Pascal

Unisex Slipover

Design: Apple of My Eye | Hobbii Design



MATERIALS

Main color: 4 (4) 5 (5) 6 skeins of **Highland Wool** color (12) Navy

Contrasting color: 1 (1) 2 (2) 2 skein(s) of **Highland Wool** color (02) Eggshell

Circular needle 3.5 (US 4) and 4 mm (US 6) – 60 cm (24")

Stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

 **Highland Wool**, Hobbii

100 % Wool

50 g (1.75 oz) = 175 m (191 yds)

GAUGE

24 sts x 32 rows = 10 x 10 cm (4 x 4") with needle 4 mm (US 6) in stockinette stitch

ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) = stitch(es)

k = knit

p = purl

tbl = through the back loop

rnd(s) = round(s)

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

yo(s) = yarnover(s)

sl1 = slip 1 stitch

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

p2tog = purl 2 stitches together

co = cast on

bo = bind off

psso = pass slipped stitch over

The Pascal Slipover is a minimalist, versatile slipover worked in stockinette stitch with elegant ribbings at the waist, armholes and v-neck. The slipover has a classic length which makes it easy to style for any occasion.

INFORMATION AND TIPS

The slipover is worked bottom up in stockinette stitch. The work begins at the waistline ribbing. Then, the body is worked in stockinette stitch until the armhole. At the armhole, the work is divided into front piece and back piece which are worked separately in stockinette stitch. Finally, stitches are picked up along the armhole and the v-neck which are worked in rib stitch.

Body

Using circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) and color 12, co 200 (220) 240 (260) 280 sts. Work rib stitch in the round like this: *K2, p2; repeat from * while placing markers as follows:

Place marker, work rib stitch across 100 (110) 120 (130) 140 sts, place marker, work rib stitch to end.

Continue working rib stitch until the work measures 6 (6) 6 (6) 6 cm / 2.4 (2.4) 2.4 (2.4) 2.4".

Change to needle 4 mm (US 6). Work stockinette stitch in the round until the work (including ribbing) measures 32 (33) 34 (35) 36 cm / 12.6 (13) 13.4 (13.8) 14.2".

From BOR, bo for the armholes as follows: Bo 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 sts, work 92 (102) 112 (120) 130 sts, bo 8 (8) 8 (10) 10 sts, work until 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 sts remain on the rnd, bo 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 sts, cut off the yarn. There are now 184 (204) 224 (240) 260 sts on the needle. Now the work is divided into back piece and front piece.

Back piece

Work stockinette stitch in the flat across the 92 (102) 112 (120) 130 sts while simultaneously binding off sts for the armhole at each side of the row on the RS and WS of the back piece as follows:

*Bo 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts at each side; repeat from * a total of 3 (3) 3 (4) 5 times = a total of 80 (90) 100 (104) 110 sts on the needle.

*Bo 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 st at each side; repeat from * a total of 4 (4) 4 (4) 5 times. There are now 72 (82) 92 (96) 100 sts on the needle.

Work stockinette stitch in the flat until the armhole measures 22 (23) 24 (25) 26 cm / 8.7 (9) 9.4 (9.8) 10.2"

Shoulders

Bo the 36 (40) 42 (46) 46 middle sts for the neck. From here, the shoulders are worked separately.

Begin at the left-hand side of the neck (RS of the work). Bo 2 sts at the beginning of the row and work stockinette stitch to end. The next row is worked in stockinette stitch (WS of the work).

Bo 1 st at the beginning of the next row (RS of the work).

Work even until the work measures 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 cm / 22 (22.8) 23.6 (24.4) 25.2" including the ribbing.

Put the next 15 (18) 22 (22) 24 sts on hold.

Work the right shoulder as follows: Bo 2 sts at the beginning of the row (WS of the work) and work stockinette stitch to end. The next row is worked in stockinette stitch (RS of the work). Bo 1 st at the beginning of the next row (WS of the work).

Work even until the work measures 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 cm / 22 (22.8) 23.6 (24.4) 25.2" including the ribbing.

Front piece

Now the work is divided into two front pieces. Each front piece is finished separately in stockinette stitch. Place a marker in the middle of the front piece. Begin with the left front piece while the sts for the right front piece are put on hold.

NB! Sts are decreased for the v-neck and the armhole at the same time.

Armhole (left front piece): Bo for the armhole at the beginning of the row (RS of the work) as follows: *Bo 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts; repeat from * a total of 3 (3) 3 (4) 5 times. *Bo 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 st; repeat from * a total of 4 (4) 4 (4) 5 times.

V-neck (left front piece): Work stockinette stitch until 4 sts before marker, k2tog, k2. Decrease like this on every other row a total of 9 (10) 11 (12) 13 times. Then decrease on every 4th row a total of 12 (13) 13 (12) 13 times. Work even until the work measures 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 cm / 22 (22.8) 23.6 (24.4) 25.2". Put the remaining 15 (18) 22 (22) 24 sts on hold on a needle.

Work the other front piece (right front piece). Bo for the armhole at the beginning of the row (WS of the work) as follows: *Bo 2 (2) 2 (2) 2 sts; repeat from * a total of 3 (3) 3 (4) 5 times. *Bo 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 st; repeat from * a total of 4 (4) 4 (4) 5 times.

V-neck (right front piece): Decrease for the v-neck and the armhole at the same time. Begin by decreasing at the beginning of the row at the neck opening as follows: k2, sl1, k1, pssso.

Decrease like this on every other row a total of 9 (10) 11 (12) 13 times. Then decrease on every 4th row a total of 12 (13) 13 (12) 13 times. Work even until the work measures 56 (58) 60 (62) 64 cm / 22 (22.8) 23.6 (24.4) 25.2". Put the remaining 15 (18) 22 (22) 24 sts on hold on a needle.

Shoulder

The two shoulders are knit together by turning the work onto the WS and proceeding as follows: Place the two needles with the sts on hold RS against RS and hold them in your left hand. Knit the first st on one needle together with the first st on the second needle while simultaneously binding off loosely by passing the previous st over the most recently knit st. Same procedure for the second shoulder.

Armholes

Work a double sleeve edging as follows: Using circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) and the contrasting color, pick up sts in each of the sts along the armhole (the number of sts must be divisible by 4) = 160 (168) 176 (184) 192 sts.

Work approx. 6 cm / 2.4" in rib stitch as follows: *k2, p2; repeat from * and make stripes like this: 5 rnds with the contrasting color, 3 rnds with the main color, 10 rnds with the contrasting color, 3 rnds with the main color, and 5 rnds with the contrasting color. Fold the arm edging and knit it together. Same procedure for the second armhole.

Neckline ribbing

The double neckline edging, like the armhole, is worked in rib stitch with stripes as follows: P1, *k2, p2; repeat from * until 3 sts remain, k2, p1.

Begin mid back as follows: Using circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) and the stripe color, pick up a total of 206 (214) 222 (230) 238 sts along the neck opening. There are 103 (107) 111 (115) 119 sts on each side of the v-neck from mid back to the tip of the v-neck opening. The 2 sts at the tip of the v-neck are always k. Place a marker before and after the k sts at the v-neck. The v-neck is shaped in the following rnd by decreasing on each rnd on each side of the v-neck as follows:

Rnd 1: Work until 2 sts before marker, p2tog, k2, p2tog.

Rnd 2: Work until 2 sts before marker, sl1, p1, pss0, k2, k2tog.

Rnd 3: Work until 2 sts before marker, sl1, k1, pss0, k2, k2tog.

Rnd 4: Repeat rnd 1.

Repeat rnds 1-4 a total of 3 (3) 3 (3) 3 times. Then work 1 rnd without decreases. Now increase on each side of the 2 middle sts on each rnd as follows: Work rib stitch until 1 st before marker, yo, k2, yo, work rib stitch to end. The yos are worked tbl on the following rnd. Fold down the v-neck ribbing and knit it together.

Finishing

Weave in all ends on the WS by sewing into the top part of the sts so that it is invisible from the RS. Wash the slipover according to the instructions on the yarn label. Place the slipover on a dry towel and pull it into the correct measurements to make sure it dries in the correct shape.
