#### **MATERIALS**

# **Baby Cotton Organic**

(7), 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 skeins of col. 15

Crochet hook 3.5 mm / US E/4

# YARN QUALITY

**Baby Cotton Organic**, Hobbii 100% Egyptian Cotton, 50 g (1.75 oz) = 170 m (185 yds)

# **GAUGE**

Arcade pattern / 4 shells x 10 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" Square = 12 cm x 12 cm / 5 3/4 x 5 3/4 "

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

ch = chain
sl st = slip stitch
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
tc = triple crochet
dc2(4,5)tog - 2(4,5) dc crochet together
Rep = repeat

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#### SIZE

(1), 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8

#### **MEASUREMENTS**

Width, across the squares: (38), 44, 50, 55, 61, 66, 71, 77 cm / (15"), 17.25", 19.75", 21.75", 24", 26", 28", 30.25"

Width, across the bottom: (57), 63, 69, 74, 80, 85, 90, 96 cm / (22.5"), 24.75", 27.25", 29.25", 31.5", 33.5", 35.5", 37.75"

Length: 66 cm / 26" or preferred length Sleeve width: (16), 16, 16, 22, 22, 22, 22, 22 cm / (6.25"), 6.25", 6.25", 8.75", 8.75", 8.75", 8.75"

Sleeve length: 22 cm / 8.75" or preferred length

The model is 168 cm / 5 feet, 6" tall with a bust circumference of 90 cm / 35.5". She is wearing a size 1.

#### PATTERN INFORMATION

This dress is an exciting project for anyone looking to improve their crochet skills, yet it's still clear and easy enough for beginners. The dress is made using lace flower squares combined with the ever-popular Arcade stitch. The pattern provides detailed instructions on joining the squares at every stage. You'll learn how to connect 2, 3, and 4 squares with step-by-step directions and photos. Additionally, the pattern teaches you how to crochet the Arcade stitch and make increases within it.

# **INFO AND TIPS**

If you're between two sizes, choose the smaller size. The pattern is highly flexible—you can easily adjust the sleeve length, skirt length, and even the depth of the neckline by adding extra rounds of granny stitches.

# **SQUARE FLOWER PATTERN**

Ch 4, join with sl st to the first ch to form a circle.

Round 1: Ch 2 (count as the part of the first dc2tog), dc into the circle, ch 3, (dc2tog into the circle, ch 3) five times, join with sl st to top of the first dc2tog. 6 petals.

Round 2: SI st in next ch-3 space, ch 3 (count as the first dc), 4 dc in the same space, ch 2, (5 dc in next ch-3 space, ch 2) five times, join with sI st to top of ch 3.


Round 3: Ch 3 (count as the first dc), dc in next 4 dc, ch 5, (dc in next 5 dc, ch 5) five times, join with sl st to top of ch 3.

Round 4: Ch 2 (count as the part of the first dc5tog), dc4tog in next 4 dc, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 space, ch 5, (dc5tog in next 5 dc, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 space, ch 5) five times, join with sl st to top of the first dc4tog. 6 petals.

Round 5: SI st in next ch-5 space, ch 4 (count as the first dc), 2 tc in same space, ch 3, 3 tc in same space, ch 2, (3 dc in next ch-5 space, ch 2) twice, \* 3 tc in next ch-5 space, ch 3, 3 tc in same space, ch 2, (3 dc in next ch-5 space, ch 2) twice \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* twice, join with sI st to top of ch 4.

NOTE: You only need to complete all 5 rounds on one square. For the other squares, crochet only the first 4 rounds, and join them to each other while working the 5th round.






# **JOINING**

How to join 2 squares:


Round 5: SI st in next ch-5 space, ch 4 (count as the first dc), 2 tc in same space, ch 1, sc in any corner of the finished square, ch 1, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square,

(ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the finished square, 3 dc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square) twice, ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the finished square,

3 tc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square, ch 1, sc in ch-3 space of the finished square, ch 1, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square, finish the 5th round.







How to join 3 squares:

Round 5: SI st in next ch-5 space, ch 4 (count as the first dc), 2 tc in same space, ch 1, sc in the first corner of the finished square, ch 1, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square,

(ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the finished square, 3 dc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square) twice, ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the finished square,

3 tc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square, ch 1, sc in ch-3 space of the finished square, ch 1, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square, finish the 5th round.





How to join 4 squares:


Round 5: SI st in next ch-5 space, ch 4 (count as the first dc), 2 tc in same space, ch 1, sc in the first corner of the finished upper square, ch 1, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square,

(ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the upper finished square, 3 dc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square) twice, ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the upper finished square,

3 tc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square, ch 1, sc in ch-3 space of the upper finished square, sc in next ch-3 space of the left square, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square (photo 3),

(ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the left finished square, 3 dc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square) twice, ch 1, sc in next ch-2 space of the left finished square,

3 tc in next ch-5 space of the unfinished square, ch 1, sc in ch-3 space of the left finished square, ch 1, 3 tc in same space of the unfinished square, finish the 5th round.



You need to connect 3 rows of squares, with (7), 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 squares in each row-body part (ptoto 1). And, (3), 3, 3, 4, 4, 4, 4 squares in 1 row for the sleeves (photo 2).







#### SKIRT PATTERN

Connect the yarn to any ch-2 space and start crocheting the arcade stitch around:

Round 1: Ch 3 (count as the first dc), 2 dc in same space, ch 2, \* 3 dc in next ch-space, ch 2 \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the round, join with sl st to top of ch 3.

Round 2: Sc in next dc, 5 dc in next ch-2 space, \* skip next dc, sc in next dc, 5 dc in next ch-2 space \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the round, join with sl st to the first sc.

Round 3: SI st in next 2 dc, ch 3 (count as the first dc), dc in next 2 dc, ch 2, \* skip next sc and next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 2 \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the round, join with sI st to top of ch 3.

Rep Round 2-3 until you reach the desired length. If your hip measurement is significantly larger than your chest, you'll need to make the skirt wider as follows:

NOTE: I crocheted 12 rounds of the pattern before I started increasing, but you should crochet as many rounds as needed to fit your curves. You can also choose not to make any increases.

Finish with Round 2 and start increasing the number of stitches in rounds:

Round 13: SI st in next 2 dc, ch 3 (count as the first dc), dc in next 2 dc, ch 3, \* skip next sc and next dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 3 \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the round, join with sI st to top of ch 3.

Round 14: Sc in next dc, 7 dc in next ch-3 space, \* skip next dc, sc in next dc, 7 dc in next ch-3 space \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the round, join with sl st to the first sc.

Round 15: SI st in next 3 dc, ch 3 (count as the first dc), dc in next 2 dc, ch 3, \* skip next sc and next 2 dc, dc in next 3 dc, ch 3 \*\*, rep from \* to \*\* to the end of the round, join with sl st to top of ch 3.









## **SLEEVES**

Connect the yarn to any ch-2 space and repeat the skirt pattern around the sleeves. Crochet 6 rows or as many rows as you need. Then, attach the sleeves to the body by tying them to the sides of the body part.







# **NECKLINE**

Round 1: Connect the yarn to any ch-2 space, ch 3 (count as the first dc), 2 dc in same space, \* ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-space \*\*, repeat from \* to \*\* around the body and the sleeves, join with sl st to top of ch 3.

Round 2-5: SI st in next 2 dc, sI st in next ch-1 space, ch 3 (count as the first dc), 2 dc in same space, ch-1, \* 3 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1 \*\*, repeat from \* to \*\* around, join with sI st to top of ch 3.

Round 6-7: SI st in next 2 dc, sI st in next ch-1 space, ch 3 (count as the first dc), dc in same space, ch 1, \* 2 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1 \*\*, repeat from \* to \*\* around, join with sI st to top of ch 3.

Round 8: SI st in next dc, sI st in next ch-1 space, ch 1, sc in same space, 4 dc in next ch-1 space, \* sc in next ch-1 space, 4 dc in next ch-1 space \*\*, repeat from \* to \*\* around, join with sI st to the first sc.

NOTE: Repeat Rounds 2-5 as many times as needed to create an upper neckline. Repeat Rounds 6-7 as many times as needed to make the neckline narrower.
