

KNITTING PATTERN

Cuddle Goose

Soft Toy

MATERIALS

Baby Snuggle Solid

1 skein of col. 02 - Yarn A 1 skein of col. 07 - Yarn B

Circular needles 5 mm / US 8
Stuffing
Blunt sewing needle
Leftover brown yarn for embroidered details

YARN QUALITY

Baby Snuggle Solid, Hobbii 100% Polyester 100 g / 3.5 oz = 120 m / 131 yds

GAUGE

12 sts x 21 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" in stockinette stitch

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 50 cm / 20"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This sleepy goose is a lovely soft friend for bedtime or to snuggle for comfort.

The floppy wings can cuddle a child and the goose's head rests soothingly on your shoulder.

Knitted flat and seamed this is a quick and easy project. Leave long tails on CO and BO sections for sewing up.

ABBREVIATIONS

CO = Cast on

k = knit

p = purl

Kfb = knit into front and then back of the same stitch (increase 1 stitch)

K2tog = knit the following 2 stitches together as one stitch (Decrease 1 stitch)

stst = stockinette stitch: knit 1 row, purl 1 row. (Makes 2 rows) Pattern indicates whether to start with a k or p row.

rep = repeat

BO = bind off (Cast Off)

C&T = cut yarn and thread through remaining stitches. Slide stitches off the needle.

beg = begin

Body, neck and Head

Cast on 8 sts using 5 mm needles and Yarn A. Starting at the base.

Row 1 Purl.

Row 2 *Kfb, rep from * to end of row. [16 sts].

Rows 3-5 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 6 *K1, kfb, rep from * to end of row. [24 sts]

Rows 7-9 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 10 *K2, kfb rep from * to end of row. [32 sts]

Rows 11-27 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 17 rows.

Row 28 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [24 sts]

Rows 29-33 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 5 rows.



Row 34 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [18 sts]

Rows 35-39 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 5 rows.

Start of neck

Row 40 *K1, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [12 sts]

Rows 41-51 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 11 rows.

Start of head

Row 52 *K1, kfb, rep from * to end of row. [18 sts]

Rows 53-55 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 56 *K2, kfb rep from * to end of row. [24 sts]

Rows 57-63 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 7 rows.

Row 64 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [18 sts]

Rows 65-67 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 68 *K1, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [12 sts]

Change to Yarn B

Rows 69-71 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 72 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [9 sts]

Rows 73-75 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 76 *K1, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [6 sts]

Rows 77-79 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 80 *K2tog, rep from * to end of row. [3 sts]

Row 81 C&T.

Wings (make two)

Use yarn A and 5mm needles CO 16sts.

Row 1 Purl.

Row 2 *K1, kfb, rep from *to end of row. [24 sts].

Rows 3-5 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 6 *K2, kfb, rep from * to end of row. [32 sts]

Rows 7-17 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 11 rows.

Row 18 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [24 sts]

Rows 19-23 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 5 rows.

Row 24 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [18 sts]

Rows 25-29 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 5 rows.

Row 30 *K1, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [12 sts]



Rows 31-37 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 7 rows.

Row 38 *K2, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [9 sts]

Rows 39-41 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 42 *K1, k2tog, rep from * to end of row. [6 sts]

Row 43 Purl.

Row 44 *K2tog, rep from * to end of row. [3 sts]

Row 45 C&T

Feet (make two)

Use yarn A and 5mm needles CO 9 sts. Starting at the top of the leg.

Rows 1-6 Beg with a K row, work in stst for 6 rows.

Row 7 *K1, kfb, rep from * to last st, k1. [13 sts]

Row 8 Purl.

Row 9 K1. Kfb, k3, kfb, k1, kfb, k3, kfb, k1. [17 sts].

Row 10 Purl.

Row 11 K1. Kfb, k5, kfb, k1, kfb, k5, kfb, k1. [21 sts].

Rows 12-14 Beg with a P row, work in stst for 3 rows.

Row 15 BO.

Making up

All seams are mattress stitched with wrong sides together, unless otherwise directed.

Body, Neck and Head

Gather the CO stitches at the base. Sew the body, neck and head seam, leaving a gap in the back of the body and the head for stuffing. Pull the C&T yarn to close tip of the beak and sew the beak seam. Stuff the body, do not over fill the body as it is a slightly flattened oval shape. Stuff the neck lightly so the head will flop a little. Stuff the rounded head and beak carefully, ensure the tip of the beak is stuffed. Sew closed the gaps used for stuffing..

Use 2 strands of chunky brown yarn to embroider the goose's eyes.





Each eye consists of a vertical st 1 row long, then a diagonal st over 1 st and 1 row, followed by a horizontal st, 1 st wide, next a diagonal st over 1 st and 1 row, and finally a vertical st 1 row long.

Position the eyes with the horizontal lower edge 2 rows before the start of the beak, and 1.5cm / 0.6" apart.

Wings

Pull the C&T yarn to close the tip of each wing. Fold each wing in half and sew along the row ends and the CO edge. Position the wings horizontally on either side of the body, with the folded edge at the start of the neck Row 40. Pin and sew into place.





Feet

Fold the feet in half with the wrong sides together. Sew the BO edges to close the top of the foot, then oversew the side and CO edge. Do not stuff the feet.

Position the feet either side of the CO gather at the base of the goose with the seams facing towards each other. Pin and sew into place.
