Hobbii Friends Cotton 8/4

2 skeins of Beige (05)
1 skein of Antique Rose (53)
1 skein of Open Sea (79)

Hobbii Diablo

1 skein of col. Light Petrol Blue (55)

Hobbii Embroidery Yarn

Colours: 109, 211, 268, 711, 890, 900

Crochet hooks 2.5 mm / US 4/0
and 3.0 mm / US 5/0

Fiberfill
Yarn needle
Embroidery needle
Stitch markers
Sewing pins
Small button
Scissors

YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Cotton 8/4**, Hobbii

100% cotton
50 g (1.75 oz) = 160 m (175 yds)

 **Diablo**, Hobbii

40% acrylic, 30% mohair, 30% polyamide
25 g (0.9 oz) = 225 m (246 yds)

SIZE

Onesize

MEASUREMENTS

Height of the bunny: approx. 28 cm / 11"

Zoe the Spring Bunny is a crochet pattern designed for intermediate skill levels. Made from soft cotton yarn, Zoe has a smooth, sleek finish that highlights the precision of her design. She stands out with her adorable overalls with embroidered little flowers and delicately stitched eyes, giving her an expressive and sweet look. With step-by-step instructions, this pattern is perfect for crocheters looking to add a beautiful, detailed project to their collection or make a thoughtful, handmade gift for a loved one this spring season.

INFO AND TIPS

- Read the pattern before starting crocheting.
- Crochet in continuous, spiral rounds unless otherwise stated in the pattern.
- Stuff your amigurumi firmly as you go.
- Try to make tight stitches to avoid the holes.
- Always mark the beginning of each round/row using a stitch marker.
- Pattern is written for intermediate skill level and doesn't contain tutorials for stitches.
- Pattern requires basic embroidery and sewing skills.

ABBREVIATIONS, US terminology

MR = magic ring

ch = chain

sc = single crochet, I use "x" shaped single crochet for the bunny and regular sc for the overalls and headband

scinc = work 2sc in the same st to increase

scdec = invisible single crochet decrease (crochet 2 sts together in only front loops)

Rnd = round/rounds

Row = row/rows

slst = slip stitch

st = stitch/stitches

FLO = front loop only

(..) = number of stitches at the end of the round



ZOE THE SPRING BUNNY PATTERN

LEG (make 2)

Start with Friends Cotton 8/4 col. (05) and 2.5mm crochet hook. Stuff firmly as you go.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into a MR (6)
- Rnd 2:** scinc x6 (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, scinc) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** (2sc, scinc) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5:** (3sc, scinc) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6 – 7:** 1sc in each stitch around, 2 rounds (30)
- Rnd 8:** (3sc, scdec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 9:** 8sc, scdec x4, 8sc (20)
- Rnd 10:** 8sc, scdec x2, 8sc (18)
- Rnd 11 – 35:** 1sc in each stitch around, 25 rounds (18)

Fasten off and weave in ends in the first leg. Do not fasten off the second leg, we're going to join both legs and continue to the body.

BODY

Continue with the col. (05) and 2.5mm crochet hook. Stuff firmly as you go.

Now we're going to join the legs. Keep them slightly towards each other. Joining stitch should be on the front.

- Rnd 36:** ch6, sc to join the first leg, 17sc, 1sc into the each of ch6, 18sc into the second leg (48)
- Rnd 37 – 46:** 1sc in each stitch around, 10 rounds (48)

Now, we're going to move our beginning stitch on the back. To do this make a number of stitches to reach the back. I made 30sc.

- Rnd 47:** (6sc, scdec) x6 (42)
- Rnd 48:** 1sc in each stitch around (42)
- Rnd 49:** (5sc, scdec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 50:** 1sc in each stitch around (36)
- Rnd 51:** (4sc, scdec) x6 (30)
- Rnd 52:** 1sc in each stitch around (30)
- Rnd 53:** (3sc, scdec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 54:** 1sc in each stitch around (24)
- Rnd 55:** (2sc, scdec) x6 (18)
- Rnd 56:** 1sc in each stitch around (18)
- Rnd 57:** (1sc, scdec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 58:** 1sc in each stitch around (12)

Do not cut the yarn. Continue with the head. Stuff firmly as you go, especially the upper part of the body and the neck.



HEAD

Rnd 59: FLO scinc x12 (24)

Rnd 60: (1sc, scinc) x12 (36)

Rnd 61: (2sc, scinc) x12 (48)

Rnd 62: (7sc, scinc) x6 (54)

Rnd 63: (8sc, scinc) x6 (60)

Rnd 64 – 75: 1sc in each stitch around, 12 rounds (60)

Rnd 76: (8sc, scdec) x6 (54)

Rnd 77: (7sc, scdec) x6 (48)

Rnd 78: (6sc, scdec) x6 (42)

Rnd 79: (5sc, scdec) x6 (36)

Rnd 80: (4sc, scdec) x6 (30)

Rnd 81: (3sc, scdec) x6 (24)

Rnd 82: (2sc, scdec) x6 (18)

Rnd 83: (1sc, scdec) x6 (12)

Rnd 84: scdec x6 (6)

Fasten off, close the last round by weaving remaining yarn through front loops of all 6 stitches. Pull tightly and weave in all ends. Embroider eyes using black embroidery yarn between rounds 66 – 67 (6sts apart) and a nose between eyes, using light pink embroidery yarn.



EARS (make 2)

With the col. (05) and 2.5mm crochet hook. Do not stuff.

Rnd 1: 6sc into MR (6)

Rnd 2: (sc, scinc) x3 (9)

- Rnd 3:** 1sc in each stitch around (9)
Rnd 4: (2sc, scinc) x3 (12)
Rnd 5: (3sc, scinc) x3 (15)
Rnd 6: (4sc, scinc) x3 (18)
Rnd 7: (5sc, scinc) x3 (21)
Rnd 8: (6sc, scinc) x3 (24)
Rnd 9 – 20: 1sc in each stitch around, 12 rounds (24)
Rnd 21: (6sc, scdec) x3 (21)
Rnd 22: (5sc, scdec) x3 (18)
Rnd 23: (4sc, scdec) x3 (15)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Fold the ear in a half and using a needle sew the bottom part together. Position the ears on the top of the head and sew them between Rnds 79 and 82.



ARMS (make 2)

With the col. (05) and 2.5mm crochet hook. Stuff the bottom part of the arm firmly, the middle part, lightly. Do not stuff the upper part of the arm.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into MR (6)
Rnd 2: scinc x6 (12)
Rnd 3: (1sc, scinc) x6 (18)
Rnd 4 – 6: 1sc in each stitch around, 2 rounds (18)
Rnd 7: (1sc, scdec) x6 (12)
Rnd 8 – 26: 1sc in each stitch around, 19 rounds (12)

Press the top sides together and make 5sc to joining them. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Sew the arms to each side of the body between Rounds 54 and 55.



OVERALLS

With a 3mm crochet hook. Using Friends Cotton 8/4, col. (79) and Diablo, col. (55) held together.

FIRST LEG

Make 20ch, join to the first ch with a slst.

Rnd 1: ch1, 20sc, slst into the first sc. (20)

Rnd 2: ch1, (1sc, scinc) x10 (30)

Rnd 3 - 11: ch1, 1sc in each stitch around, 9 rounds (30)

Fasten off

SECOND LEG

Make a second leg in the same way as first one but do not cut the yarn. We're going to join both legs together.

Rnd 12: slst on to the first stitch of the first leg, ch1 then 30sc. Now move into the second leg and make 30sc. Slst into the first sc. (60)

Rnd 13 - 18: ch1, 1sc in each stitch around, slst into the first sc, 6 rounds (60)

From this point we're not joining the rounds. We're going to work in rows.

Row 1: ch1, scdec x30, ch1, turn (30)

Row 2 - 6: 1sc in each stitch, ch1, turn (30)

Row 7: (3sc, scdec) x6, (24)

At the end, make 4ch, slst to create a button hole.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

STRAPS

Attach the yarn into the back left side of the overalls, make 7ch and slst to the front left side (first strap) then make 7sc to reach the right front side. Make 7ch and slst into the right back side (second strap). Fasten off and weave in ends.

To finish the overalls, embroider a few simple, little flowers and leaves at the front, and sew a little button at the back.



HEADBAND

With Friends Cotton 8/4 col. (53) and 2.5mm crochet hook

Row 1: ch3, sc into the second ch from the hook, sc in last ch, ch1, turn (2)

Row 2 - 53: sc in each st, ch1, turn (2)

During work try to fit the headband to the bunny's head, adjust the length by adding or removing rows. Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Using a needle sew both ends together creating a headband.

Bow

With the col. (53) and 2.5mm crochet hook

Ch30, slst into a first ch. Be careful not to twist the chain.

Rnd 1 - 6: ch1, 1sc in each st around, slst into a first sc, 6 rounds (30)

Fasten off leaving a long tail. Wind the tail around the middle of the bow and secure then sew the bow to the headband.

You can sew the headband to the bunny's head or leave it as it is and make it removable.
