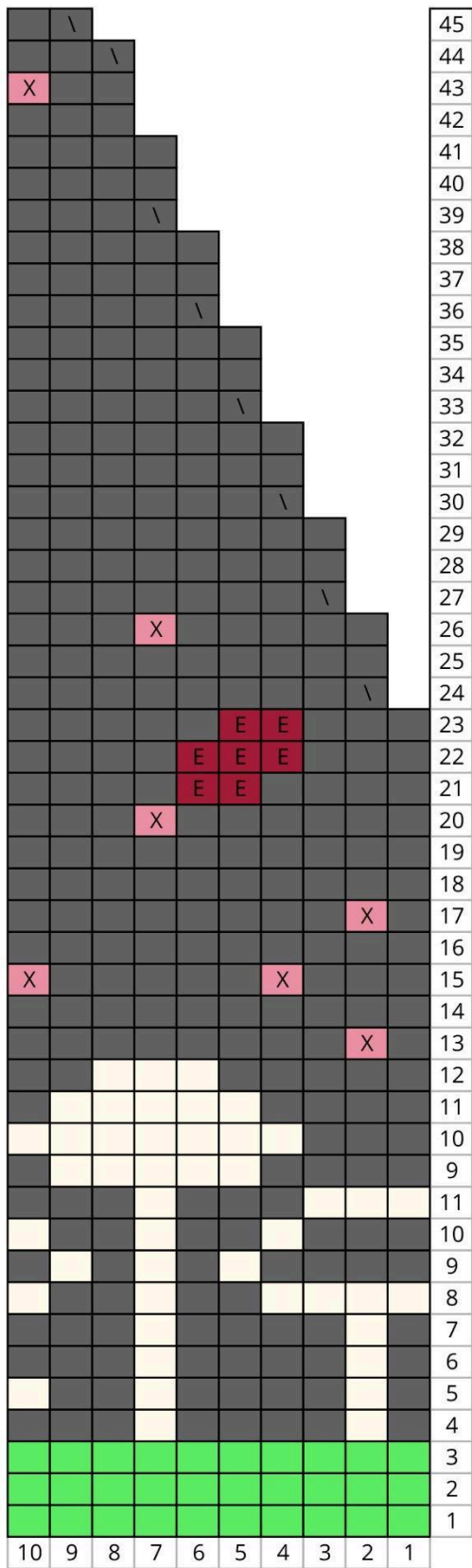
1. Cut a thread approximately 1 meter long from both types of Col 3 yarn.
2. Thread the embroidery needle and bring the thread from the wrong side of the garment to the right side, positioning it as close as possible to the edge of the popcorn stitch. Leave about a 5 cm tail on the inside.
3. Wrap the yarn around your pinky finger, then insert the needle back into the fabric, right next to the first exit point, pulling the yarn through to the wrong side again.
4. Bring the needle back to the right side of the fabric, about 1 cm (0.4 in) from the previous stitch.
5. Insert the needle back into the fabric while wrapping the thread around the section of yarn that was wrapped around your pinky finger.
6. Repeat the process to create additional leaf shapes.






