MATERIALS

Friends Kid Silk 1 skein of col 107 1 skein of col 73

Crochet hook 3.5 mm / US E/4

YARN QUALITY

Friends Kid Silk, Hobbii
 72 % Mohair, 25 % Silk, 3 % Wool
 25 g / 0.9 oz = 200 m / 218 yds

GAUGE

8 sts x 7 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" In Love Knot pattern

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain sc = single crochet lk = love knot

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 15 cm / 2" Length: 170 cm / 67"

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Edelweiss Scarf is a soft and lightweight crochet accessory that's perfect for you if you're an intermediate crocheter. The pattern comes with a super helpful photo guide, making it easy to follow along with the color changes and design.

You'll also get to learn a cool stitch called the Love Knot, which gives the scarf its lovely lacy look. Even if you haven't tried it before, the step-by-step photos will guide you through it. Plus, this stitch is inspired by the beautiful Edelweiss flower!

INFO AND TIPS

Here's how to make color changes in this pattern:

- 1. Pull up a loop in the last stitch of the row.
- 2. Make a knot with both yarn ends to secure.
- 3. Crochet 3 lk and turn as you would normally for each row.
- 4. Cut the excess yarn.






SCARF


Foundation chain

Use your Lilac yarn. Start with the foundation chain by making a slip knot and a ch 1.




Love knot

Pull up a loop on your hook of 1 cm in height, yarn over and pull through the loop, creating a large loop on your hook. Insert the hook into the back bump of the large loop (the single strand at the back of the loop). Yarn over and pull through the back bump. Yarn over and pull through both loops on your hook. This completes your first love knot.




Continue making love knots until you have a total of 8 big loops and 9 stitches in between.





BODY


R1: To start the first row, crochet 3 more love knots. Then sc into the fourth love knot from the hook (the tight stitch).









Now crochet 2 love knots, skip one love knot on your foundation chain and sc in the next. Repeat this process 3 more times.





R2: Turn your project. Crochet 3 love knots. Make a sc in the next lk of the previous row (the one that's not attached to the foundation chain), make 2 lk, sc into the lk that's not attached to the foundation chain, repeat until the end of the row.



R3: Repeat row 2.

R4-R103: Repeat row 2. Remember to turn and crochet 3 lk at the beginning of each row. Alternate between lilac and yellow yarn every 4 rows until the end of the pattern.
