Happy Bear

Baby Blanket and beanie

MATERIALS

Daily Stitch Wool Blend Tweed

1 skein of col. 09
1 skein of col. 03
1 skein of col. 12

Crochet hook 6 mm (J-10)

Scissors

Needle

Tape measure

YARN QUALITY

 **Daily Stitch Wool Blend Tweed**, Hobbii

80 % Acrylic, 15% Wool, 5% Viscose

100 g / 3.5 oz = 168 m / 183 yds

GAUGE

13 sc x 14 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

Note: Wash and dry your sample before making measurements.

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Blanket: 64 x 58 cm / 25.25 x 22.75"

Beanie width / depth: 17 x 14 cm / 6.75 x 5.5"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This tricolored textured tweed blanket has a timeless, classic look, perfect for a relaxing crochet session where you can enjoy every stitch. The set also includes an adorable matching beanie with little ears, adding an extra touch of cuteness.

ABBREVIATIONS

rnd = round

st(s) = stitch(es)

sp(s) = space(s)

sl st = slip stitch

ch = chain

sc = single crochet

hdc = half double crochet

dc = double crochet

fpdc = front post double crochet

trtr = treble treble crochet: yarn over x4, insert hook in stitch as pattern requires, grab the yarn and pull up a loop, (yarn over, pull through 2 loops) x5

bobble = insert hook in corresponding stitch 5 rows below from front to back, grab the yarn and pull up a loop, (yarn over, insert hook in same space, grab the yarn and pull up a loop) x2, yarn over and pull through all 6 loops on hook

INFO AND TIPS

This pattern includes instructions for crocheting two items: a baby blanket and a beanie with ears. I recommend starting with the beanie: use as much yarn as you need, and you can use up all the remaining yarn to make the baby blanket. However, I provide the number of rows where the color switch is needed.

The **beanie** is crocheted in rounds, starting from the crown and working downward. The ears are crocheted separately and sewn onto the finished beanie.

The **baby blanket** is worked in back-and-forth rows, with odd rows being the right side and even rows the wrong side. Work 1 stitch from the current row into 1 stitch from the previous row, unless otherwise stated. Also, work 2 stitches into the ch2-sp.

BEANIE

Info: Rounds 1 through 19: Start with a ch1 (does not count as a stitch) and finish by joining with a sl st to the 1st sc.

With col. 03, magic ring and pull up a loop.

Rnd 1: 8 sc into the ring. Tighten the ring. (Total: 8 sc)

Rnd 2: (Sc, 2 sc in next st) x4. (Total: 12 sc)

Rnd 3: (Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st) x4. (Total: 16 sc)

Rnd 4: (Sc, 2 sc in next st) x8. (Total: 24 sc)

Rnd 5: (Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st) x8. (Total: 32 sc)

Rnd 6: 32 sc.

Rnd 7: (Sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st) x8. (Total: 40 sc)

When you finish this round, switch the color from col. 03 to col. 09: make the very last sc with the current color, insert the hook into the 1st sc, and complete a sl st with the new color.

Rnd 8: 40 sc.

Rnd 9: 5 sc, 2 fpdc*, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 14 sc, 2 fpdc, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 9 sc. (Total: 32 sc, 8 fpdc)

**Work fpdc around st 2 rounds below.*

Rnd 10: 40 sc.

Rnd 11: 6 sc, 2 fpdc*, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 14 sc, 2 fpdc, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 8 sc. (Total: 32 sc, 8 fpdc)

Rnds 12-14: Repeat rounds 10, 11, 10. Switch the color from col. 09 to col. 12 as described in round 7.

Rnd 15: 7 sc, 2 fpdc*, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 14 sc, 2 fpdc, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 7 sc. (Total: 32 sc, 8 fpdc)

Rnd 16: 40 sc.

Rnds 17-18: Repeat rounds 15-16.

Rnd 19: 8 sc, 2 fpdc*, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 14 sc, 2 fpdc, 2 sc, 2 fpdc, 6 sc. (Total: 32 sc, 8 fpdc)

Rnd 20: Ch3 (counts as dc), 39 dc, join with a sl st to 3rd ch of starting ch3. (Total: 40 dc).

Cut the yarn.

EARS

With col. 03, magic ring and pull up a loop.

Row 1: Ch3 (counts as dc), 5 dc into the ring. Tighten the ring. (Total: 6 dc)

Turn the work (now and each row).

Row 2: Ch3 (does not count as a st), 2 dc in same st as ch3, (2 dc in next dc) x5. (Total: 12 dc)

Row 3: Ch2 (does not count as a st), hdc in same st, (hdc in next st) x 11. (Total: 12 hdc)

Leave a long tail for sewing. Make 2 ears.

SEWING THE EARS

To finish the hat, sew the ears onto the beanie. The back of the beanie is where you started and ended the rounds. The fpdc are placed on both sides of the head: on the left, there are 4 fpdc (two in the front, two in the back, with 2 sc between them, roughly dividing the front from the back), and the same goes for the right side. The ears should be positioned along the line formed by the 2 sc on each side (between the two pairs of fpdc). The front-facing side of the first and third rows of the ears should face backward, while the second row should face forward. Below, you'll see a close-up photo of the ear: this is the final look it will have from the front and back once attached.

The image below shows how to position the right ear. On the left is the back of the beanie, and on the right is the front. The green line represents the attachment point of the straight part of the ear (the starting/ending line of the rows), positioned in the middle between 2 sc (vertically). Horizontally, it goes from the point between rounds 5-6 (one end of row 2 of the ear) to the point between rounds 10-11 (the other end of row 2 of the ear).

The blue lines indicate where to place the first and last hdc of row 3 of the ear (the stitches of the last row should be slightly bent forward).

Using the long tail and a needle, attaching the edge of the ear and the corresponding points on the beanie, working along the blue, green, and second blue lines. Sew the left ear symmetrically between the other two pairs of fpdc.



BLANKET

With col. 12, ch84.

Row 1: Working in a back bump, dc in the 3rd ch from hook, dc in next 81 chains. (Total: 82 dc)

Turn the work (now and each row).

Row 2: Ch3, sc in same st as ch3, 81 sc. (Total: 82 sc)

Ch3 at the beginning of the row does not count as a st. In all next rows, start working the first stitch in same st as ch3.

Row 3: Ch3, 2 sc, (2 fpdc*, sk 2 sc, 12 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 15 sc) x2, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 12 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 2 sc. (Total: 70 sc, 12 fpdc)

**Work fpdc around dc 2 rows below. Make fpdc long enough to achieve a height of the row.*

Row 4: Ch3, 6 sc, (ch2, sk 2 sts, 29 sc) x2, ch2, sk 2 sts, 12 sc. (Total: 78 sc, 2 ch2-sps)

Row 5: Ch3, 2 sc, (2 fpdc*, sk 2 sc, 12 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 15 sc) x2, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 12 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 2 sc. (Total: 70 sc, 12 fpdc)

**Work fpdc around fpdc 2 rows below – now and each row.*

Row 6: Ch3, 12 sc, (ch2, sk 2 sts, 29 sc) x2, ch2, sk 2 sts, 6 sc. (Total: 78 sc, 2 ch2-sps)

Row 7: Ch3, 2 sc, (2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 trtr*, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 15 sc) x2, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 trtr, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 2 sc. (Total: 64 sc, 12 fpdc, 6 trtr)

**Work trtr in skipped sc four rows below (they are placed ahead from where we are working) in front of work – now and each row.*

Row 8: Repeat row 4.

Row 9: Ch3, 2 sc, (2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 trtr*, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 7 sc, bobble, 7 sc) x2, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 trtr, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 2 sc. (Total: 64 sc, 12 fpdc, 6 trtr).

**This time, skipped sc placed behind current stitch.*

Row 10: Repeat row 6.

Row 11: Ch3, 2 sc, (2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 trtr, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 15 sc) x2, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 trtr, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 2 sc. (Total: 64 sc, 12 fpdc, 6 trtr)

Row 12: Repeat row 4.

Row 13: Ch3, 2 sc, (2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 trtr, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 15 sc) x2, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 6 sc, 2 trtr, sk 2 sc, 4 sc, 2 fpdc, sk 2 sc, 2 sc. (Total: 64 sc, 12 fpdc, 6 trtr)

Rows 14-79: Repeat rows 6-13 eight times, and rows 6-7 one more time.

Switch the color from col. 12 to col. 09 after Row 30, and from col. 09 to col. 03 after Row 58.

How to switch colors

Work the color switch with the last single crochet in the row/round: with the current color, insert your hook into the stitch as the pattern requires, yarn over and pull up a loop (2 loops on the hook). Then, continue with the new color – yarn over and pull through both loops to complete the stitch.

Row 80: Repeat row 2.

Row 81: Repeat row 9.

Row 82: Repeat row 2.

Row 83: Repeat row 5.

Row 84: Ch3, dc in same st as ch3, 81 dc. (Total: 82 dc)

Cut the yarn.

Weave in ends. Wash and dry flat.
