#### **MATERIALS**

# **Upcycled Suri Alpaca**

5 skeins of color (04) Mustard 3 skeins of color (09) Pepper

Circular needle 6 mm (US 10), 80 cm (31.5") Circular needle 4.5 mm (US 7), 80 cm (31.5")

Wooden buttons - Duffle 4 pcs - 20 mm

# **YARN QUALITY**

**Upcycled Suri Alpaca**, Hobbii 100 % Alpaca 50 g (1.74 oz) = 110 m (120 yds)

# **GAUGE**

10 cm x 10 cm  $(4'' \times 4'')$  = 14 sts x 19 rows In garter st after blocking

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

St (s) = Stitch (es)
Approx = Approximately
St marker = stitch marker

#### SIZE

One size

#### **MEASUREMENTS**

Width, back piece: Approx. 48 cm / 18.9" Width, front piece: Approx. 35 cm / 13.8" Length, front piece: Approx. 200 cm / 78.75" Length, back piece: Approx. 92 cm / 36"

# PATTERN INFORMATION

First you knit the front as one long piece.
Then you pick up stitches for the back. Front and back are knitted with intarsia technique.
The wrap is finished off with an edge in moss stitch and fringes.

# **INFO AND TIPS**

The size of the shawl can easily be altered by adding/extracting sts when you cast on. For example: If you prefer a larger/wider shawl you cast on more sts in the beginning and to the back panel for a wider back.





#### **FRONT PIECE**

With a circular needle 6 mm (US 10), 80 cm (31.5") cast on 38 sts with col. 04 and 2 sts in col. 09 = total of 40 sts on.

Knit back and forth using col. 04 when knitting col. 04 and col. 09 when knitting col. 09. Make note to always cross and tighten the threads of col. 04 with col. 09 to prevent holes in the work.

Always knit 1 more st of the one colour and one less of the other colour where the two colours meet to create the geometrical diagonal pattern of the two triangles as shown in the photos.

For example: when there are 38 sts of col. 04 and 2 sts of col. 09 in the beginning of the work, knit 3 sts of col. 09 and 37 sts of col. 04 when knitting the next row. Turn and repeat, but with 36 sts of col. 04 and 4 sts of col. 09. Continue until there are 39 sts of col. 09 and 1 st of col. 04 left. You should now have 1 triangle of col. 04 and 1 triangle of col. 09.

Continue working in the same way but with the opposite colours: 2 sts of col. 04 and 38 sts col. 09 and so on until there are 39 sts of col. 04 and 1st of col. 09. Keep knitting back and forth like this until you have 5 whole triangles in col. 09 (or preferred length). Cast off and weave in threads.

#### **BACK PIECE**

Measure the shawl and place a st marker in the middle of the shawl. Be aware of which side is the outside and the inside of the shawl. Pick up 30 sts from the outside on each side of the st marker with col. 04: total of 60 sts (or preferred amount of sts for larger or smaller back piece). Turn and knit 58 sts with col. 04 and add col. 09 for the two last sts. Continue back and forth like previously on the first half of the shawl until you have 1 whole triangle in each color (or preferred length). Cast off and weave in threads.

# **EDGING AND FRINGE**

Pick up sts with the Circular needle 4.5 mm (US 7), 80 cm (31.5") and col. 04 from the outside on the edge of the back piece and towards the back edge on the front piece (do not pick up sts on the bottom where the fringes will be attached). Be aware of which side is the outside and inside of the shawl. Knit 1 st and purl 1 st (Moss stitch) back and forth until the edging measures approx. 3 cm (1.1"). Repeat on the other side as well.

Edging on the front piece is a bit different. Since the edge will be folded like a collar in front, pick up sts from the inside/wrong side and knit and purl (Moss stitch) back and forth until the edging measures approx. 3 cm (1.25").



Lastly - create fringes by cutting 3 threads in approx. 20 cm (7.75") long. Create a bundle with the threads. Place the middle of the bundle in a big needle and sew halfway through the short edge of the bottom of the back piece. Repeat the fringes on the two front pieces.

Sewing the bundle halfway through the edge - it is now a loop to put the 6 threads through as shown in the photo. Continue until the short edges are full of fringes.







#### **BUTTONS AND FINISHING**

Sew two Wooden buttons - Duffle (20 mm) on each side of the back piece approx. 30 cm (11.75") from the bottom and one more button approx 20 cm (7.75") above the first button. Repeat on the other side as well. Feel free to use more buttons if you prefer more buttons. Because of the gauge the buttons do not need buttonholes. Therefore it is easy to add buttons if needed when the shawl is finished.

Place the buttons through the front piece, weave in ends, hand wash if needed and block to measurements. Let it dry flat.
