Henny

Chicken with Eggs

MATERIALS

Toucan

- 1 skein of col. Pastel Yellow (05)
- 1 skein of col. Orange (09)
- 1 skein of col. Lavender (12)
- 1 skein of col. Mint (27)
- 1 skein of col. Light Turquoise (22)

Crochet hook 6 mm (US/J10)
Fiberfill
Optional: black cotton scrap yarn for embroidering eyes

YARN QUALITY

 **Toucan**, Hobbii
100% Polyester
100 g (3.5 oz) = 120 m (131 yds)

GAUGE

10 x 10 cm / 4 x 4" = 8 st x 9 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

Sc = single crochet
Mr = magic ring
St(s) = stitch(es)
Sl st(s) = slip stitch(es)
Ch = chain st
sc2tog = 2 single crochet stitches together

SIZES

One size

MEASUREMENTS

18 cm (7.25") wide and 16 cm (6.5") tall

PATTERN INFORMATION

Henny is a sweet chicken with eggs. You can hide the eggs inside the chicken. A quick crocheted activity toy for kids or a cute Easter decoration.

The pattern is crocheted in one piece, no need to sew any parts together afterwards.

INFO AND TIPS

The chicken is crocheted in one piece. It is crocheted from the bottom up. First, crochet the hole for the eggs, which is the innermost part of the chicken with room for the eggs. This part is placed inside the chicken before stuffing to ensure there is room for the 3 eggs and the chicken is not overstuffed.

Egg x 3

1 x Mint (27), 1 x Lavender (12), and 1 x Light Turquoise (22)

Rnd 1: 3 sc in a mr (3)

Rnd 2: *2 sc in one st* (6)

Rnd 3: *1 sc, 2 sc in one st* (9)

Rnd 4: 1 sc in each st (9)

Rnd 5: *2 sc, 2 sc in one st* (12)

Rnds 6-7 (2 rounds): 1 sc in each st (12)

Rnd 8: *1 sc, sc2tog* (9)

Stuff the eggs

Rnd 9: *Sc2tog*

Finish and sew the last scs together.

Pastel Yellow (05)

Rnd 1: 6 sc in a mr (6)

Rnd 2: *2 sc in one st* (12)

Rnd 3: *1 sc, 2 sc one st* (18)

Rnd 4: *2 sc, 2 sc one st* (24)

Rnds 5-13 (9 rounds): 1 sc in each st (24)

Rnd 14: *2 sc, sc2tog* (18)

Rnd 15: 1 sc in the back loop of each st (18)

Rnd 16: *2 sc, 2 sc in one st* (24)

Rnd 17: *3 sc, 2 sc in one st* (30)

Rnd 18: *4 sc, 2 sc in one st* (36)

Rnd 19: *5 sc, 2 sc in one st* (42)

Rnds 20-30 (10 rounds): 1 sc in each st (42)

Tail feathers

Rnd 31: Ch 6, 1 sl st in the first ch you made, ch 6, 1 sl st in the same st as first sl st, ch 6, 1 sl st in the same st as the second sl st.

Now tuck body rnds 1-15 inside the other rounds to form a hole inside for the eggs. Place the 3 eggs in the hole and stuff the body. This way you will not overstuff the body so that there is no room for the eggs.

Crochet the body closed with sl sts from the tail to the head by working through both layers. Close with sl sts until 12 sts remain.

These 12 sts form the new round:

Rnds 32-34 (3 rounds): 1 sc in each st (12)

Change col to Orange (09)

Rnd 35: Fasten off the head by working sl sts through both layers (6)

Now crochet the comb with ch and sl sts as follows:

ch 5, 1 sl st in next sl st repeat 6 times for each of the 6 sts.

Fasten off with a long thread to embroider the beak.



Embroidering

Embroider the beak between rnds 31 and 32.

Embroider the eyes with black.
