MATERIALS

Hobbii **Rainbow Cotton 8/4**

2 skeins of col. Pearl Gray (73)

1 skein of col. Vanilla (52)

1 skein of col. Dusty Light Green (75)

1 skein of col. Old Rose (46)

Hobbii **Embroidery Yarn**

Colours black (900) and pink (262)

Crochet hooks: 2.50 mm (US C-2) and 3.50 mm (US E-4)

Go Handmade, Wooden ring, size 55mm

Go Handmade, Box rattle, 22mm

Fiberfill

Yarn needle

Embroidery needle

Stitch markers

Sewing pins

Scissors

YARN QUALITY

 **Rainbow Cotton 8/4**, Hobbii

100% cotton

50 g (1.75 oz) = 160 m (175 yds)

MEASUREMENTS

Rattle: approx. 10cm (4") high

Lovey: approx. 38x38cm (15x15")

This crochet pattern guides you through creating an adorable bunny lovey and a matching bunny rattle. With floppy ears and little flowers on their heads, these bunnies are designed in soft pastel colours, giving them a sweet, retro charm. Whether you're a beginner or an experienced crocheter, this easy-to-follow pattern will help you craft these precious, handmade toys that are perfect for little hands to cuddle and play with. Create a timeless gift that's sure to be loved!

Note! Make sure to attach everything really carefully if making it for babies.

INFO AND TIPS

- Read the pattern before starting to crochet.
- Crochet in continuous, spiral rounds unless otherwise stated in the pattern.
- Stuff your amigurumi firmly as you go.
- Try to make tight stitches to avoid the holes.
- Always mark the beginning of each round using a stitch marker
- Pattern is written for intermediate skill level and doesn't contain tutorials for stitches

ABBREVIATIONS

US terminology

MR = magic ring

ch = chain/chains

sc = single crochet, I use "x" shaped single crochet for the bunny and regular sc for the blanket

scinc = work 2sc in the same st to increase

scdec = invisible single crochet decrease (crochet 2 sts together in only front loops)

Rnd = round/rounds

Row = row/rows

slst = slip stitch

st/sts = stitch/stitches

dc = double crochet

(..) = number of stitches at the end of the round

dc cluster = 3dc into the same stitch

V-Stitch = 1dc, ch1, 1dc into the same stitch

BUNNY LOVEY

HEAD

Start with the colour (73) and 2.50mm crochet hook. Stuff firmly as you go.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into a MR (6)
- Rnd 2:** scinc x6 (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, scinc) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** (2sc, scinc) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5:** (3sc, scinc) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6:** (4sc, scinc) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7:** (5sc, scinc) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8:** (6sc, scinc) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9:** (7sc, scinc) x6 (54)
- Rnd 10:** (8sc, scinc) x6 (60)
- Rnd 11:** (9sc, scinc) x6 (66)
- Rnd 12:** (10sc, scinc) x6 (72)
- Rnd 13 – Rnd 24:** 1sc in each stitch around, 12 rounds (72)
- Rnd 25:** (10sc, scdec) x6 (66)
- Rnd 26:** (9sc, scdec) x6 (60)
- Rnd 27:** (8sc, scdec) x6 (54)
- Rnd 28:** (7sc, scdec) x6 (48)
- Rnd 29:** (6sc, scdec) x6 (42)
- Rnd 30:** (5sc, scdec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 31:** (4sc, scdec) x6 (30)
- Rnd 32:** (3sc, scdec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 33:** (2sc, scdec) x6 (18)
- Rnd 34:** (1sc, scdec) x6 (12)

Close the last round by weaving yarn through front loops of all 12 sts. Pull the yarn to close the hole and fasten off. Leave a long tail for sewing the head to the blanket.

EAR (make 2)

With the colour (73) and 2.50 mm crochet hook. Do not stuff.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into a MR (6)
- Rnd 2:** (sc, scinc) x3 (9)
- Rnd 3:** 1sc in each stitch around (9)
- Rnd 4:** (2sc, scinc) x3 (12)
- Rnd 5:** 1sc in each stitch around (12)
- Rnd 6:** (3sc, scinc) x3 (15)
- Rnd 7:** 1sc in each stitch around (15)
- Rnd 8:** (4sc, scinc) x3 (18)
- Rnd 9:** 1sc in each stitch around (18)
- Rnd 10:** (5sc, scinc) x3 (21)
- Rnd 11:** 1sc in each stitch around (21)
- Rnd 12:** (6sc, scinc) x3 (24)
- Rnd 13:** 1sc in each stitch around (24)
- Rnd 14:** (7sc, scinc) x3 (27)
- Rnd 15:** 1sc in each stitch around (27)

- Rnd 16:** (8sc, scinc) x3 (30)
Rnd 17 – Rnd 22: 1sc in each stitch around, 6 rounds (30)
Rnd 23: (8sc, scdec) x3 (27)
Rnd 24: 1sc in each stitch around (27)
Rnd 25: (7sc, scdec) x3 (24)
Rnd 26: 1sc in each stitch around (24)
Rnd 27: (6sc, scdec) x3 (21)
Rnd 28: 1sc in each stitch around (21)
Rnd 29: (5sc, sc dec) x3 (18)
Rnd 30: 1sc in each stitch around (18)
Rnd 31: (4sc, scdec) x3 (15)
Rnd 32: 1sc in each stitch around (15)
Rnd 33: (3sc, scdec) x3 (12)
Rnd 34: 1sc in each stitch around (12)

Fold the ear in a half and make 5sc through both sides to close it. Fasten off, leaving the long tail.

Make the second ear in the same way.



ARM (make 2)

With the colour (73) and 2.50 mm crochet hook. Stuff lightly as you go, mostly the hand.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into a MR (6)
Rnd 2: scinc x6 (12)
Rnd 3: (sc, scinc) x6 (18)
Rnd 4: (2sc, scinc) x6 (24)
Rnd 5 – Rnd 7: 1sc in each stitch around, 3 rounds (24)
Rnd 8: (2sc, scdec) x6 (18)
Rnd 9 – Rnd 13: 1sc in each stitch around, 5 rounds (18)
Rnd 14: (7sc, scdec) x2 (16)
Rnd 15 – Rnd 33: 1sc in each stitch around, 19 rounds (16)

Crochet 7sc through both sides of the arm to close it. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Make the second arm in the same way.



BLANKET

With 3.50 mm crochet hook. Start with colour (73).

Note:

Starting ch2 plus the first dc is counted as a first dc cluster.

Starting ch4 is counted as a sc and 3ch.

Rnd 1: Start with MR, ch2, dc and ch1, (dc cluster, ch1) x3. Slst into the second ch of the beginning ch2. You should have 4dc clusters and 4 ch1 spaces at the end of the round.

Rnd 2: Make slst into the next 2 sts. Ch2 into the ch1 space, 2dc into the same space, ch1, dc cluster into the same space, (dc cluster, ch1, dc cluster into the next ch1 space) x3. Slst into the second ch of the beginning ch2. You should have 8dc clusters and 4 ch1 spaces at the end of this round.

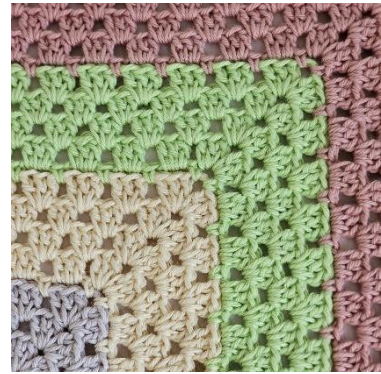
Rnd 3: Make slst into the next 2 sts. Ch2 into the ch1 space, 2dc into the same space, ch1, dc cluster into the same space. Now we're going to make dc cluster between two clusters of the previous round, (dc cluster, ch1, dc cluster into the next ch1 space, dc cluster into the space between the clusters of the previous round) x3. Slst into the second ch of the beginning ch2. You should have 12dc clusters and 4 ch1 spaces at the end of this round.

Rnd 4 – Rnd 6: Repeat the pattern from the Rnd 3, the same for the corners and for the spaces between the clusters, make a cluster in each space until you reach the corner. Fasten off the colour (73).

Rnd 7: Attach a colour (52) into a corner, make 4ch (count as a sc and ch3), sc into the same space. Then make ch3 and sc into the next space between the clusters. (ch3, sc into every space between the clusters and [sc, ch3, sc] into every corner) repeat around. Slst into the first ch of the beginning ch4.

Rnd 8: Slst into the next two sts (to reach the corner). Make (ch2, 2dc, ch1, dc cluster) into the corner. Repeat around (dc cluster in every ch3 space [dc cluster, ch1, dc cluster in every corner]). Slst into the second ch of the beginning ch2.

Rnd 9 – Rnd 11: Repeat Rounds 4 – 6. Fasten off the colour (52).



Rnd 12 – Rnd 16: Attach the colour (75) into a corner. Repeat Rounds 7 – 11. Fasten off the colour (75).

Rnd 17 – Rnd 21: Attach the colour (46) into a corner. Repeat Rounds 7 – 11. Fasten off the colour (46).

Rnd 22: Attach a colour (73) into a corner. Repeat Round 7.

Rnd 23 – Rnd 26: Slst into the next 2 sts (to reach the corner). Make ch2 (count as a first sc and ch1) and sc into the same corner space. Make 3sc in every ch3 around and (sc, ch1, sc) in every corner. Slst into the first ch of the beginning ch2.

These rounds create a little border. You can make a border wider if you like by adding a few more rounds.





FLOWER

Using colour (46) and a 2.50 mm crochet hook.

To make a flower we're going to use a V-Stitch (dc, ch1, dc) into the same stitch.

Ch24

Row 1: Dc in the second ch from the hook, ch1, dc into the same chain, ch1, skip the next chain. (V-Stitch into the next chain, ch1 and skip the next chain) repeat to the end of the chain. Ch1, turn.

Row 2: (6dc in every V-Stitch and slst in every ch1 space) repeat to the end. You should have 12 petals.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

To create a rose, roll the petals together into a circle then sew through each layer to secure them in place.



Assembly

Sew ears to the head on the Rnd 12 with approximately 19 stitches apart on the back.

Using a black cotton yarn, embroider the eyes between Rnds 20 – 21, with 10 visible stitches apart.

Using a pink cotton yarn, embroider the little nose between the eyes.

Sew the head onto the Rnd 2 of the blanket, facing the corner.

Sew arms under the head on both sides.



BUNNY RATTLE

HEAD

With colour (73) and 2.50 mm crochet hook. While stuffing the head, put the box rattle inside. Make sure that it's completely surrounded by the filling.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into a MR (6)
- Rnd 2:** scinc x6 (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, scinc) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** (2sc, scinc) x6 (24)
- Rnd 5:** (3sc, scinc) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6:** (4sc, scinc) x6 (36)
- Rnd 7:** (5sc, scinc) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8:** (6sc, scinc) x6 (48)
- Rnd 9 – Rnd 17:** 1sc in each stitch around, 9 rounds (48)
- Rnd 18:** (6sc, scdec) x6 (42)
- Rnd 19:** (5sc, scdec) x6 (36)
- Rnd 20:** (4sc, scdec) x6 (30)
- Rnd 21:** (3sc, scdec) x6 (24)
- Rnd 22:** (2sc, scdec) x6 (18)
- Rnd 23:** (1sc, scdec) x6 (12)
- Rnd 24:** scdec x6 (6)

Close the last round by weaving yarn through front loops of all 6 sts. Pull the yarn to close the hole and fasten off. Leave a long tail.

EAR (make 2)

With colour (73) and 2.50 mm crochet hook. Do not stuff.

- Rnd 1:** 6sc into a MR (6)
- Rnd 2:** (sc, scinc) x3 (9)
- Rnd 3:** 1sc in each stitch around (9)
- Rnd 4:** (2sc, scinc) x3 (12)
- Rnd 5:** 1sc in each stitch around (12)
- Rnd 6:** (3sc, scinc) x3 (15)
- Rnd 7:** 1sc in each stitch around (15)
- Rnd 8:** (4sc, scinc) x3 (18)
- Rnd 9 – Rnd 17:** 1sc in each stitch around, 9 rounds (18)
- Rnd 18:** (4sc, scdec) x3 (15)
- Rnd 19:** 1sc in each stitch around (15)
- Rnd 20:** (3sc, scdec) x3 (12)
- Rnd 21:** 1sc in each stitch around (12)

Fold the ear in half and make 5sc through both sides to close it. Fasten off, leaving the long tail.

Make the second ear in the same way.



RING COVER

With colour (73) and 2.50 mm crochet hook. Do not stuff.

Ch12

Row 1: Start from the second ch from the hook, 11sc.

Row 2 – Row 17: ch1, turn, 11sc.

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing.



FLOWER

Using colour (46) and 2.50 mm crochet hook.

To make a flower we're going to use a V-Stitch (dc, ch1, dc) into the same stitch.

Ch14

Row 1: Dc in the second ch from the hook, ch1, dc into the same chain, ch1, skip the next chain. (V-Stitch into the next chain, ch1 and skip the next chain) repeat to the end of the chain. Ch1, turn.

Row 2: (6dc in every V-Stitch and slst in every ch1 space) repeat to the end. You should have 7 petals.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

To create a rose, roll the petals together into a circle then sew through each layer to secure them in place.



Assembly

Sew ears to the head on the Rnd 8 with approximately 10 - 11 stitches apart on the back. Using a black cotton yarn, embroider the eyes on the head between Rnds 15 - 16, with 5 visible stitches apart.

Using a pink cotton yarn, embroider the little nose between the eyes.

Position the cover over your wooden ring and whip stitch the two sides together.

Sew the head onto the ring.

You can sew the rose on the head or wrap the tail around the neck and sew it on the ring, just below the chin, like I do. It's optional.
