MATERIALS

Daily Stitch Acrylic

3(3, 3, 4, 4) skeins of col 30

2(2, 2, 2, 2) skeins of col 28

1(2, 2, 2, 2) skein(s) of col 22

1(1, 1, 2, 2) skein(s) of col 26

Crochet hook 4 mm (US G/6)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8)

Stitch Markers

Tape Measure

Embroidery Needle

Scissors

YARN QUALITY

 **Daily Stitch Acrylic**, Hobbii

100 % Acrylic/Polyacryl

100 g / 3.5 oz. = 350 m /382 yds

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 5 rounds of the granny square pattern below

SIZE

Size 1(Size 2, Size 3, Size 4, Size 5)

MEASUREMENTS

Pick a size closest to your chest measurement.

Chest: 80(100, 120, 140, 160)cm /32"(40", 48", 56", 63")

Length: 65(65, 65, 75, 75)cm /25.5"(25.5", 25.5", 29.5", 29.5)

Neck opening: 47(52, 54, 55, 55)cm /18.5"(20.5", 21.25", 21.75", 21.75")

Sleeve Length: 43(44.5, 45.5, 47, 47)cm /17"(17.5", 18", 18.5", 18.5")

PATTERN INFORMATION

This sweater is made from a mixture of granny squares and granny stripes giving it the perfect flow. The batwing sleeves give it that oversized feel making it super comfy.

Experience of seaming squares together and colour changing is beneficial.

It is always recommended to read the pattern through first.

The size made in this pattern is size 3.
Model is 162cm / 5 feet 4" tall with a 118cm / 46.5" bust.

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
 sc = single crochet
 dc = double crochet
 fp/bp = front/back post
 cl = cluster (3 double crochet into one stitch)
 blo = back loop only
 stsc = stacked single crochet
 slst = slip stitch
 sk = skip
 st = stitch
 sp = space
 colour = col
 dec = decrease
 rep = repeat
 CC = change colour
 FO = fasten off
 ** = repeat between **
 (...) = work between

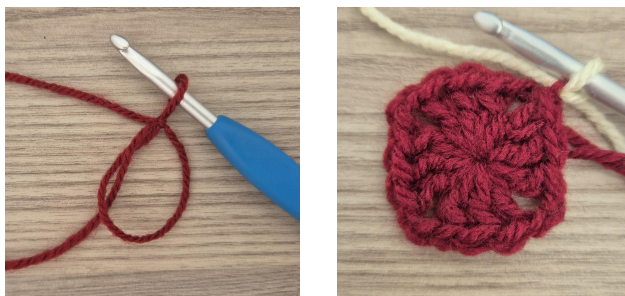
INFO AND TIPS

- Stacked Single Crochet - sc into stated st as normal. Work another sc working into the left vertical bar of the first sc
- Ch 2 makes a corner space
- Use 5mm hook unless otherwise stated

BODY

Granny Squares – make 44(55, 66, 91, 104) squares

Round 1: Using col 28 make a magic circle, working into the circle, stsc 1, *ch 2, cl* rep 3 times, ch 2, dc 2, tighten circle, slst to the first corner sp, CC to 22,



Round 2: In the corner sp, (stsc 1, ch 2, cl), *(cl, ch 2, cl) in the next corner sp* rep 3 times, 2 dc in the next corner sp, slst into ch 2 sp, CC to 28, FO col 22,



Round 3: In the corner sp, (stsc 1, ch 2, cl), *CC to 26, cl in next sp, CC to 28, (cl, ch 2, cl) in the next corner sp* rep 3 times, CC to 26, cl in next sp, CC to 28, FO col 26, 2 dc in the next corner sp, slst into ch 2 sp, CC to 30, FO col 28,



Round 4: In the corner sp, (stsc 1, ch 2, cl), *cl in next 2 sps, (cl, ch 2, cl) in the next corner sp* rep 3 times, cl in next 2 sps, 2 dc in the next corner sp, slst into ch 2 sp,



Round 5: Ch 1, in the corner sp, (sc 1, ch 2, sc 2), *sk first st (maybe hidden), sc 1 in next 11 sts, (sc 2, ch 2, sc 2) in corner sp* 3 times, sk first st (maybe hidden), sc 1 in next 11 sts, 1 sc into the corner sp, FO with needle join.



ASSEMBLY OF THE SQUARES

- Use the mattress/ladder st for the joins to create an invisible and flat seam.
- Use colour 30

Front panel

Assemble a panel 4(5, 6, 7, 8) squares wide by 5(5, 5, 6, 6) squares long

Back panel

Assemble a panel 4(5, 6, 7, 8) squares wide by 6(6, 6, 7, 7) squares long

SHOULDER PANELS

Left side - as worn

Working on the front panel on a side with 4(5, 6, 7, 8) squares,

Row 1 (RS): Join col 30 in the right hand corner square, stsc 1 in the corner sp, sk first st (maybe hidden), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times, cl in the seam,



Size 1 only - sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), dc 1 in next st, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [6 cl, dc 1 at each end]

All other sizes - sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep (2, 4, 4, 4) times



Size 2 only - sk 2 sts, dc 1 in next st, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [9 cl, dc 1 at each end]

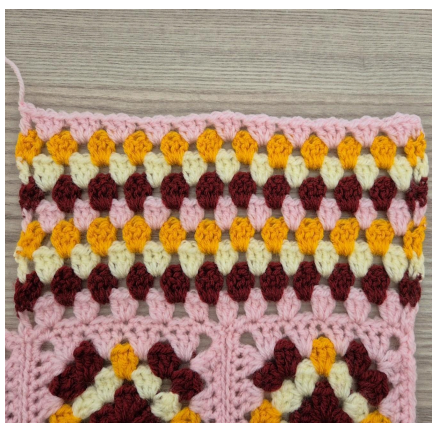
Size 3 only - dc 1 in the seam, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [11 cl, dc 1 at each end]

Size 4 & 5 only - cl in the seam, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep (1, 3) times, sk 2 sts, dc 1 in next st, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [(14, 16) cl, dc 1 at each end]

Row 2 (WS): stsc 1 in the first st, dc 1 in sp between dc and first cl, cl in next 5(8, 10, 13, 15) sps, dc 1 in the last sp between cl and dc, dc in last st, CC to 22, turn, [5(8, 10, 13, 15) cl, 2 dc at each end]

Row 3 (RS): stsc 1 in the first st, cl in each sp until the end, dc 1 in the last st, CC to 26, turn, [6(9, 11, 14, 16) cl, 1 dc at each end]

Continue to rep rows 2 and 3, following the col order of 30, 28, 22, 26 until you have 9 rows. FO leaving a long tail for seaming the shoulders.



Right side - as worn

With the RS facing, place a st marker in the 20th(29th, seam between 2nd and 3rd square, 43rd, 49th) st from the left corner. Each square has 17 sts (15 sc and a ch in each corner).

Size 1 (blue SM), Size 2 (yellow SM), Size 3 (purple SM), Size 4 (pink SM), Size 5 (orange SM)



Row 1 (RS): Join col 30 in the marked st for your size, stsc 1 in that st,

Size 1 only - cl in the seam, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times, dc 1 in the corner sp, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [6 cl, dc 1 at each end]

All other sizes - *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep -(3, 5, 2, 4) times, cl in the seam, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times,

Size 2 and 3 only - dc 1 in the corner sp, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [(9, 11) cl, dc 1 at each end]

Size 4 and 5 only - cl in the seam, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times, dc 1 in the corner sp, CC to 28, turn, move onto row 2 [(14, 16) cl, dc 1 at each end]

Rep instructions from row 2 of the 'Left side - as worn'



Seam the shoulders to the back panel. This will be a side with 4(5, 6, 7, 8) squares. Using the same method used for joining the squares.



SLEEVES

- Cluster decrease - dc 1 in the first sp, dc dec over the first and second cl sp's, dc 1 in the second sp,
- follow the col sequence of 30, 28, 22, 26

Right sleeve - (as worn)

Start working along the edge of the back panel then shoulder panel then front panel, attach col 30 in the corner sp of the far right square on the back panel

Left sleeve - (as worn)

Start working along the edge of the front panel then shoulder panel then back panel, attach col 30 in the corner sp of the far right square on the front panel

Round 1 (RS): In the corner sp make a stsc, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, (*sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times, cl in the seam, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st) rep 5(5, 5, 6, 6) times, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times,



sk the join, cl around the dc 'bar' from the shoulder panels, *sk the next bar, cl around the next bar* rep 4 times,



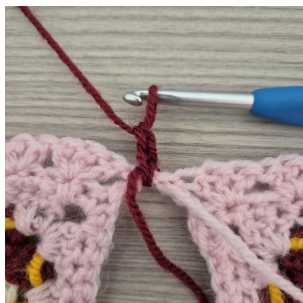
sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times,



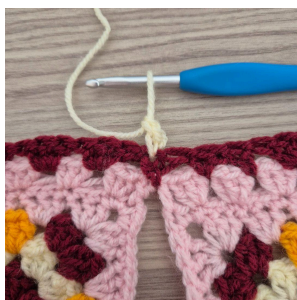
(cl in the join, sk 2 sts (ch of the corner and first sc), cl in next st, *sk 2 sts, cl in next st* rep 4 times) rep until the end, dc 1 in the corner sp, slst to the top of stsc, CC to next in sequence, turn, [69(69, 69, 81, 81) cl, 2 dc at the join]



Round 2 (WS): make a stsc over the slst in the sp, cl dec over next two sp's between cl's, place cl in each sp between cl's until the end, slst to the top of stsc, CC to next in sequence, turn, [67(67, 67, 79, 79) cl, 1 dc at the join]



Round 3 to round 25(24, 22, 32, 32): make a stsc into the dc, cl dec, place cl in each sp between cl's until the end, slst to the top of stsc, CC to next in sequence, turn, Each round reduces by 2 cl. At the end of round 25(24, 22, 32, 32) - [21(23, 27, 19, 19) cl, 1 dc at the join]



Round 26(25, 23, 33, 33) to round 34(35, 36, 37, 37): make a stsc into the dc, place cl in each sp between the cl's until the end, slst to the top of stsc, CC to next in sequence, turn, Each round reduces by 1 cl. At the end of round 34(35, 36, 37, 37) - [12(12, 13, 14, 14) cl, 1 dc at the join]

Round 35(36, 37, 38, 38): CC to col 30, make a stsc into the dc, dc in each st around, slst to first dc, do not FO, proceed onto ribbing instructions [36(36, 39, 42, 42) dc]

NECKLINE

Round 1 (RS): starting on the back side, attach col 30 in the sp where the shoulder panel meets the back panel on the right, stsc back in the same sp,



place 1 dc in each st across working into the corners of the squares and joins too. When you reach the shoulder panel, place 1 dc where the back panel and shoulder meet,

place 2 dc around each bar, 1 dc in the sp where the shoulder panel meets the front panel,

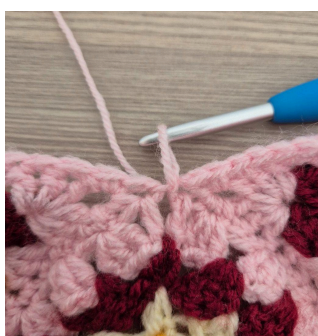


place 1 dc in each st across working into the corners of the squares and joins too. When you reach the shoulder panel, place 1 dc where the front panel and shoulder meet,

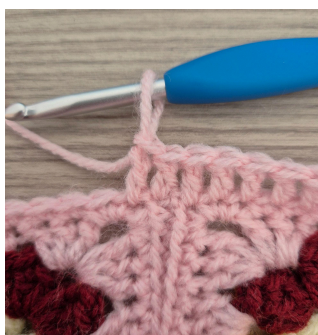
place 2 dc around each bar, slst to top of stsc, do not FO, proceed onto ribbing instructions.

BOTTOM EDGE

Round 1 (RS): Attach yarn in the corner of the square to the right of the side seam, slst into the corner on the left and pull tight to close the gap.



Stsc in the corner sp of the left square, dc 1 back in the same sp, *sk first st (maybe hidden), dc 1 in next 14 sts, dc 1 in the corner sp of the square, dc 1 in the seam, dc 1 in the corner sp of the next square* rep 3(4, 5, 6, 7) times, dc 1 in next 14 sts,



dc 1 in the corner sp, dc 1 working through the same corner and the corner of the next square to bring them together, dc 1 in the corner of the left square,



sk first st (maybe hidden), dc 1 in next 14 sts, dc 1 in the corner sp of the square, dc 1 in the seam, dc 1 in the corner sp of the next square rep 3(4, 5, 6, 7) times, dc 1 in next 14 sts, dc 1 in the corner sp of the square, slst to join, do not FO, proceed onto ribbing.

RIBBING

Using 4mm hook

Row 1 (RS): ch 1, fpdc around first st, bpd around the next st, *fpdc around next st, bpd around next st* rep around until the end making sure you finish on a bpd, if one st remains, sk it, slst to first st,

Row 2 - Row 6 (RS): ch 1, fpdc around first st, bpd around the next st, *fpdc around next st, bpd around next st* rep around, slst to first st,

FO and sew in all ends.
