MATERIALS

Acacia

1 skein of color 02
1 skein of color 17
1 skein of color 10
1 skein of color 16
1 skein of color 15

Crochet hook 4 mm / US G/6

YARN QUALITY

 Acacia, Hobbii

51 % Acrylic, 49 % Cotton
100 g / 3.5 oz = 250 m / 273 yds

GAUGE (dc)

15 sts x 9 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
sl st = slip stitch
sts = stitches
ps = puff stitch
bo = bobble stitch
rsc = crab stitch
tr = treble stitch

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 60 cm / 23.5"
Length: 100 cm / 39.25"

Special stitches

ps = puff stitch: yarn over, insert hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop. Repeat this step 3 times in the same stitch until you have 7 loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops, then ch 1 to secure.

bo = bobble stitch: yarn over, insert hook into the stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop. Yarn over, pull through two loops. Repeat this step 4 times in the same stitch until you have 5 loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through all loops.

rsc = crab stitch: insert hook into the previous stitch, yarn over and pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through both loops on the hook. Repeat in each stitch across.

Striped Square

You'll need 7 dc squares in total in the following color combination:



1x col. 15 and col. 16



1x col. 17 and col. 15



2x col. 10 and col. 02



1x col. 02 and col. 17



2x col. 16 and col. 10

Ch 35. Crochet in rows. Alternate between two colors in every row.

R1: Skip 3 sts, dc in the next 32 sts. (33)

R2: attach the new yarn color, ch 3, turn, dc 32. (33)

R3-R16: repeat row 2.

Flower Granny Square

Follow these steps below, and don't worry if it curls a bit, we'll fix that with blocking later.

Make a total of 8 flower granny squares (see color combinations below)

Start with a Mr. This will be the center of your flower. Crochet in rounds.

R1: ch 3 (counts as your first dc), then make 15 dc into the ring. Join the round with a sl st. Cut the yarn and change color. (16)

R2: Attach the new yarn. Insert your hook into any stitch and pull up a loop. Make 16 ps, joining the round with a sl st. Cut the yarn and change color. (16)

R3: Insert your hook between two puff stitches and ch 3. Make 16 bo, joining with a sl st. Cut the yarn and change color. (16)

Tip: Remember, the bobble stitches should go between the puff stitches. If your flower curls a bit at the edges, that's okay, we'll block it later.

Turning it into a granny square:

R4: Attach the yarn between two bobble stitches. Ch 4 (counts as the first tr), then make 2 tr in the same space. Ch 1, then make 3 tr in the same space to create the first corner. In the next 3 stitches, make 3 dc in each. Repeat this pattern to form all four corners and sides. Join with a sl st. (67)

R5-R9: Continue working granny square rounds until each side of your square has 32 stitches.

Assembly

Arrange the squares into a large rectangle with 3 squares across and 5 squares down (3x5). To create a fun design, alternate between striped squares and flower granny squares. You can refer to the picture for the layout.





Use the flat slip stitch technique with yellow yarn to join the squares. This method creates a neat, flat seam that doesn't add bulk.

How to do the flat slip stitch join: Place two squares together with the wrong sides facing each other. Insert your hook through the outer loops of both squares. Yarn over and pull through both loops and the loop on your hook. Continue slip stitching across the edge until you reach the end. Repeat this process to join all the squares into your 3x5 rectangle.

Border

The border is made with crab stitch in col. 15.

Attach your yarn in any corner of the blanket. Ch 1 and insert your hook into the previous stitch (moving from left to right instead of the usual right to left). Yarn over and pull up a loop. Yarn over again and pull through both loops on the hook. Continue this stitch around the entire blanket. When you reach the starting point, join with a sl st, cut the yarn, and weave in the ends.
