Amulet

MATERIALS

Pom Pom x Hobbii Garland Shades:

Yarn A: Oat Milk (29); 4 (5, 5, 6, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10) balls Yarn B: Pixel (34); 1 (2, 2, 2, 2, 2, 3, 3, 3) balls Yarn C: Amulet (17); 2 (2, 3, 3, 3, 3, 4, 4, 5) balls Yarn D: Chipmunk (27); 3 (4, 4, 4, 5, 5, 6, 6, 7) balls

4.5mm / US 7 circular needles, 80-100cm /
32-40" length.
4mm / US 6 circular needles, 80-100cm /
32-40" length **and** needles suitable for working small circumferences in the round.

Always use a needle size that will result in the correct gauge after blocking.

Stitch marker, stitch holders, tapestry needle

YARN QUALITY

Garland, Hobbii x Pom Pom
Worsted weight
70% Cotton, 30% Alpaca
105m / 114yd per 50 g

GAUGE

22 sts & 30 rows = 10cm / 4" over St st on 4.5mm needles after blocking. 24 sts & 28 rows = 10cm / 4" over 1x1 stranded colourwork pattern on 4.5mm needles after blocking.

SIZES

1 (2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9)

MEASUREMENTS

Finished chest (fullest point) circumference: 70 (73.5, 82.5, 88, 101, 113.5, 124.5, 137, 153.5)cm / 27¹/₂ (29, 32¹/₂, 34³/₄, 39³/₄, 44³/₄, 49, 54, 60¹/₂)" – to be worn with 10-15 cm / 4-6" positive ease.

Model has a 86cm / 34" chest circumference and is wearing a size 4.

PATTERN INFORMATION

This garment has been designed to be worn open (not buttoned), so it is recommended to add approx. 10-15cm / 4-6" to the finished chest circumference when selecting a size.

Pattern



Notes: This cardigan is worked starting with the shoulder plackets, which are worked back and forth in stranded colorwork. Stitches are picked up along both plackets, casting on stitches as you go to form the back neck. Short rows are worked to shape the back, before working in Stocking stitch to the underarm. Stitches are picked up along each placket to work the fronts separately to the underarm, then the back and fronts are joined to work back and forth in stranded colorwork. A simple ribbing is worked for the waistband with a tubular cast-off. The stitches for the sleeves are picked up around the armhole and are worked in the round from the top down, with decreases. The cuffs are worked in a simple ribbing with a tubular cast-off in a contrasting colour. Finally the front band/collar is worked in simple ribbing, shaped with short rows and finished with a tubular cast-off.

ABBREVIATIONS

Beg: beginning Dec: decrease Foll: follow(s)/following Inc: increase K: knit k2tog: knit 2 stitches together M1L: Make 1 Left; pick up strand between the two needles from the front to back with the tip of left needle, knit into the back of this stitch M1R: Make 1 Right; pick up strand between the two needles from back to front with the tip of left needle, knit into the front of this stitch Patt: pattern (i.e. work in pattern) PM: place marker P: purl P2tog: purl 2 stitches together Rem: remain(s)/remaining Rep: repeat RS: right side SI: slip

Ssk: slip 2 stitches knitwise one at a time, knit together through the back loops SM: slip marker st(s): stitch(es) St st: stocking stitch (stockinette): knit on RS rows, purl on WS rows Tog: together Wyib: with yarn held in back of work Wyif: with yarn held in front of work WS: wrong side

STITCH GLOSSARY

German Short Rows:

Create DS: Bring yarn to front, slip the first stitch as if to purl, bring yarn over the needle to the back of your work and pull tight (it will look like a double stitch = DS) **Resolving Double Stitches:** When you encounter the DS on subsequent rows, work DS in pattern, inserting needle through both legs of the DS and treating it as one stitch.

1x1 Rib (flat):

Row 1 (WS): [K1, p1] to last st, sl1 wyif. **Row 2 (RS):** K2, [p1, k1] to last st, sl1 wyif. Rep rows 1-2 for pattern.

1x1 Rib (in the round):

Round 1: [K1, p1] to end. Rep round 1 for pattern.

Tubular cast-off (flat):

Tubular Cast Off (in the round):

Work as for flat Tubular Cast Off; when all stitches have been cast off, pass the tapestry needle from the front to the back through the two upper legs of the first stitch of the round, then pass it from the back to the front through the two upper legs of the last stitch of the round and pass it again from the front to the back through the two upper legs of the first stitch of the round.

PATTERN BEGINS

Right shoulder placket

**Using larger needles, yarn A, and the long-tail method, cast on 31 (35, 35, 37, 37, 39, 41, 43, 45) sts.

Join yarn B.

Row 1 (RS): K1 with yarn A, [k1 with yarn A, k1 with yarn B] to last 2 sts, k2 with yarn A. Row 2 (WS): P1 with yarn A, [p1 with yarn A, p1 with yarn B] to last 2 sts, p2 with yarn A. Rep rows 1-2 a further 15 (17, 19, 21, 25, 29, 33, 37, 42) times. Place sts on hold. **

Left shoulder placket

Work as for Right Shoulder Placket from ** to **.

Back

Note: When picking up sts along plackets for back and fronts, pick up at a rate of approx. 3 sts per 4 rows.

With RS of left placket facing, using larger needles and yarn A, beg at the held sts end, pick up and knit 24 (26, 30, 32, 38, 44, 50, 56, 64) sts along the edge of left placket, do not turn, using backwards loop method, cast on 30 (32, 34, 36, 40, 42, 44, 46, 48) sts for back neck, do not turn, with RS of right placket facing, beg at the cast-on end, pick up and knit 24 (26, 30, 32, 38, 44, 50, 56, 64) sts along the edge of right placket. *78 (84, 94, 100, 116, 130, 144, 158, 176) sts*

Next row (WS): Purl.

Begin working short rows as foll: Short row 1 (RS): K to last 5 sts, turn. Short row 2 (WS): Create DS, p to last 5 sts, turn. Short row 3: Create DS, k to 3 sts before DS, turn. Short row 4: Create DS, p to 3 sts before DS, turn. Rep Short rows 3-4 a further 7 (7, 8, 8, 9, 9, 10, 10, 11) times. Next row (RS): Create DS, k to end resolving DS. Next row (WS): P to end resolving DS. Continue straight in St st until back measures 10 (11, 12, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23)cm / 4 (4¼, 4¾,

5, 6, $6\frac{1}{2}$, $7\frac{1}{2}$, $8\frac{1}{4}$, 9)" from picked-up row when measured along outer edge (i.e. not including short rows), ending with a WS row.

Break yarn and place sts on hold.

Right front

With RS facing, using larger needles and yarn A, beg at the held sts end, pick up and knit 24 (26, 30, 32, 38, 44, 50, 56, 64) sts along the right front shoulder placket.

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2 (RS): K to last st, M1L, k1. 1 st inc

Rep rows 1-2 a further 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 5, 5, 5, 5) times. 28 (30, 34, 36, 42, 50, 56, 62, 70) sts Continue straight in St st until right front measures 10 (11, 12, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23)cm / 4 (4¹/₄, 4³/₄, 5, 6, 6¹/₂, 7¹/₂, 8¹/₄, 9)" from picked-up row, ending with a WS row. Break yarn and place sts on hold.

Left front

With RS facing, using larger needles and yarn A, beg at the cast-on end, pick up and knit 24 (26, 30, 32, 38, 44, 50, 56, 64) sts along the left front shoulder placket.

Row 1 (WS): Purl.

Row 2 (RS): K1, M1R, k to end. 1 st inc

Rep rows 1-2 a further 3 (3, 3, 3, 3, 5, 5, 5, 5) times. 28 (30, 34, 36, 42, 50, 56, 62, 70) sts Continue straight in St st until left front measures 10 (11, 12, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23)cm / 4 (4¹/₄, 4³/₄, 5, 6, 6¹/₂, 7¹/₂, 8¹/₄, 9)" from picked-up row, ending with a WS row. Do not break yarn.

Join fronts and back

Next row (RS): K across 28 (30, 34, 36, 42, 50, 56, 62, 70) left front sts, using backwards loop method cast on 1 (0, 1, 2, 2, 1, 0, 1, 2) sts, k across 78 (84, 94, 100, 116, 130, 144, 158, 176) held back sts, using backwards loop method cast on 1 (0, 1, 2, 2, 1, 0, 1, 2) sts, k across 28 (30, 34, 36, 42, 50, 56, 62, 70) held right front sts. 136 (144, 164, 176, 204, 232, 256, 284, 320) sts **Next row (WS):** Purl.

Break yarn A and join yarns C and D.

Body

Row 1 (RS): K3 with yarn C, [k2 with yarn D, k2 with yarn C] to last st, k1 with C. **Row 2 (WS):** P3 with yarn C, [p2 with yarn D, p2 with yarn C] to last st, p1 with yarn C. Rep rows 1-2 until body measures 20cm / 7³/₄" from underarm or 3.5cm / 1¹/₄" less than desired length, then rep row 1 only once more. Break yarns.

Waistband

Change to smaller needles and join yarn B. **Set-up row (WS):** P2tog, p to end. 135 (143, 163, 175, 203, 231, 255, 283, 319) sts **Row 1 (RS):** [K1, p1] to last st, k1. **Row 2 (WS):** P1, [k1, p1] to end. Rep rows 1-2 until waistband measures 3.5cm / 1¹/₄", ending with a WS row. Set up for tubular cast-off as foll: **Set-up row 1 (RS):** [K1, s11 wyif] to last st, k1. **Set-up row 2 (WS):** [S11 wyif, k1] to last st, s11 wyif.

Cast off all sts using the tubular cast-off method.

Collar

With RS facing, using yarn D and smaller needles, beg at bottom corner of right front, pick up and knit evenly at a rate of approx. 3 sts per 4 rows along the right front edge, then pick up and knit 1 st per cast-on st of right shoulder, back neck and left shoulder, then pick up and knit evenly at a rate of approx. 3 sts per 4 rows along the left front edge. The final stitch count must be an odd number.

Work 2 rows in 1x1 Rib pattern (flat).

Short row shaping

Short row 1 (WS): K1, patt to last 40 sts, turn.Short row 2 (RS): Create DS, patt to last 40 sts, turn.Short row 3: Create DS, patt to 1 st before DS, turn.

Short row 4: Create DS, patt to 1 st before DS, turn.
Rep Short rows 3-4, a further 13 times.
Next row (WS): Create DS, patt to end resolving DS.
Next row (RS): Patt to end resolving DS.
Work 8 rows in 1x1 Rib pattern.
Next row (WS): [K1, p1] to last 3 sts, k1, p2tog. 1 st dec
Set up for tubular cast-off as foll:
Set-up row 1 (RS): [K1, sl1 wyif] to end.
Set-up row 2 (WS): [K1, sl1 wyif] to end.
Cast off all sts using the tubular cast-off method.

Sleeves (both alike)

With RS facing, using yarn A and larger needles suitable for working small circumferences in the round, beginning at centre of underarm, pick up and knit 18 (19, 22, 24, 31, 37, 42, 48, 53) sts evenly up armhole to held shoulder sts, knit across 31 (35, 35, 37, 37, 39, 41, 43, 45) shoulder sts, pick up and knit 18 (19, 22, 24, 31, 37, 42, 48, 53) sts evenly down armhole to underarm, PM to indicate beg of round. 67 (73, 79, 85, 99, 113, 125, 139, 151) sts Knit 2 rounds.

Dec round: K1, k2tog, k to last 3 sts, ssk, k1. 2 sts dec

Rep Dec round for your size as foll:

Size 1: Rep Dec round every 12 rounds a further 6 times, then every 14 rounds a further 2 times. 49 sts

Size 2: Rep Dec round every 10 rounds a further 10 times. 51sts

Sizes 3 and 4: Rep Dec round every 8 rounds a further 12 times. 53 (59) sts

Size 5: Rep Dec round every 4 rounds a further 8 times, then every 6 rounds a further 10 times. 61 sts

Size 6: Rep Dec round every 4 rounds a further 20 times, then every 6 rounds a further 2 times. 67 sts

Size 7: Rep Dec round every 2 rounds a further 7 times, then every 4 rounds a further 19 times. *71 sts*

Size 8: Rep Dec round every 2 rounds a further 13 times, then every 4 rounds a further 16 times. 79 sts

Size 9: Rep Dec round every 2 rounds a further 19 times, then every 4 rounds a further 11 times. 89 sts

ALL sizes again

Work straight in St st until sleeve measures 40.5 (40.5, 38.5, 38.5, 35.5, 35.5, 32.5, 32.5, 29.5)cm / 16 (16, 15¹/₄, 15¹/₄, 14, 12³/₄, 12³/₄, 11¹/₂)" from underarm, or 4cm / 1¹/₂" less than desired length.

Note: Decreases can be stopped early to accommodate desired sleeve length if required. Break yarn A.

Cuff

Join yarn B.

Set-up round: K2tog, k to end. 48 (50, 52, 58, 60, 66, 70, 78, 88) sts Work in 1x1 Rib until cuff measures 3.5cm / 1¹/₄". Break yarn B. Join yarn C.

Next round: Knit.


Set up for tubular cast-off as foll: **Set-up round 1:** [K1, sl1 wyif] to end. **Set-up round 2:** [Sl1 wyib, p1] to end. Cast off all sts using the tubular cast-off method.

FINISHING

Weave in ends and block to measurements.

a. Finished chest circumference: 70 (73.5, 82.5, 88, 101, 113.5, 124.5, 137, 153.5)cm / 27¹/₂ (29, 32¹/₂, 34³/₄, 39³/₄, 44³/₄, 49, 54, 60¹/₂)"

b. Shoulder placket width: 13 (14.5, 14.5, 15.5, 15.5, 16, 17, 18, 19)cm / 5 (5³/₄, 5³/₄, 6, 6, 6¹/₄, 6¹/₂, 7, 7¹/₂)"

c. Shoulder placket length: 11.5 (13, 14, 15.5, 18.5, 21.5, 24, 27, 30.5)cm / 4¹/₂ (5, 5¹/₂, 6, 7¹/₄, 8¹/₂, 9¹/₂, 10¹/₂, 12)"

d. Sleeve length from underarm to cuff (without shoulder placket): 44.5 (44.5, 42.5, 42.5, 39.5, 39.5, 36.5, 36.5, 33.5) cm / $17\frac{1}{2}$ ($17\frac{1}{2}$, $16\frac{3}{4}$, $16\frac{3}{4}$, $15\frac{1}{2}$, $15\frac{1}{2}$, $14\frac{1}{4}$, $14\frac{1}{4}$, 13)"

e. Upper arm circumference: 30 (33, 36, 39, 45, 51, 57, 63, 69)cm / 11³/₄ (13, 14, 15¹/₄, 17³/₄, 20, 22¹/₂, 24³/₄, 27)"

f. Cuff circumference: 22 (23, 24, 26, 28, 30, 32, 36, 40) cm / 8¹/₂ (9, 9¹/₂, 10¹/₄, 11, 11³/₄, 12¹/₂, 14, 15³/₄)"

g. Length (hem to underarm): 24cm / 10"
