MATERIALS

3 skeins of **Acacia** color 08 (MC)
2 skeins of **Acacia Print** color 09 (CC)

Crochet hook 4 mm / US G/6
Stitch Markers

YARN QUALITY

 **Acacia**, Hobbii
51 % Acrylic, 49 % Cotton
100 g / 3.5 oz = 250 m / 273 yds

 **Acacia Print**, Hobbii
51 % Acrylic, 49 % Cotton
100 g / 3.5 oz = 250 m / 273 yds

GAUGE

17 sts x 9 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in
heart pattern stitch (see notes)

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
MC = main color
CC = contrast color
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
St = stitch
Rep = repeat
Sk = skip
Pf = puff stitch. All in one st *YO, insert hook into st, YO, pull through just the st*, rep * * 2 more times, YO, pull through all the loops. This makes a 7 loop puff.
Csdc = chainless starting double crochet. See Notes
[] = in the same stitch
FO = fasten off

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 35.5 cm / 14"
Length: 165 cm / 65" (customizable)

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Heart's Desire Scarf is an accessory that adds a touch of whimsy to any outfit. Featuring a delicate heart motif, it is perfect for all ages and will be able to be styled in various ways to suit a person's personal taste. It's the perfect gift for all genders as well because it can be made in any color creating both a masculine or feminine look.

The scarf is crafted using crochet puff stitches, creating an adorable heart design that can be customized into stripes, checks, or color block sections. It allows for creative freedom with contrasting colors, making each scarf unique. Finally the crab stitch border adds the right amount of detail to create that perfect finished look.

The scarf can be made as long or as short as you like. Just remember that yardage and number of skeins will vary depending on your desired length. It's the scarf you can make to your Heart's Desire!

INFO AND TIPS

- Gauge Swatch: The gauge is worked in the “heart pattern stitch.”
- Ch 22 sts, sc in the 2nd chain from hook, then follow the directions for rows 1 - 6 in pattern until your swatch measures over 10cm / 4” (at least 9 rows). Then block it for the most accurate measurements of gauge. Remember, each heart = 3 sts (2 puff sts and one ch1) and the dc counts as 1 st. So, each repeat is 4 sts.
- For my scarf, I used a chainless starting dc (csdc) to start each row because it makes a more even edge. After the first row, I will no longer be mentioning this and it will be written as simply dc. If you would rather ch3, that is ok too. If you ch3 to start, be aware that your ch3 will count as 1dc.
- **Csdc:** chainless starting double crochet. Pull up loop on hook approx the same height as your regular dc, holding elongated loop on hook with your finger twist the hook counterclockwise down towards you, wrapping the lengthened loop around your hook (should look like a yarn over), insert hook into loop and finish stitch how you would a normal dc. MAIN SCARF

Ch 62 sts with MC

Row 1: Sc in the 2nd ch from hook and each ch across. Turn. 61 sts

Row 2: Cont. with MC *csdc in 1st st (csdc at the start of each row will be labeled as dc on following rows. When not at the beginning of the row, csdc is a dc.), sk1, [pf, ch1, pf], sk1* rep * * to last st in row, dc into the last st. Turn.

Row 3: *with MC 1dc in first st, with CC [pf, ch1, pf] all in middle of ‘heart’ below* rep * * to last st in row, dc into the last st. Turn.

Row 4 - Row 5: with MC *1dc in first st, [pf, ch1, pf] all in middle of ‘heart’ below* rep * * to last st in row, dc into the last st. Turn.

Row 6 - Desired Length (the sample has 138 rows): rep Row 3 - Row 5

FO

BORDER

Round 1: Attach CC with a sl st, Ch1, sc along the side of your scarf placing 2 or 3 sc in each dc. (This will depend on your tension. Place enough sc along the edge so that it does not pucker or become wavy). Place 3 sc in the last st to turn the corner. Sc along the other side of the starting chain. Place 3 sc into the last st to turn the corner. Sc along the next side. Place 3 sc into the last st to turn the corner, then sc across the last row placing 3 sts into the last st to turn the last corner. Sl st into the first st of the round.

Round 2: ch1, crab st around, sl st into the first st of the round.

FO

Weave in all ends and block the scarf.
